


'WARNING TO BRIGHTONIANS !

Mad Fascists appear to be loose in Churchill Square and other parts of Brighton. Obviously while this group of lunatics are at large, the whole of Brighton is at risk!

The 11th hour Brigade/National Front thugs continue to harass the people of Brighton. This time they produced an offensive letter attacking gays and advocating physical assault. The Fascists note that you can identify a gay by the Pink and Lavender badges. We note that in Fascist concentration camps in the last war, gays were forced to wear such badges. Now we see on the streets of Brighton the repetition of such oppression. But, we hear you shout, the Fascists are not the only ones. It seems as though a group of Brighton's 'right' thinking, up-standing clergy agree with them.

The attacks on the Campaign for Homosexual Equality conference by both the Fascists and some churchmen must be seen as the same (see reprinted Fascist letter P.7). One feeds off the other. Fear, confusion, prejudice. A wish to directly control the lives of other people; force them down the 'straight and narrow'. A striving for power within the repressive framework of capitalist social relations, where every person has their place and anyone who tries to climb out is opposed. So, in essence, the reactionary attacks on the C.H.E. conference could easily (and have been) directed at Blacks, Women, Trade Unionists - anyone who doesn't fit the mold of capitalist society; it's hierarchy, family structure, etc. We've seen it in Brighton before, where actual physical assaults on socialists, alternative shops, newspaper sellers, A.N.L. members, gays, women, etc, etc, etc, have taken place with horrifying repetition. Such numerous events are documented in many past Voices, Gazettes, (and even the Argus, occasionally)

Enough has been said in the past concerning the local Fascist thugs. What are probably more interesting are our local clergy. Their advert!

The Argus contains much medieval logic - but times change. They pronounce on the 'abnormality' of gays, but it is only peoples practice in every-day life that decides what is and isn't normal. We reprint their names and churches below. Are any of them local to you? How about a friendly letter to them stressing your opposition to their views. We also hear that one or two of the 'supposed' signatories may not have actually signed the advert. Now, we at the Voice can't actually believe that a group of such devout men would actually lie in order to appear stronger than they are - can we ???

ON FRIDAY 24th AUGUST THE EVENING ARGUS PUBLISHED AN ASTONISHING ATTACK ON THE CHE CONFERENCE TAKING PLACE IN BRIGHTON OVER THE WEEKEND.

A half-page advertisement signed by more than twenty local evangelical churchmen stated that the Bible contained explicit condemnations of homosexual activities and that such acts could in no way be regarded as normal. Chapter and verse were quoted at length. More worrying, however, was the prominent listing of confidential counselling on a Dorset telephone number.

At the same time, local fascists, calling themselves "Brighton Residents Against the Child Molesters" were giving out copies of the leaflet reprinted below.

Brighton seemed to be keep-

ing to its bad record for attacks on Gays; a record which includes the recent harassment of radical bookshops and the attack on the film Word Is Out in February.

But fortunately, there was a positive side to the Conference too. Responsible church leaders from all denominations in Brighton were quick to condemn the Argus advertisement and to make it plain that the sentiments expressed were by no means representative. The Rev. Michael Butler, the Chichester Diocesan Association's Communications Officer, urged those who had signed the advertisement to come to the Conference and engage in discussion. Conference Organiser Graham Wilkinson attacked the signatories for claiming to have the sole interpretation of the word of God.



Defend the 1967 Abortion Act
 Campaign against the Corrie Bill

Brighton Campaign Against Corrie

The campaign to fight John Corrie's Abortion Amendment Bill has got off to a good start in Brighton. (For details of the proposed bill, see last issue.) About seventy people came to the first campaign meeting at the Resource Centre on August 9th.

A speaker from NAC (National Abortion Campaign) explained the implications of the bill, and there was a general discussion on how to fight the bill. We then split up into groups to concentrate on particular areas. Each group will meet regularly, and anyone wanting to get involved is welcome to come.

