


On 14th July 1983, army bulldozers crushed 100 housesinto the red soil of Palestine and yellow sands of Gaza. The inhabitants were given no reason, just a half hour to clear their shoeless children from their homes. On 24th July the troops returned to clear the people from the ruins. I visited this corner of Gaza Beach Refugee Camp on 23rd July and talked with some of the thousand Palestinians who lived in the rubble. They had no weapons but rocks and nowhere to go. They thanked me for speaking with them and asked me to tell you of their land, their people and their culture.

'Israel' is a state built with guns and lies. In 1948, after the Nazi slaughter of millions of Poles, Jews, gays and gypsies, there was little opposition in Europe to the establishment of a 'Jewish Homeland' and there was little thought about the fate of the people who already lived in Palestine. Since the 1920s the British rulers of Palestine had been encouraging the creation of a racist state in which Jews were to police the Palestinian people. The 1948 invasion and the slaughter and expulsion of Palestinians were just the logical outcome of British policy. For centuries, Palestinian and Jew had grown up and lived together in peace but the desire of British and Jewish capitalists to control the Middle East destroyed all this. 90% of Palestinians were driven from their homes, refused employment and many were massacred.

The situation is no better now. In 1967 the Zionists enlarged their racist state by force. Last year 'Israel' invaded Lebanon, killing 20,000 Palestinian children in Beirut and at least a thousand civilians in the Sabra and Chatilla refugee camps. Palestinians are regularly murdered by Zionist settlers and troops in the occupied West Bank and Gaza Strip; 3 students were shot dead on July 26th and a woman killed in Nablus on the 27th . 65% of West Bank Palestinians are refugees. They live in camps surrounded by troops. The conditions. are appalling - often no water, open drains and no electricity. As a result of the occupation, 40% of children suffer from mild forms of malnutrition. As a statistic, every West Bank family has one son in jail and one in exile. Jail means torture - I have seen the scars. Troops fire on peaceful demonstrations. Houses are dynamited if a relative is suspected of being in the P.L.O. . Palestinians there have no rights: their lands and homes can be taken from them if a Zionist 'settler' wants them; they are denied permission to dig wells or plant trees or build or travel in their own country.

RESISTANCE On all from

Repression is total but the people's resistance is on all fronts. They see clearly that the aim of the 'Israeli' government is to drive them right away from their homeland. So, they have adopted a policy of 'steadfastness'. They refuse to be bribed or forced from the poverty of the camps and villages, not because they accept the poverty but because they know that the only way to win is to stand together, to involve everyone in resistance, to constantly discuss everything and to act. For some young women and men, resistance means joining the Fedayi'i (the P.L.O. guerillas), for women it may mean forming another women's committee, for workers joining an illegal trade-union, for school and university students it means ignoring military closure of schools and colleges or it may mean striking in support of teachers. For prisoners it means hunger strikes while for parents it means knowing your children will be jailed and tortured . For everyone, it means refusing to be intimidated . not just talking, it means stoning the soldiers and proudly supporting the P.L.O. .



I met 4 year old girls who sang of Kalashnikov assault rifles and of freedom, 6 year olds who had been arrested, trade-unionists who had been tortured, a woman who had lost eight children, a mayor who had his legs blown off by the army and students used to being shot at. These people and their friends and relatives assured me of two things. Firstly their determination to struggle forever and secondly that they do not hate Jews - they hate the 'Israeli' government, state and army; they hate the racist armed 'settlers'; they hate the U.S. and British governments which arm and support 'Israel' but they do not hate Jews. The P.L.O. calls for a democratic Palestine where Palestinian and Jew can live together in freedom.

The Palestinian people can only win if they have international support. They recognise the importance of international solidarity and offer their support to the Irish and Nicaraguan people (to name but two).

I ask you to do several things:

1) Write to the P.L.O. London office and ask them for information about Palestine. Read it (it is free) and pass it on. The address is P.L.O., 52, Green Street, London W1.

2) Get your union branch or other organisation to

invite a P.L.O. speaker .

3) Reverse Order should write to the 'Israeli' embassy, the British government and dear Oonagh to express support for the P.L.O. and opposition to 'Israel'.

4) Jaffa fruit and other 'Israeli' goods should not be bought. Help to deepen the economic crisis

in racist 'Israel'.


5) Make it clear you are anti-'Israel' not anti-Jewibh.

