THE ANARCHIST BOOKFAIR 2004

Welcome to the twenty-third London Anarchist Bookfair: the mother of all anarchist bookfairs! Second year in this venue and we're full. With eighty stalls and fifty meetings this is the largest one ever. For the last couple of weeks we've been turning away people who needed a stall.

We're on the first to the fourth floors. Stalls on the first floor together with the cafe and bar. Meetings, creche, performance space and a few stalls on the second. More meetings and exhibition space on the third floor, with videos on the top floor. We'd ask people to respect the venue as any damage (e.g. stickers) has to be paid for by us. This is a no smoking (except bar) and no dog venue.

Course there are books at this bookfair, but it's not really about the books. It's about connections. Meeting like-minded people, organising things, learning things, starting things. This is a bookfair that covers an extraordinary range of human activity: from self-defence to next year's G8, from organising locally to the international anarchist movement, from the South Pacific to Iceland.

From sharing a pint with an old friend, forging a new contact, sharing an experience or creating something new, make the bookfair work for you. Just fucking do it.

1.00-2.00 SCHNEWS AT TEN

WHO'S IN CHARGE?

This November SchNEWS celebrates ten years of reporting from the direct-action frontline. Since 1994 this 'cheeky' A4 newsheet has been constantly in everyone's face for 52 weeks of every year. As part of the SchNEWS@Ten festivities we have produced this film to give everyone a glimpse into how the SchNEWS is put together and the sort of stuff we've been up to in the last ten years. Using archive footage this film traces the SchNEWS from its early days through to the present. All done in its usual no nonsense approach and with a wicked soundtrack.

2.00-3.00 SOLIDARITY SOUTH PACIFIC

Introduction (and film) about active solidarity with libertarian, ecological and tribal resistance in the South Pacific. Throughout the Pacific Rim wild nature and wild culture are under attack. For ten years the British radical ecological movement has taken inspiration from Pacific struggles and in return carried out solidarity actions against companies and embassies. We aim primarily to aid the West Papuan tribal resistance, Earth First! plus tribal and ecological struggle in the Phillipines and to bring attention to the revolution in Bougainville.

3.00-4.00 HOW THE LIVERPOOL DOCKERS LAUNCHED A GLOBAL MOVEMENT

Grass roots activists have published a booklet describing the powerful experience of those who worked with the Liverpool dockers in 1995-1998, a dispute censored by the British state. We outline how Reclaim the Streets environmental activists joined the Dockers in their worldwide actions against casualisation, for human dignity, sparking a global anti capitalist movement.

4.00-5.00 AGITATOR

In May 2000, The Agitator attempted to bring together autonomous, non-hierarchical,

libertarian activist groups in one directory. Each group decided their own entry. The aim was to help link groups up. In 2002, we went 'on-line'. Recently, we have updated it when groups have contacted us. But we need to be more pro-active. We want to delete old groups and add new ones. The three of us can do it, but we don't know of every group around. Come and discuss the relevance of The Agitator, how it should go forward (if at all), and maybe help out a bit.

5.00-6.30 PROJECTILE WORKSHOP

This session is a workshop in which we would like to exchange experiences and resources useful for putting on anarchist cultural events. These resources include sources of funding and details of film distributors. We also plan to preview a number of our films. In addition, this meeting provides a first opportunity for anyone who might like to get involved in putting together a bigger Northern festival of anarchism and direct action in 2005. In this we would welcome the participation of individuals and pre-existing groups.

★ 2E (SECOND FLOOR) STALLS

Active, 56A Infoshop, Pogo Cafe et al Banished from the main rooms for making everyone else look boring, Active has a space of its own full of the cheapest books, mags and merch available. This year we've brought all our 'music' too so all you punks and rockers get up them stairs and turn right!

We are sharing the space with the 56A Infoshop, 13 years old, South London's only anarchist bookshop and much more! The 56A is a non-profit, volunteer run space with a large open-access archive of international radical material; we always welcome new folks to get involved.

The Pogo Cafe is a workers co-op vegan outlet in Hackney. It rose out of the Emmaz project, and now stands alone as a beacon of cool and caring food in a hostile world. Come and find out about us and our fab merchandise.

★ **3A (THIRD FLOOR)**

12.00-1.00 LEGAL SUPPORT AT THE G8 ACTIONS

Out of the Dissent network organising against the G8 summit next year, a working group has been formed to provide legal support.

Although the summit is still 8 months away, it is important that we begin to plan our input into the events. To find out more or to get involved, come to this meeting.

1.00-.00 INTRODUCTION TO ANARCHISM – ALICE NUTTER

At certain times, especially in the late eighties and early nineties, the label anarchism has linked lots of disparate groups and individuals together. Spanning everything and everybody from punks (whose creativity and presence revitalised and some would say ultimately stunted the anarchist movement from the seventies onward) work place syndicalists, autonomists, libertarian marxists and class war activists, the British anarchist movement has had a contrasting and varied cast of characters. As well as talking about the different divisions of anarchism, Alice Nutter asks "How important is it to label yourself an anarchist in today's anti-globalisation movement?" Is anarchism useful as a practice, as a way of relating to others but restrictive as an ideology? What does the label mean and how useful is it?

2.00-3.00 ANARCHIST ACADEMICS

Anarchist students, researchers, and lecturers will meet at this time to discuss our research, work, and purpose; to make friends and contacts; and to fight the isolation that many of us experience. This group met for the first time last year. It now has an email list, and regional get-togethers.

3.00-4.00 FEMINIST HEALTH WORKSHOP

Meeting to organise and discuss feminist health gathering in Nottingham 11-12 December, 2004. Open to any women who would like to know more.

