





We drove down to Greenham Common Air Base on Good Friday in order that we might
 lend our support to women for Life on Earth who, a year and a half ago, ~~marched~~
 marched all the way from S. Wales (without so much as a word of support in
 'Sanity' - let alone the National press) in order to publicise their opposition
 to nuclear weapons in general and CRUISE in particular. Having arrived in
 Berkshire un-heralded, they took the BRAVE initiative of chaining themselves
 to the perimeter fence.

Many of us from Northampton offered to take part in direct action, but
 were asked instead to support the 'human chain' which was to be formed be-
 tween Greenham Common and Burghfield on Good Friday (because the blockade was
 to be a women only event), which of course we did.

As far as I am concerned, the event was so chaotic (and, as we all know,
 anarchy is not chaos) and so badly organised that I could'nt help but feel
 dissappointed as a result. When watching the events later that night on T.V.
 I found myself thinking: 'that looks Great, wish I'd been there! All that
 dancing and singing!' Yet along our stretch of the 'chain' it was rather dull,
 to say the least; no music, no (vegetarian/vegan) food, little in the way
 of 'community spirit' and, worse of all: NO HUMAN CHAIN! No human chain de-
 spite the obvious fact that there were sufficient people present to form
 chains on both sides of the road, but without the guidance of stewards, who
 was to know when to act?

But it was'nt all dissappointment, we did meet many fellow Anarchists,
 and many people from Northamptonshire who were pleased to see an Anarchist
 contingent from conservative Northampton. But it was the moment I heard the
 C.N.D.'s estimated head-count broadcast on the radio that I realised how
successful we had been: 100,000 people! A 14 mile road block (however incon-
 venient) is no mean achievement.

ANARCHISM AS A MOVEMENT DOES NOT EXIST-there is no party to join, no membership card, no central seat of authority exercising control over the individual. This is necessary in order to uphold the basic principles of Anarchy, which are that strength lies not in force of numbers but in the personal integrity of the individual. Anyone who becomes an Anarchist does so as a result of the power of their own convictions, not as a result of political intimidation. Government of all description eventually loses its relationship with the people it supposedly represents, and becomes instead a self-perpetuating power-base for an elite minority. The change need not be noticeable but the final outcome is inevitable: OPPRESSION. (As I write this I hear of a government proposal to introduce a system of 'fee-paying' for demonstrations and of a further proposal to ~~introduce~~ ~~Wxxxxxx~~ (considerably) the cost of forwarding a candidate for election. increase What kind of 'free' system financially inhibits the voice of alternative views from obtaining fair hearing?

The economies of this and other developed nations are showing clear signs of strain as their traditional supporters -the Third World nations and the natural resources of the Earth itself-are no longer willing or able to be regarded as limitless sources of cheap supply. The present government, as shown above, has demonstrated its willingness to adopt ever-increasing right-wing tendencies in an effort to suppress the growing disillusionment and unrest which many people are beginning to feel as a result of this strain: how long before 'Tighten your belts' becomes 'Tighten the noose?'

It is the people themselves-you and I-who are the machinery which drives this monster, and who therefore have the power to halt its march by the withdrawal of our support. The Achilles Heel of tyranny is in its ~~xxxxx~~ dependence on the sanction of its victims. You cannot be passive and free. It is necessary for every individual to accept the responsibility ~~for~~ ~~his~~ ~~her~~ ~~own~~ ~~future~~, and it is only by withdrawing

By voting I would be giving them, in effect, my total confidence to run things as they see fit... who knows what they may do? They certainly don't. How can I give them the trust of my vote? I feel, as an Anarchist, that I should not become part of the political power-swapping that the majority so blindly accept. We don't want to change this system that is designed to keep people subjected and in check, we want to get rid of it, and that cannot be done through the ballot, they just would not allow it...





THE "REAL" ALTERNATIVE

It is a well documented fact that Anarchists oppose all forms of government, however democratic and just they appear to be. But what is not so well documented is the alternative that Anarchists propose.

The abolition of government does not necessarily mean the rule of chaos and confusion. Organisation within society would exist without authority. Leadership and expertise have nothing to do with authority; let the leaders and experts emerge naturally rather than elect or select them.

Decisions should be made by all those directly affected by the consequences of the decisions. This is true democracy, not leaving organisation and decision-making to paid officials and (so-called) representatives.

Where representation is necessary (for the sake of convenience) a volunteer would be sent as a delegate, with precise instructions of ~~xxxx~~ what to say. He would voice the wishes of his community, and not the wishes of any political party. Using this as a basis, there is no reason why society cannot be co-ordinated by a network of councils drawn from local communities, which are themselves co-ordinated by councils covering wider areas. Examples of such co-ordination can be seen in the organisation of international railways, air traffic, shipping, telecommunications, famine and disaster relief, etc. This system could easily be applied within, as well as between, countries; as already exists with voluntary societies that are neither profit-making nor politically sensitive.

The Anarchists realise that organisation between individuals and between communities is necessary for peaceful co-existence. What Anarchy offers is organisation which is more than instinctive but less than official.

"TO VOTE OR NOT TO VOTE"

With both local and central government elections looming ominously in the immediate future, I have been contemplating the dilemma of whether "to vote or not to vote". There are sound arguments for both sides of this debate.

"TO VOTE". This involves active participation in a political system that one opposes, thus contributing towards it's continued existence. The danger of this would be of becoming too reliant upon the system and thereby losing sight of ones original objectives. But, there are advantages to be gained through the using of this system for the anarchist movement. Firstly, it would be non-violent and, therefore, less likely to provoke a violent reaction (that is unless civil liberties suffer further 'revisions' in the name of Thatcherism). Secondly, it would be representative of a majority and, without becoming a tyranny of the majority, be able to gradually dismantle the machinery of government and the state from within. Thirdly, people are basically conservative in respect to innovations; especially so with something as radical as Anarchy. They would accept change through the system more readily than change against the system.

As for the immediate future, the next general election may prove vital for the Anarchist movement. The best way to achieve Anarchy from within the system is via a vastly radical programme of socialist reforms. Such a programme of reforms could result from a Labour win at the next elections. An Liberal/SDP victory would offer the freedom of 'liberalism with some of the equality of socialism (Anarchists want both freedom and equality) but would they be radical and effective enough? (I doubt it!). Otherwise, a Conservative success would see the appearance of the extreme face of Thatcherism.

"NOT TO VOTE". This involves the process of destroying the system from the outside, i.e. awakening public opinion to the possibilities that an Anarchist state

would realise. Whether this action be violent or non-violent is up to the individual; the amount of violence necessary to defend oneself is dependant upon the size of the threat and the level of oppression involved.

The continued Right-Wing dictatorship would for the moment, mean increased oppression but could lead to increased and more organised reaction against the state. But the damage done by a re-elected Conservative government would constitute a serious setback to the advances of Anarchy. They have already shown their willingness to use the Armed Forces against external enemies, what would prevent them from using them against internal enemies as well.

The individual must make their own decisions as to which action to take; decisions based on a clear understanding of one's objectives and the consequences of one's actions. The important thing is action, in particular action now.