Hypnotics & Sedatives

Central nervous system depressants — Barbiturates, Mandrax, Mogadon, Normisson. In medical use hypnotics are used to produce sleep and sedatives to relieve anxiety and restlessness but the distinction between them is blurted — the same drug can have either effect according to the dose and how it's taken.

Barbiturates (barbs)

In low doses — as used for daytime sedation, they reduce tension and (like tranquillisers) don't produce drowsiness, but in larger doses they lose their selectivity, spread to all parts of the nervous system and, under normal circumstances, cause sleep. If sleep is avoided, they produce a euphoria and intoxication very like being drunk, lasting 3-6 hours: inhibitions are lowered and you become talkative, although slurred speech may make this difficult. You may also feel irritable and aggres-

- The Phenobarbitone (SK&F) comes as 60mg, 100mg clear and blue sustained release capsules containing blue and white pellets. A longacting barbiturate: used for the treatment of epilepsy. Worse than most. Causes abscesses if injected.
- Amytal (amylobarbitione) comes as white tablets: 15mg coded T40, 30mg coded T56, 50mg coded T37, 100mg coded T32 and 200mg coded U13. All marked LILLY.

Non-barbiturate sleepers

- Mogadon moggies (nitrazepam) comes as 5mg white scored tablets marked ROCHE and 2 semicircles and purple/black capsules marked with strength and maker's names.
- Normisson (temazepam) comes as 10mg yellow pearl-shaped capsules marked WYETH and similar 20mg capsules marked 20.
- Mandrax mandies (methaqualone, diphenhydramine) not around much any more but they sometimes come from Europe as 250mg or 275mg tablets with RL and MX on one side or as light and dark blue capsules marked RL and MX. £1.

Germany, France and Japan the rate is even higher. The Committee for the Review of Medicines found no evidence that they're effective after 4 months continuous use. They shouldn't be given to children for insomnia or be taken for depression, headaches or dysmenorrhoea in the absence of anxiety.

Recent studies suggest that up to 5% of users will become addicted even on low doses; taken over a long period they will create dependence. As with barbs, taking them with drink makes them much stronger, although the risk of overdose is much less. Sudden withdrawal can produce complete disorientation which disappears within a couple of hours of taking another dose. Slower withdrawal (if you come off gradually) may mean sweating, palpitations, insomnia, weight loss, jelly legs and not being able to tolerate bright lights or loud noises.

The best way to come off is to do it at your own pace, cutting down 5 daily mgs a week (or maybe much less). If you find your dose going up again, don't give up, you can still come off. Lots of other people are fighting the same battle all over the country. Think about your own needs and try yoga or breathing exercises — peppermints seem to help. There are a number of here with sedative or tranquillising offects which

Amphetamines (Speed)

Stimulate the central nervous system: heart rate, blood pressure and blood sugar levels go up, pupils dilate, breathing becomes more rapid and appetite decreases. They make you feel more confident, talkative, energetic and able to concentrate (though what you decide to concentrate on may be pointless!). Other effects are restlessness, agitation and insomnia. Stronger doses produce clation and euphoria foilowed by depression and fatigue. Although not physically addictive, you need another hit to avoid the come-down that follows and then you need to take more. to get the same effect. Abuse leads to paranoia, largely through lack of food and sleep.

Most black-market speed is manufactured illicitly and comes as a white crystalline powder — sulphate (£10-£12 a gram), or as blue or white 2-10mg tablets often cut with other stimulants like caffeine or ephedrine. About half the pills that pretend to be speed are made from the same chemicals as Tenuate (below).

From the chemical industry they come as:

- © Durophet black bombers

 (amphetamine and dexamphetamine in equal parts) as capsules: 7.5mg white, 12.5mg black and white and 20mg black all marked with RIKER. Non-injectible, sustained release. 50p-
- Durophet-M (as above combined with methaqualone): capsules: 12.5mg green / brown, 20mg red / brown marked RIKER. Non-injectible, sustained release. Withdrawal can be

Speed health



Staying up all night occasionally, or eating very little for a few days, robs the system of vitamins but doesn't cause the major health problems that come with long-term speed use. Brewers Yeast and Vitamin C are useful supplements. Drink plenty of water to avoid 'drying out' the liver and kidneys.

As a rule of thumb it takes your body a full day to recuperate from each day of speed use. Remember you're using up energy that the body needs to stay free of disease and infection.

This can be used to make a few barbs go a long way or it can result in an overdose—most barb fatalities involve alcohol.

