Alliance Report

28 people attended and seven of the Shropshire groups were represented. A short report of each groups plans and activities was heard.

Shrewsbury links with the Labour Party were being developed, and neighbourhood groups established. A "Women for Life on Earth" group has been formed and a Non-violent training day organised on Saturday March 12th.

Oswestry the group joined a motorcade on the first anniversary of the Welsh Nuclear Free Zone. The group is preparing for the canvass. Alan Tucker described in his report of the C.N.D. national council the progress made by the various specialist groups.

Bridgnorth Approaches had been made to the prospective Parliamentary candidates. Video films were being organised and shown in the villages to increase and stimulate membership in the rural areas.

Market Drayton 120 people attended a showing of the War Game and regular monthly meetings had been held, and a display placed in the local library.

New a showing of the Bomb has established the group which has met every two weeks. Plans include meeting prospective Parliamentary candidates, a carnival float, and interest had been expressed in attending the Youth Festival in London on May 7th (how about a Shropshire coach interested contact Charles Hobday Bettisfield 243)

Telford consists of three groups now Wellington, Broseley and Shifnal. A questionnaire had been circulated to the C/E ministers prior to the discussion at the National Synod - a Christian C.N.D. may be formed as a result.

freeze campaign

The purpose of the freeze is to stop the nuclear arms race as a preliminary to an agreement between states on substantial reductions in nuclear weapons. It is a first step towards general disarmament. Peace and development groups in the U.K. are campaigning for a freeze on the research into and development, production, testing and deployment of nuclear weapons by all nuclear weapon states. In particular we believe that Britain, as well as the two super-powers, should halt its nuclear weapon programme.

The campaign's aims:-

1. Underground nuclear tests should be suspended.
2. Freeze the testing, production and deployment of all missiles and aircraft.
3. The number of land and submarine based launch tubes for nuclear missiles should be frozen.
4. No changes to existing missiles or bomber loads.
5. A halt to the production of fissionable weapon grade material.
6. Production of nuclear warheads should be halted.
7. A ban on research and development of new weapons systems.

Could this be part of our campaign in Shropshire on a county wide declaration signed by prominent public figures? It could have a wide appeal and offer an opportunity to work with many Church, development/aid groups.

Ten persons who speak make more noise than 10,000 who are silent, said Napoleon. Ten persons who write letters are doing more for peace than 10,000 well-meaning sympathisers who sign heavily as they see the endless preparations for war.

Urgent Action

The Government has introduced a new Police And Criminal Evidence Bill which they hope to rush through Parliament before Summer 1985. This Bill gives the Police sweeping new powers which will be used arbitrarily and unjustly, and result in wrongful conviction of innocent people. Public relations will worsen as a result. As far as C.N.D. is concerned the sections allowing road blocks to be set up anywhere for one week without a warrant could be used to disrupt a demonstration and in addition new powers of arrest, detention and seizure of records suggest an ominous future for campaign organisations. We must act quickly to stop the Bill becoming law. Write to your M.P. at the House of Commons London S.W.1. Also write to any Peer at the House of Lords to oppose it. Writing letters to the press, radio and television and raising the issue through local groups of political parties, trade unions, local authorities, public meetings and private discussions will increase public awareness.