Events Group plans to organize an event each month in different local areas. The first will be in Hanover on September 22nd. Some central events will also be organized.

Publicity Group will produce posters, leaflets, stickers, letters, and organize radio, TV, and press cover coverage.



No Return to the Backstreets!

Trades Union Group will produce and distribute a leaflet to workplaces, and organize speakers and resolutions for local Trades Union branches, working with the Trades Council. It will organize the picket of the Labour Party Conference.

Schools and Students Group is planning to organize talks in schools, colleges and youth clubs. (Contacts would be very welcome).

Rock against Corrie Group is getting a gig together, and leafletting present gigs.

The campaign is coordinated by a steering committee which holds an open meeting every fortnight. The campaign as a whole will meet each month. The next meeting is on September 6th at the Resource Centre. EVERYONE IS WELCOME.

It's worth writing to John Corrie himself, so that he won't be able to claim any longer that he gets twice as many letters supporting his bill as against it. Writing to MP's on the select committee working on the bill is important. Most of them are pro-Corrie, but they could be influenced at least to modify the bills proposals.

The address for them all is: House of Commons, Westminster, London.

There are also about 300 MP's who did not vote on the second reading at all, who could throw the bill out.

4 Capitalism & Education



Within the first few weeks of September Britains children will be returning to the walled enclosures known as schools, to be prepared by their elders for the big wide world outside. In Brighton, many returning kids will get a taste of cosmetic 'socialism' as the Hove Grammar and Secondary Modern schools become two large comprehensives. Such progressive reforms as comprehensivization were conceived during the economic boom of the '60's when working class demands could be accommodated. Since then such reforms have already suffered 'rationalisation' through economic cuts made by the last Labour government, and face further sweeping attacks under the present Tory administration.

Faced with cuts that will prevent any real progress in education for many years, how are Socialists concerned about education to approach the situation? The answer lies in a complete and careful analysis of education today. Firstly, any pretense that progressive reforms over the past decade have in any way advanced socialist education must be dropped. While extolling the short term virtues of such reforms as mixed ability classes, integrated studies, etc., teachers must realize that they (the reforms) will achieve little by themselves. Many Liberals and members of the 'old left' would state their educational aims as merely opening up 'equality of opportunity' - hence Free Scholling, Comprehensives, etc. But the danger of progressive reforms is that we see the battle as won once they are introduced into schools, whilst the essential structure and purpose of the institution remains unchanged. Is this what socialists should be doing - merely opening up the bourgeois institutions so that they can indoctrinate workers kids?

The Fight Beyond The Cuts

over women, etc., and that there is no other natural possibility. The social relations of capitalist society are therefore maintained and reinforced. The rulers reproduce themselves in elitist schools, and workers are reproduced in State Schools. And the dwindling amount of progressive reforms in schools are making no real difference to that relationship.

The Tory cuts in public spending are forcing schools to return to 'traditional' methods of teaching - large classes, few resources, the teacher presented as an authoritative fountain head of knowledge. Progressive reforms, even if they didn't affect radical change, did at least make school more bearable for kids and teachers alike. But a clampdown on liberalism is necessary if the bourgeoisie are to survive the present Crisis of Capitalism. They are relying on education to control the workers, prevent major upheavals, and so see Britain through

the slump and on to the next boom, when relative prosperity will allow concessions to be made to the workers again.

The problem is how to effect real change. The teachers Unions, the N.U.T. N.A.S./U.W.T., etc, are tied up in 'professionalism' and accepting minor pay deals, without challenging the education system at all. But other groups do exist, like Rank and File (see Voice 58), Socialist Teachers Alliance, Big Flame Teachers Commission, etc., and although small they do appear as the best chance for radical change. With the present attacks on education it is important for teachers to take their heads out of the academic sand and look around. What exactly are you teaching, and what are its political implications for the kids in your classes? Are you merely fulfilling the role prepared for you by the Bourgeoisie? Now, more than ever before, is the time to question our education system.