Alcohol

A central nervous system depressant, a)cohol varies in effect according to the amount consumed. Initial effects are relaxation and sociability, increased confidence and cheerfulness. In higher doses lack of physical control, stumbling and slurred speech, possible nausea and vomiting are typical effects. It's legal to purchase it from a licensed dealer if you're over 18, and you can brew or ferment at home without a licence. However selling what you brew, distilling spirits, or freezing wines and beers to separate out the alcohol content, is against the law.

Spirits such as whisky, brandy and vodka contain about 40% alcohol, wines 10%-17%, beers 4-7%. 'proof' on a bottle of spirits doesn't mean %age alcohol. 100° proof is 57.1% alcohol, so 70° proof is about 40% alcohol.

Used regularly, alcohol produces rapid tolerance and long-term use can lead to addiction. It's estimated that of the 33 million drinkers in the UK, 20 million are regular drinkers, 2-3 million drink heavily and over 14 million are alcoholics. Govt figures show alcohol consumption doubled between 1968 and 1978.


Glues and Solvents

Toluene and acetone solvents — found in most glues (eg Evostick) and in nail-polish remover — make you light-headed, giddy, confused and drowsy and sometimes produce hallucinations. They're largely used as a way of getting stoned by people too young to get their hands on alcohol. They're only dangerous if you fall off a high-rise, walk under a truck or get a plastic bag stuck to your head.

Some damaging side-effects.

Benzene — found in petrol and rubber solution — isn't quite as kind to your liver, and causes damage in the long term.

Aerosols are very dangerous — most contain instant-death fluorocarbons, and they're all risky if you spray them directly into your mouth. Forget it.







Cannabis

Cannabis Sativa, the Indian hemp plant, is a hardy weed which grows 6-8ft or more and contains in its upper leaves and flowering tops a yellowy resin that gets you stoned. In the reign of Elizabeth I it was illegal for anyone with 5 acres of land or more not to grow cannabis because of its value as a ropemaking fibre. Three forms of it are generally available:


Marijuana (grass, herb) is a name for the plant itself and the mixture of dried leaves and flowers that are smoked in a pipe or roll-up. Hash (Cannabis resin) is the resin from the plant, pressed into blocks of differing consistency and colour according to the country of origin (and smoked in a pipe or mixed with tobacco in a roll-up) Hash Oil is an extract from the resin, like a brown gum (usually added to tobacco).

Cannabis is also eaten as an ingredient in cake or fudge. It's not soluble in water and can't be injected.

It affects people in a variety of ways -usually reducing (but sometimes increasing) anxiety and stimulating the appetite. In larger doses it can be an intoxicant, intensifying the mood you're in, or a mild hallucinogen. It heightens the senses, tends to make you passive and reduce driving skills.

You can't overdose and it's not addictive although some long-term users acknowledge a psychological dependence. It's the most widely used illicit drug in Britain and the greatest risk you face is being caught by the law. In 1980, 87% of all drug convictions involved cannabis (see p92 for London penalties).

. The quality of hash or grass is said to vary according to the country of origin, but in practice it's more to do with the way it's shipped and stored. Hash that was 10-15% THC (the active constituent) in Pakistan may have been reduced by oxidisation to 3-5% THC by the time it gets here. A 1980 Government Chemist's report on the THC content of seized black-market supplies rated Zimbabwe as producer of the best grass (3% THC), with the once legendary Thai stick trailing at 1-3%. Indian hash came out best hash with an average of 10% THC rising to 25% in some samples. Pakistani hash oil came out best oil with 13-25%THC but Moroccan hash oil turned out to be no stronger than hash because of residual solvenis

@ Moroccan hash (yellowy-beige, often hard and laminated, sometimes powdery) £45-52;



Always try before you buy — it's normal practice. Prices go up if you're buying by the gram, but you don't get discounts for less than 4 ozs. Hash oil is easiest to smuggle because of its concentrated form, but it doesn't sell as readily because people don't trust its quality — and it's messy to roll up. One large London wholesaler mixes oil with low-grade hash (or substitutes); the results are very poor.

LSD

Of all the synthetic drugs, LSD is the most remarkable - not only for the size of the dose (100-300 millionths of a gram) but also for its dramatic effects.

Emotions become intense and changeable, and the senses operate in uncharacteristic ways. You may experience dread and joy in the same 5 minutes and sense distortions ranging from elaborate and cheerful to bleak and fearful. Where you are and who's with you seem to have a lot to do with how it goes.

