As our membership has fallen nearly to crisis figures, we have done a very loose survey of the reasons we are losing our support. The bulk of the answers are:

C.N.D. is a lost cause, the problem is too big: No good cause is lost until it has completed its aim. It may be put aside, hidden under other good causes and forgotten, but not lost until it is won.

Is heart, or cancer, research a lost cause because people are still dying of these diseases? Think of all the causes which could be helped if the money was not be spent on nukes.

C.N.D. is no longer needed since the end of the Cold War: What about the devising and testing newer and bigger nukes? Testing is not done in our back-yard so gets very little media coverage. (U.S.A. have extended the test ban in the Nevada Desert, but the U.K. are ardently trying to reverse this decision.) When the other back-yards are fouled then we must share ours. The Government are refusing human refugees, but welcoming toxic waste to these shores.

There are valuable 'spin-offs' from space research: surely the astrnomical cost and despoilation of the earth is a high price for freezer-to-oven and non-stick cooking equipment.

Natural disasters are just as catastrophic: certainly these are on a grand scale and result in loss of lives and property, but the earth is not polluted by radio-activity and unable to be worked for milleniums.

Calling all Trident campaigners! Trident submarine number one, HMS Vanguard, is due to be commissioned in August or September. At this time Vanguard will be formally handed over to the navy. Vanguard is currently undergoing finishing-off work and modifications at Vickers Shipbuilding and Engineering Ltd (VSEL) in Barrow, following its sea trials off Scotland. Trident submarine number two, HMS Victorious, is also under construction at VSEL and is due to be rolled out and dunked in the near future.

The commissioning, which will probably be in Barrow but could be at Faslane, may attract some press coverage. It is a good opportunity for CND groups and members to write letters to the local press highlighting the cost of the Trident programme and the threat to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty. Barrow CND and North Cumbrian groups will be protesting against the commissioning and the roll out and dunking.