5 RIGHTING FOR YOUR FIGHTS

This article is the first in an occasional series written by people with personal experience of fighting for their Rights. We hope they will be both informative and usefull to people in similar situations. We would welcome any other articles/ letters in a similar vein.

A Tale Of Unemployment...

I was out of work and signing on each week at the employment exchange. That was bad enough, but during an interview at the job centre I made a fatal mistake. I refused a job interview. I refused it because I knew the job was totally unsuitable, and I knew, even if successful when applying for it, I could not sustain any interest in it and would inevitably leave. This was of no interest to the Job Centre who as agents of the Government are only concerned with reducing the unemployment figures, and as the agents of the employers were solely interested in getting me off their books into any tatty, low paid job that people with more choice than I had avoided.


A few days after my refusal I received a letter from the Job Centre informing me that an 'investigation had been instigated' to decide if Social Security should cancel my weekly Supplementary Benefit on the grounds of my refusing employment. Shortly after that communication my benefit was stopped.

I made numerous attempts to get it re-started. I appealed to the Manager of the Job Centre, and the Unemployment Review Officer. Their attitudes ranged from callousness to indifference. From the autocratic and arbitrary way the Review Officer had sanctioned the cancellation of my benefit and his response when I told him of my precarious financial position, it became clear that he considered it a mere formality for me to walk out of his office and within half an hour obtain a job. In view of the chronic unemployment situation I found this attitude quite incredible. It implied there was no severe job shortage, that the unemployed were all scroungers who could find work if they really wanted to, and that all Social Security had to do to 'persuade' them was to stop their benefit.

Faced with these 19th Century attitudes I turned elsewhere for assistance. I consulted my M.P. Despite my pessimism about appealing to a person whose class was responsible for the very system that was oppressing me, something was finally achieved. He said he would write to social security on my behalf, and after 3 weeks without any money, living on a £12 sickness benefit payment and handouts from friends, Social Security resumed payment of my benefit.

Unfortunately my problems were only half over. The S.S. decided that although I was fully entitled to my benefit once again, I was not entitled to the 3 weeks money they had stopped. This left me in a difficult position as I had fallen behind with my rent and was unable to pay back the money I had borrowed from friends. Two more conversations with the Employment Review Officer took place, both as fruitless as the earlier ones. Negotiations having failed, I appealed to an independent tribunal. The Tribunal consisted of 3 members; a

supposedly unbiased Chairperson, someone from the Trade Union movement, and someone from the employers side. It took about 6 weeks to convene, during which I made arrangements with an advice centre for one of their voluntary workers to represent me at the hearing. I found this useful, both in deciding the grounds for the appeal and with coping with the Tribunal procedure. (informal but intimidating)

The presenting officer (from the S.S.) spoke first. His case rested mainly on 2 points. Firstly, that there were 'exceptional circumstances' which prompted the S.S. to cancel my benefit. On being pressed by the Trades Union Rep. as to what these were he tried hard to evade the question by some skilful procrastination. Eventually it became clear, despite all his waffling, that the only 'exceptional circumstances' were that I had refused a job interview. This was his 2nd point. He actually produced a list of not one, but about six job interviews he claimed I had refused. I was shocked. I had expected the S.S. to have their own 'version' of what had occurred; I had half expected that they would distort these events in their favour but I never expected them to tell outright lies.

However the expected clash on this disparity of evidence never really materialised. Despite the Presenting Officer emphasising the point, the Tribunal decided it was not central to the issue. What was central was the fact that the S.S. had resumed payment in full, thus admitting that they were wrong to have stopped it in the first place. That being so, it was clearly implied that they were wrong to refuse payment of the 3 weeks money they withheld.

Although the issue was reasonably clear cut, the hearing was not allowed to end without fuss. The Chairperson dragged the proceedings out. He clearly felt that the whole thing was being decided far too quickly and easily, and the case had to be built up to maintain his dignity and the importance of the occasion. Eventually the hearing ground to a halt and we were all dismissed from his presence.