Other effects include time-distortion, ego-loss and revelatory insights into the nature of life, light, matter, etc. A 'trip' starts within 1/2-2 hrs and lasts from 4-12 hrs according to the dose. You sometimes get flashbacks - moments when you feel you're tripping again over the next 12 hrs and even into the next day.

Acid is a psychoactive drug - affecting the brain directly rather than through the central nervous system — and any risk in taking it is psychological rather than physical. It can, infrequently, bring on a latent psychosis that was otherwise under control or it can, temporarily, open the 'doors of perception' leading to a change in values that may be lasting.





There's no overdose - above 600 micrograms or so there seems to be no further effect. Tolerance develops rapidly over a few days' continuous use - but sensitivity to the drug returns just as quickly. Nowadays people seem to take low doses for fun while doing other things (eg gigs, movies) as opposed to taking high doses for self-realisation and mystical insight — the hallmark of its use in the 60s / early 70s.

It comes in many forms according to the whim of the manufacturer - from small tablets of various shapes and colours to 2mm squares of gel.

Most acid around at present is 'blotter' (up to 15 varieties), prepared by soaking blotting paper in LSD solution and marking it off in squares, often over-printed with a tiny design such as a star, a dragon, a yin/yang, or even a CND symbol. Doses vary even within the same sheet from 75-125 micrograms (£1.50-£3 each). Price is no guide to quality. At this strength you need 2 for a full-blown trip.

Difficulty in obtaining ergotamine, the main ingredient, has tempted a number of manufact turers to pass off as acid non-LSD hallucinogous that have baffled police labs, so it's advisable to buy only from someone you know and trust who can give you reliable reports about the quality

Acid myth

Horror stories about LSD reappear in the press from time to time - and they're all false. You don't stare at the sun until you go blind, you don't jump out of windows thinking you can and you don't truss up your baby for the oven thinking it's a chicken. LSD doesn't deaden senses or your sensibilities - you're more likely to feel sad for the chicken and become a vegclarian.

Tripping

Your state of mind and setting are important a good LSD experience, particularly if you're not used to its effects. You become very resp. sive to your surroundings, so choose somewh. you feel comfortable and free from unexpecte intrusion. In the countryside or by the sea are also good places. If possible, choose a time when you're free of anxiety and stress.

Ask someone you like and whose advice yo trust to be with you - preferably someone who's used LSD and knows what's happening to you. You won't be able to concentrate on rea ing much, but pictures and music become ver interesting.

If you find yourself out in a public place, remember that no-one can tell you're tripping (least of all that police person) and that you walk and talk perfectly normally (although a

Law

The Misuse of Drugs Act

The drugs laws have all been brought together in the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 (from the Government Bookshop, 49 High Holborn, WC1 928 6977). The penalties susched to each drug bear little relation to the risk of using

Unless authorised you can be fined or imprisoned if they can prove you've: been in possession, produced, supplied to another, offered to supply another, been someomed in supplying to another, been in possession with ment to supply, exported or imported a controlled drug, or allowed your premises to be used for consumption or supply.

The Act divides controlled drugs into three classes, each carrying a different penalty. The way they're classified is very misleading.

Class A includes: hash oil and THC, coca leaf and exaine, heroin, methadone, morphine and opium, pethiduse, psilocia, mescaline and LSD, Dromoran and Diconal and PCP (angel dust).

Also included in Class A are injectable amphetamines (eg ampoules of methodrine), and it's an offence to amount opium dens or possess pipes and equipment for amoking it. For possession a Crown Court can give you up to I years plus an unlimited fine and a magistrates court 6 smooths plus £1000 fine; for the other offences the Crown Court can give you another I years.

Class B includes: amphetamines, cannabis (except for separated mature stalks and seeds), cannabis resin, sodeine (where it's over 2.5% of a preparation), DF118, breludin (Filon) and Ritalin. All Class B drugs become Class A if they're prepared for injection. For possession on can get 5 years and an unlimited fine in the Crown Court, or 3 months and a £500 fine in a magistrates court, for other offences it's the same as Class A.

Courts tend not to imprison for possession and culbration on a small scale if it's a first offence (except in the last of Man and Channel Islands).

© Class C includes: Methaqualone (Mandrax) and mile apphetamine-like stimulants. For possession a Crown Court can give you 2 years and an unlimited fine (3 years or more for other offences) and a magistrates small 3 months and £200 (£300 for other offences). There are plans afoot to make barbiturates Class C drugs, but a moment it's legal to have them in your possession oven if they weren't prescribed for you.