Within a few days I received a letter from the Clerk at the Tribunal. It said the Tribunal had decided to allow the appeal - payment of benefit to be made for the period under question. A week later I received a giro from the S.S. for 3 weeks benefit. Carefully I examined it for tear-stains. Not finding any I came to the obvious conclusion; they had probably long since dried.

THIS BRIGHTON INSPIRED SONG FILLED THE STREETS OF LONDON ON SUNDAY, 12th. AUGUST ON THE TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF BRITISH TROOPS BEING SENT IN.....Over 50 of us joined a 10,000 strong demonstration calling for the removal of the British Army from the 6 counties of Northern Ireland. The march, originally called by the Young Liberals (!) was organised into various tendancies, the biggest, which most of us joined, being the "OUT NOW" section.

A small group of fascists attacked the march as it assembled in Hyde Park but the size of the demo and a quick repulse prevented any real problems arising.

THE BRITISH STATE ALSO WASN'T TOO HAPPY ABOUT US BEING ON THE STREETS OF THE CAPITAL albeit a Sunday. It banned us from holding a meeting in Trafalgar Square.

WAS IT AFRAID more people might hear the truth about Britains 10 year war in Ireland ?

WAS IT AFRAID people would here Ms. Stewart tell how the British Army shot dead her young son with a plastic bullet ?

WAS IT AFRAID people might have heard an ex-soldier describe how the army deliberately harasses the catholic/ republican community ?

PERHAPS ABOVE ALL, THE BRITISH STATE WANTED TO MUTE BERNADETTE McALISKEY. Yet all she did was to answer a simple question :-

"Why were the troops sent in ?"

The army was not sent in to protect the catholic population. There have been organized attacks against Catholics throughout the 50 year history of the six county state but were troops sent in then ? No !

The troops were sent in because the minority population were refusing to lie down in the face of loyalist repression. They had peacefully demanded civil rights, but the Royal Ulster Constabulary (R.U.C.) in alliance with Loyalist gangs replied with violent attacks on civil rights





Contrary to the claims in the fascist leaflet reprinted here, it is reported that the Police have been very helpful about the Conference. The organiser met them on three occasions in the last six months to discuss arrangements. The last meeting was also attended by an officer of the Special Branch because one of the Committee members had received a death threat through the post, complete with a live .38 bullet. The Police have assured CHE that they are fully investigating both incidents, and Graham Wilkinson reported that the last meeting with them was friendly, with a frank discussion of possible difficulties.

Chairperson Robert Palmer and Graham Wilkinson were interviewed on BBC Radio Brighton and talked of the issues facing the Conference and of their hopes - and fears - for progress on Gay Rights in the Eighties.

CHE report a pleasant reception from prominent Council members, too. The Mayor, the leader of the Council and the Mayor's Chaplain entertained a small group

of Executive and Committee members at a reception on Friday night. CHE said they were most impressed by the genuine friendliness of their hosts.

Delegates arriving in Brighton after Friday may well have missed some of the controversy surrounding the Conference, anyway. It is easy to forget that this was a constructive and enjoyable event, despite the hysterical opposition of some local bigots.

Six hundred delegates attended. Topics discussed included parenthood, law reform and job discrimination. There was drama by Women's Sweatshop, Theatre Against Sexism and London Monday Group, and films were shown, such as Word Is Out and Nighthawks - followed by a discussion with its Producer.

The general feeling of delegates was that the Conference was very successful, with a great amount of work done to lay the basis of an effective campaign against discrimination.

democracy dominate agenda

The Labour party Conference in town next month will have as its main concern party democracy and accountability. For too long the Labour party has been a two headed creature. On the one hand a party committed to democratic socialism as enshrined in Clause 4. On the other hand social democratic governments that have consistently flouted the democratic wishes of the party rank and file. Callaghan's disastrous government dramatically illustrated this gap between a govt bent on managing Capitalism efficiently and a party committed to socialist transformation. For this reason party democracy and accountability are crucial to the development of the Labour party as an instrument of socialism. The most important reforms are;