If you need help in a hurry or need advice on a legal case Release will help. They also publish a series of up-to-date pamphlets on most street and field drugs, the law and changes in the law.

Overdose

If someone falls unconscious after taking a drug, check that they're breathing regularly then turn them on their right side (off the heart) with their left knee bent up to help breathing and to reduce the risk that they'll choke on vomit.

Don't give them any drug to revive them, this will make matters worse. If breathing is shallow and irregular, call an ambulance and when it arrives tell the attendant exactly what's been taken. The police will come too so you must use your judgement in deciding what to do with any remaining drugs. If you don't know what they are, or you're not sure, it's better to keep them and show them to the doctors — they're not supposed to reveal what you tell them. In any case, it's better to be busted than buried.

If they're conscious, don't give stimulants, try to walk them about as long as this doesn't affect their breathing. Otherwise sit them on the floor with their back against something and their legs apart so they can easily be sick. Reassure them about any fear they may have — most drug effects are short-lived and supportive friendship can work wonders. If you think hospital is necessary, go in a taxi to avoid police involve-

You say may sometimes puzzle people). You may see anger or fear on the faces of passers-by, but remember that this isn't caused by or directed at you, it's simply your sharpened observations of the way people are (or a delusion).

If you have a highly rational and analytical type of mind, the shifting distortions of a trip may leave you more at sea than people of a dreamy or intuitive nature. Similarly if you're a life-and-soul-of-the-party type, you may find ego-loss harder to handle than others, as the things you usually rely on to feel good about yourself may suddenly seem insignificant. But, for the same reasons, you may find more food for thought in acid than others.

If you're babysitting someone on a trip it can be very boring especially if they're in a state of incommunicable ecstasy. If they become anxious or frightened, don't ask them to say what the matter is, they may be unable to explain (questions like 'how are you?' can become deep metaphysical puzzles to a tripper). Simply reassure them that everything is as it should be, that they are tripping and it will end soon enough, and that they should relax and flow with the experience. Be relaxed and confident yourself and share their pleasure if you can. Although they may at times seem in-turned or preoccupied, remember they're very vulnerable to everything you do or say and very suggestible so don't be unkind or sarcastic, don't tease or play practical jokes.

Bad trips happen when the mind becomes fascinated with something it finds horrific and gets
stuck there. The feeling of being stuck adds to
the horror. The answer is to look at something
else or think about something you know is good.
Bad trips aren't caused by the quality of the
LSD — it's your mind and your surroundings
and you can change both of these.

Millions of people, in present economic conditions, have difficulty in attaining the self-respect that comes from a long spell of that right and duty fundamental to all who have nothing but their

chains, namely Wage Labour.

Whole generations now lack the incentive to wake up, one of the most salutary traditions of our way of survival. They miss the Monday Morning feelings so crucial to reproducing the good humour and regularity of the Honest Worker, who sweats productively, obediently, ever tightening his belt. Instead they fall into confusion, anguish, and deviance. Abstention from work seduces them into crime. Long term laziness only encourages disorder and sedition. Moreover, millions of scroungers now have to contend with the overwhelming guilt of receiving an income without being able to contribute to the community. Sociologists and psychologists agree, Work is the perfect optimal remedy for drug abuse, hooliganism, pederasty, bestiality

In the sixties boom everyone (even women, blacks, and vegans) was encouraged to donate their surplus effort to the cause of Economic Growth. Some incorrigibles however, so far abandoned this wholesome ethic that they degenerated into refusing the enriching discipline of work by striking, go-slows, absenteeism, and sabotage. Indifferent to the joys of travail, they made unrealistic wage demands. This threat to Civilization forced employers to remodel work. Through Austerity measures such as redundancy, speed-ups, incomes policy, inflation and other necessary remedies they have

restored the Dignity of Labour.

For workers the current mass unemployment opens unexpected prospects for toiling harder, more exuberantly, teaching them to repress excessive expectations. They should grasp the chance of labouring not only for personal fulfilment or family obligation but for the Company, Investment, and Nation.

The Demand for the Right to Work fits excellently into the context of World Recession and will hopefully stimulate competition between those in jobs and those without. Workers should recognise the sanctity of this demand and cease all activity which threatens the rules of employment. This will maximise Job Satisfaction. Work must be valued once again — it's not enough just to do it for the money. And why be content with only 8 hours a day?

It is fitting to congratulate the entire Labour Movement for its efforts in organising on our behalf. The last Labour Government especially showed how union/government cooperation can make work bracing enough to be worth doing. They help stabilize a dangerous situation by their diverting show of opposition. They popularize the litany that identifies class with work. Socialists all over the world are committed to elaborating the rewards of restraint. Through job-sharing, co-ops, and other ingenuities they aspire to reform the system so that none are excluded. For a lucky few they offer interesting jobs, participation, training, high morale. Accountable police will be given new powers to assist those genuinely seeking work.





In the last issue of Reverse Order you had an article on Youth Training Schemes and in point d) you say we should be on the side of the Irish Revolutionaries. In R.O.1 you had an article headlined 'Terrorists' in which you think they are think they are the say, "Terrorists are sick and dangerous people. They entitled to deliberately kill innocent human beings to get what aims and their weapons are fear and indiscriminate death. They kill children, women and men "You then go on to give the British Government, American Government and Russian Government as examples. "The I.R.A. bombings are nothing in comparison".

These quotes have prompted me to write to you about my opinion on violence. Violence among nations equals war. Violence among groups equals riots etc. and violence among individuals equals murder. I expect that one could draw up a long list of differences between these categories but to me they have one simple similarity - the destruction of human beings by their fellow human beings. One of the most common ploys used by all the above categories is that the 'enemy' is lower, more inferior than yourself, your country or race (Paki, gook, wog). They blind themselves to the other persons humanity because that makes them so much easier to blow up shoot and burn. Violence is used to unify a movement, nation and individual egos. That vital defining of who one is, and who one is against. If we really felt that our enemy, our victim was like ourselves - having the same feelings, hopes, rights and dependants - empathised with him/her, loving our neighbour as ourselves,

and putting ourselves in his/her place we could not do to him what we would not choose to have done to ability in spite of everything, a point worth recalling when faced with the claim that human beings are inherently vicious. But almost every outbreak of hostilities between nations, every campaign of repression against a minority or act of individual violence, is accompanied by a conviction that the opposing party is a lower form of

life.

istence. Where people are frustrated and uncerway out is to classify some other group as "the
to fight it. That makes the situation certain again - everybody knows
what to do.

Most people caught in and exposed to violence, far from having a clear social and historical conception of its purpose, are swept fearfully along in a malign chain of action and reaction. The vast majority of people caught in this spiral do not understand how things got to this stage and want to get out of it. The paradox is that if only means presented to people for getting out of violence, they will use it — and the spiral takes turn. One of the results of such situations is increasingly listen only to their own arguments.

The temptation to do anything rather than continue verbalising is a road to violence. There are so many voices straining to be heard, so few listeners, so little responce, so much, verbal trickery, so




little attention paid to the teaching and practice of intellectual honesty and rational analysis, that it is sometimes a release to shut one's eyes and ears and mouth and draw one's sword.

Bayard Rustin, once a director of the War Resisters International and a Quaker, has said "the law of violence is such that each side becomes equally vicious. To try to distinguish between which is more vicious is to fail to recognize the logic of war. It is war that is evil." To condemn or individual violence just because you think one is bad and one is necessary is donning the blinkers of inhumanity. Both are equally evil no matter what the number of victims. One is enough, and just as vile as one thousand. You end up no better than the people you condemn.

"I look for everything, I look for the worst, I see it. People think that because a person has been killed he is no longer useful. He is useful to say...look what's happened to this young man, to this

child. Should we stand for this. Can we ANYONE TAKING ANY NOTICE."

The last article takes as its starting point where it finishes, with the view that all violence whether perpetrated by the State, an oppressed group or individual is equally evil. These views are expressed by many well meaning people who are perhaps active in some way in the struggle for a better and more humane world. In this sense they are to be considered seriously. This author takes an opposing view that State violence is an expression of a class (the capitalist class) attempting to hold onto its power and that the violence of oppressed groups is quite legitimate in trying to rid themselves of capitalist domination.