LABOUR PARTY MANIFESTO 1979
LEADERS MUST FOLLOW PARTY POLICY

Under the present system the Parliamentary leader has a veto over the manifesto and in the last election totally watered down the socialist commitments of the Labour party as decided by the Conference. This reform asserts the sovereignty of Conference Election of the Leader

At the moment the Parliamentary Labour party (PLP) elects the leader and unless this is changed soon the right wing PLP will probably choose someone like Healey when Callaghan resigns. Brighton ILP favours the electoral college idea which was only narrowly defeated at last year's conference and given the party's left wing mood stand a chance of adoption. This college gives equal representation to the parliamentary, extra parliamentary and industrial wings of the Labour Movement and so should help to unify political and industrial action. How to extend democracy? No recrimination? why not?

Automatic Reselection

This is the most important reform and only lost at last year's conference because Scanlon accidentally(?) mis-cast his vote. He has been made a Lord. At the moment a touch of left rhetoric and whizz kid managerialism too often gets middle class men selected by local parties. Under the corrupting influence of the 'Mother of Parliaments' such men are alienated from the Labour Movement that selected them and which they purport to represent. This was especially seen over Callaghan's 5% wage freeze as the party's warnings were brushed aside.

Under the present system it is very hard to get rid of a rotten MP and as the Reg Prentice case shows gives the tory press the opportunity to mount a national red scare. The proposed system of mandatory reselection would mean that in the life of a parliament all constituency parties would hold a reselection of candidates where the incumbent would have the same rights as others. As all parties would do it at the same time it would help prevent the press from jumping on a left wing party. It

A WORD OF WARNING

Automatic reselection does not = automatic socialism. Unless the Labour party is radicalised and becomes 'the mass party of the working class' that everyone makes a cliché out of these structural reforms may make little difference. The party that was originally seduced by whizz kid rhetoric may be seduced again and again. These reforms are certainly the pre requisite for socialist change but are not a panacea. Brighton ILP believes that if the Left manages to win the struggle for party democracy it still has a long way to go. Firstly the left must organise itself as a coherent & determined force of change without falling into the trap of bureaucracy & ultra centralism. Secondly we must counter reformism (left and right) in the labour movement. The belief in the parliamentary road to socialism is still widespread and the left must change the strategy of the Labour party from a predominantly electoralist approach to one that mobilises parliamentary and extra parliamentary forces.

In short the fight for labour party democracy is only the beginning and the Labour party badly needs socialist activists so JOIN THE LABOUR PARTY NOW.

DEMOS ATTACK

East Sussex County Bill Panel Clause 44 - Notice to be given of Processions.

OPEN LETTER

Letter to be placed before Policy and Resources Committee Meeting on 5th September.

CLAUSE 44

Clause 44, as accepted by the Brighton East Sussex County Bill Panel, if enacted in Parliament in November 1979, will require that at least 48 hours (exclusive of Sunday) before a procession starts to pass through a street, a person organising or conducting the procession shall give on the Council and the Chief Officer of Police a notice giving information as to: a) the route, date and times, b) the purpose of the procession, and c) the name of the person responsible for organising it.

This proposal is an extension of the 1931 Brighton Corporation Act, which requires 24 hours notice. It would also extend into the rest of East Sussex, which with the exception of Brighton and Hastings, has no local legislation requiring that notice be given of processions, demonstrations, or marches.

On behalf of the Labour Group of Councillors on Brighton Council, the Brighton and Hove Trade Union Council and Brighton Labour Party, and in accordance with the national policy of the Trades Union Congress, I urge that the clause requiring notice be given of marches and processions should be removed, so that there shall be no notice required. Not the 24 hours at present required in Brighton; not the 48 hours proposed in clause 44 of the East Sussex County Bill; not the 7 days desired by some individuals and councils.

IMPOSITION

At present, over most of the country, there is no statutory requirement for notice or details to be given before processions. Instead, flexible and informal arrangements exist over most of the country for setting up marches. Such arrangements have worked well in the past.

The East Sussex proposal for 48 hours' notice would inhibit activities and demonstrations which need to be organised within one or two days, rather than weeks.

The imposition of criminal charges in some cases, and the resulting fines, would only serve to exacerbate already inflamed situations.

Amenity, residents, tenants and parents' groups, sexual and political minority and majority groups, Trades Unionists and others; all sometimes feel the need to make an immediate response to international, national, community or industrial issues. For example, in recent years a number of groups have organised marches on the 'Evening Argus' offices in response to Argus articles or editorials.

CRIMINAL

The effect of the proposal would be either to prevent this spontaneous aspect of political activity, or to make organisers immediately liable to criminal charges. Criminal charges could also be laid against an organiser such as a Secretary of a Tenants', Parents', or Trade Union group if, through no fault of the organiser, some or all of the demonstrators deviated from the official route. Sub-clause 2 of clause 44 states



that: "if any procession passes through any street in a district by a route or at a time which has not been stated....except in accordance with any directions given by the Chief Officer of Policeany person organising or conducting the procession shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £200".

This matter was directly commented upon recently by Lord Justice Scarman; not a judge particularly noted for his Socialist sympathies. In the Red Lion Square Disorder Report (Cmd 59 19 1975, p46) Lord Scarman stated: "The Commissioner of Police for the Metropolis submitted to my enquiry that it should be an offence to organise a demonstration without giving previous notice to the Police. I do not think that the need for this has been established, and I do not recommend this prop-

osed change in the law." Later in his report, Lord Scarman concluded that: "to force upon the law a largely unnecessary requirement, which can at times be an embarrassment to law-abiding citizens" was uncalled for.

NUISANCE

Meetings and processions are already, and quite rightly, subject to the civil law of trespass and nuisance, and to criminal law powers, such as obstruction and public order controls.

Within these constraints, the UK government is obliged to uphold the principle of freedom of expression and association, by being a signatory to the 1948 Universal Declaration of Human Rights and Article 11 of the European Convention of 1950; both of which provide for freedom of peaceful assembly and association with others.

If accepted, Clause 44 would be a significant, indeed an unprecedented, infringement of this freedom of association and expression. It would be potentially very repressive. This is why there will be consider-


able public interest in the Brighton Policy and Resources Meeting on 5th September, the Brighton Council meeting on 27th September, the East Sussex County Council Policy and Resources meeting on 2nd October and the County Council meeting on 23rd October; the final stages before the Bill goes to Parliament on 27th November.

FREEDOM

In conclusion, it obviously makes sense for march organisers to inform the police of the route, date and approximate times of a march. In probably 80% of cases the police are so informed. Such co-operation enables suitable traffic controls, for example, to be arranged in advance.

I was a teenage carnivore...



I am a vegetarian and I want to write about it because I believe that as well as being a personal and private matter, there are implications for everyone who remains carnivorous.

Basic to vegetarianism is a respect for life and a wish to avoid killing where possible; most people take this for granted with human animals, and vegetarians simply extend this to other animals as well. Sometimes I am asked by veggie-baiters if I would eat a dead animal if I was on a desert island with no other source of food and, when I reply 'yes', they invariably say, 'well, there you are, then' as if this revealed some great profundity. The question makes as much sense as asking carnivores if they would become cannibals if it was necessary. It's all a matter of survival - and neither I nor anyone else in Britain needs meat to survive. I used to eat meat because I took it for granted, never gave it a second thought.

When I did think about going vegetarian, the idea appealed, but it seemed so strange and awkward and impractical: what would I eat, and wouldn't there be lots of problems with friends and relatives?

I delayed and delayed and as I became more and more convinced by the arguments, I felt more and more of a hypocrite; so one day, my wife and I decided together that we would become vegetarian the next day, whatever happened, and we did.