Having said this let me now take up some of the points put forward by the previous author. Violence, s/he claims whatever its cause, has one feature in common - the destruction of humans by other humans. This is about as far as a lot of people will go. They raise their hands in horror at violence but refuse to analyse the reasons why all over the place, people are killing each other. They look at symptoms and not causes. The causes do not lie in human nature, or in psychology, but in the fact that the world we live in is at present dominated by a Capitalist economic system which has its sole interest as the realisation of larger and larger profits for its continued survival. It is in the nature of Capitalism to place profit and not people at the top of its list of concerns. When the interests of capital are at stake, as they are at the moment in Central America, the Imperialist nations make no bones about using murder and torture to secure their profits. Usually they are clever enough to get someone else to do their dirty work for them.

The last author stresses that there are ploys used by all those engaged in violence in order to help them dehumanise their victims. Such ploys are the use of racism, thinking the enemy as inferior in some way. This is partly correct and partly incorrect. State violence is usually justified in these ways. However the same principle cannot be applied to



They don't need to justify their use of violence - mostly it is a matter of survival. If you are a Catholic in Derry or Belfast and you watched your 'brother' protestants burning down your streets (as happened before and after British troops were sent in) while the security forces watch or join in, you don't tend to give a thought as to whether your enemy is 'inferior'. You just do your best to protect yourself and you welcome the organisations that are prepared to

use violence to defend you. No guerilla organisation in Ireland or elsewhere can survive without the support of a broad layer of the people. Liberals in the Imperialist countries have no right to wring their hands in shock and demand thethe violence of the oppressed should cease.

Next, the previous author, asks that the oppressed should simply empathise with others and once they realise that they have the same feelings, hopes etc.as their oppressors they will understand them and lay down their weapons. This is reducing the phenomena of violence to some form of psychological state of mind - which of course it is not. There are material factors that keep people divided and these are greater than the 'humanity' we share. I mean such things as money, access to power, control over one's life, facilities. These things will never be




shared between people under Capitalism. You can't seriously ask the people of El Salvador or Nicaragua to lay down their arms at this point in time and accept again, American control of the region. Any pacifist who believes this, is an instrument of ruling class domination whether they choose to think of themselves that way or not.



The author clearly exposes he ignorance and naivety when she starts going on about people who are exposed to or caught in violence having no clear social or historical conception of its purpose. Is s/he saying that their violence would be acceptable if they did understand it. S/he reproduces in a subtle form all the prejudices and assumptions of the State and the media that people are swept 'fearfully' along in a chain of action and reaction'. They are 'caught'. In the case of Ireland, all this 'victim' terminology is used to make people believe that


the IRA are small and hold their position and standing in the Catholic ghettos through fear. All this is propaganda. The Catholics in the North are not 'fearful', they are full of confidence. Many do have a very clear conception of where they are going and the necessity of opposing the British State with arms - not that I would argue that this was a pre-requisite for oppressed people using them.

Finally, the author offers us salvation through 'rational analysis' and 'intellectual honesty', ignoring the divisions capitalism creates. Untill Capitalism is ended and it will not be ended without a fight-there will be no peace, or humanity, or real equality between people. You have to choose whose side you are on. Whatever your personal feelings about violence, you have to accept the right of oppressed peoples to use violence in order to rid themselves of their oppressors.





THE CITY OF LONDON is the financial centre and home for numerous banks and company headquarters. the money they deal in keeps governments in power (eg, barclays bank's support of south africa), finances wars and the world arms trade and enables huge companies like rio tinto zinc and i.t.t. to exploit people for profit all over the world. on thursday, 29th september (the day when the summer's profits are calculated at the stock exchange) more than a thousand people took part in Stop The City, an anti-war action intended to disrupt work in the area, block the streets and make contact with the city workers.

line of police so we all left
the area in a hurry, catching
the old bill on the hop. for
what seemed like ages we walked
and ran along the city streets,
blocking roads, chanting, with

there was graffitti everywhere. in spite of a pre-dawn police raid on the anarchist squat that had been used as a co-ordination centre, the back-up system of first-aid, childrens' refuge, legal support and communication ran smoothly.

Stop The City was an effective public action linking war with the financial institutions and multinational corporations that make money out of it. yet it had no leaders and no central organisation. considering how few of us there were, a lot was achieved (according to the BBC work at the stock exchange was disrupted, streets were blocked and we certainly made a lasting impression on people working there). future STC actions are planned when greater numbers will mean we can be even more effective.

the police and state tried to control and suppress the demonstration and more than 200 people were arrested, mostly on minor obstruction charges. the first court cases are on november 4th and 11th at guildhall courts, basinghall street, these days are to be days of action against banks, with local actions at banks all over the country as well as demonstrations at the courts in london.