Funnily enough, after all the agonising, it was remarkably easy: we realised that most of what we ate was vegetarian anyway - eggs, cheese, corn, chips, rice, etc. - so we could experiment with new recipes gradually. There was no sudden change, apart from a great feeling of relief and moral superiority!



Over the eight years or so that we have been vegetarian, we have slowly extended our repertoire, usually via friends, and now have as good a range of normal, special and quick stand-by meals as everyone else; we also use 'convenience foods' from time to time.

Friends know our likes and dislikes - as they did before - and no-one seems to get upset by them. It was only parents who presented any real opposition and they now feel a bit silly, seeing two healthy adults and two healthy children, after all their dire warnings of protein deficiencies!

There is in fact nothing vital to the human body that only comes from dead animals; our protein intake is much higher than it was before - animal protein only comes from the (vegetarian) food they eat when alive, and it's much more efficient to get it direct.

Eating out is no problem either, with Saxons, Sunrise, Three Rooms, etc. providing excellent food at reasonable prices; there are posh restaurants as well, if you've more money than sense. Even most ordinary places have some vegetarian dishes, or are (fairly) willing to produce them to order.

So what is being a vegetarian about? Well, to me it's drawing the line in a different place, avoiding the necessity of animals being born to die for my unthinking benefit, using substitutes for animal products where possible.

It's avoiding the going at nice little lambs to your kids, while suppressing the nasty thought that you'll probably be eating one in a week or two.

It's also about avoiding exploitation: realising what buying battery eggs or forced veal means, and knowing you aren't contributing to the world shortage of food by encouraging capitalism to raise animals rather than crops on scarce land. Did you know that two-thirds of the crops grown in Britain go to feed animals waiting to be killed? Think how much farther they would go if people ate them directly.

I'm convinced that most people would be vegetarian if they had to kill the animals themselves - carnivores get away with it only by paying others to kill for them. This is not really intended to be a crusading article, but do think about it, because it is important - to your conscience, your politics and to the third world.

It may be chickenfeed to you, but it's life and death to them.

East Sussex 'Scroungers'

Having pressured local social workers into accepting a barely satisfactory regrading settlement earlier this year, East Sussex Social Services is now trying to swindle them out of their money.

It was agreed that all workers would be reassessed on the basis of their actual responsibilities, rather than their (largely theoretical) job descriptions. But Council cost-calculations ignored the known fact that most workers are overworked. Now that this has been confirmed by the assessment process, the Social Services hierarchy have panicked over the cost. Unqualified workers have been told that they will only be paid according to their job description; though predictably nothing has been said about reducing workloads.

Qualified workers in Brighton have had their regrading suspended following their assessments, for "further investigations" to take place. Inevitably, there is widespread fear that cuts-happy councillors will order Director Denis Allen to ignore or doctor the results in order to save money. After all, anyone leaving in disgust needn't be

replaced and that will save even more money. No-one important will suffer; only the workers and their clients; the poor, the handicapped and the disadvantaged, and none of them vote Tory anyway, so that's alright.

Demo's Attack

It is still essential that concerned groups and individuals keep up the pressure to ensure that East Sussex County Council and the District Councils appreciate the strength of opposition to the 48 hour notice of processions requirement and the licencing of paper-sellers proposed in the ESCC By-Laws Bill.

On August 3rd the County Joint Committee meeting in Lewes approved the inclusion of both provisions in the Bill, despite the arguments of some councillors and of the NCCL against this. Officially that meeting was the last at which changes in the Bill might be made, but County officials now deal with the final drafting and submit it to the County's Policy and Resources Committee on October 2nd. It then goes before

the full County Council for formal approval before presentation to Parliament in November.

It is well worth lodging protests with your own County Councillors and with the Chief Executive of ESCC at County Hall, Lewes before both these meetings. Letters should deal with the arguments against these proposals and not be merely heartfelt, but vague, emotional protests. Be sure you ask for your letter to be drawn to the attention of the Policy and Resources Committee and the County Council. Letters on behalf of particular organisations are most valuable.