4.00-5.00 ANIMAL LIBERATION AND ANARCHISM

To mark the republication of the groundbreaking pamphlet 'Beasts of Burden,' which examines how capitalism exploits animals and the links between anarchism and animal liberation, this workshop will debate how we can build a libertarian society by fundamentally transforming the relations between humans and animals.

5.00-6.00 ORGANISING LOCALLY IN THE COMMUNITY AND WORKPLACE

Meeting organised by Walthamstow Anarchist group and Haringey Solidarity Group

Anarchists live and work in our communities. Our political activities need to be meaningful and relevant to those around us. The meeting will look at practical examples of how two anarchists group in North East London are active in local workplace and community-based struggles.

2.00-3.00 REFORM ANARCHISM

Anarchism is a basic law of the universe; it operates now. We don't have to wait for the revolution. So how do we rescue the anarchistic structures and processes in society today – and extend them? Anarchism is the way out of inefficiency, waste, poverty and pollution – and the only road to freedom; the only road not taken – yet.

3.00-4.00 PAGAN MAGIKAL ACTIVISM 2. – TWENTY THREE SKIDOO

discussion on the possibility of setting up a network of groups prepared to take solidarity action.

12.00-1.00 KARAHNJUKAR DAM CAMPAIGN

Discussion about the international plans to fight the destruction of Iceland's volcanic and glacial wilderness.

1.00-2.00 MAYDAY 2005

This year the London Mayday collective decided not to organise a big Mayday celebration. 2.00-3.00 BEYOND THE COMPOST BOG; PERMACULTURE, SELF-BUILD AND SUSTAINABLE LIVING

4.00-5.00 ANARCHIST MEDIA: USE IT OR LOSE IT

10.00 GENOA: THE RED ZONE

This film does not hide from the truth: staggering images of violence provide gritty realism yet the beauty of resistance shines through. Despite the repression, a multitude of voices were heard in Genoa – national boundaries were overturned as a global body of people demanded a world built on social and environmental equality.

11.00 COCONUT REVOLUTION

A gripping story from Bougainville, a Pacific island with a population of 160,000 that has managed to close and keep closed one of the biggest copper mines in the world. Thanks to their constant resistance, the self-described 'ecological revolutionaries' of Bougainville have come close to victory: freedom from exploitation by capitalist corporations and the state.

12.00 FIRE IN THE EYES

From the forests of California, this is an emotive portrayal of the pepper spray torture

of non-violent activists who challenged authority with civil disobedience.

12:30 THE 43 GROUP – THE UNFINISHED WAR

"First of all we slung a load of bricks at 'em and then we went in and gave 'em a bloody good hiding". The 43 Group realised that in order to combat fascism in Britain, they had to use every means at their disposal. This stylish documentary charts the history of the group and features interviews with some of its members, conveying the joy and comradeship that comes from shared commitment and successful group activity.

1.00 LIFTING THE LID ON THE COMPOST TOILET

Made by Nick Fenton (maker of 'The Boy Whose Skin Fell Off'), a documentation and demystification of the building of a compost toilet at Dial House (once the home of Crass). Warning – features strong language and nudity!

Scotland and take action around the Summit. Find out how you can get involved and get informed.

4.00-5.00 CHILEAN ANARCHISM

A Chilean comrade from the anarcho-communist organisation CUAC – recently renamed the OCL – will give a talk on revolutionary struggle in Latin America, the development of an anarchist movement at the heart of the popular struggles in that region, and how the tradition of anarchism has adopted a new form in the 21st century.

5.00-6.00 DOROTHY ROWE

Psychologist Dorothy Rowe is one of the few in her field who draw explicit links between

politics and psychology. She has written extensively on how authority, society, government and the family create obedient children and adults, and how the coercive and duplicitous nature of the state creates suffering and emotional pain in its citizens. She criticizes the practices of psychiatry, including the use of labels and drugs to silence and punish people, and to deny the social responsibility for mental health.

In her talk 'How to Undermine the Psychiatric System' she will discuss how patients have forced psychiatrists and the system to change e.g. the Hearing Voices Movement. The system, she says, may be better than it was, but it can never work properly because it is based on coercion and an incorrect premise, that there

1:30 BATTLE OF THE BOGSIDE

An inspiring video for community activists. In 1969, after tensions had been building up in Derry, the inhabitants of the catholic Bogside area decided they had had enough. This video shows how the community hit back, with riots lasting for nearly 3 days, leading to British troops being sent to Northern Ireland.

2:30 THEMROC

A classic piece of surreal and subversive filmmaking from France, Themroc is a devastatingly funny swipe at conformity and genteel society. It's the story of a man who faced with the mundanity of everyday existence cracks – he turns his flat into a cave dwelling and proceeds to express himself in a variety of different ways, from inciting mayhem at his



factory to eating a cop. There's no dialogue – just formless language and grunts.

4:30 THE FELLOWSHIP OF THE RING OF FREE TRADE

A spoof on the epic 'The Lord of the Rings' movie that is fast becoming a cult on the internet. The story was once thought to be merely an archetypal struggle between good and evil – but it has been found to contain astute prophetic messages about the impending crisis of capitalist modernity.

4:45 UNDERCURRENTS NEWS NETWORK



"The psychiatric system has changed a great deal in the last thirty years but those changes have not come from the psychiatrists themselves but from people who had experienced the system as patients, and a handful of professionals who were prepared to be ostracised by large numbers of psychiatrists, nurses and psychologists who saw no reason for anything to change. Change also came from a small number of psychiatrists who initially accepted the system but who discovered through their work that the theories they were using were wrong and that the medication they were prescribing was not producing the results they expected."

In preparing *Lifelines*, his sequel to *Real Education*, David Gribble visited organisations for street children in Delhi, youth gangs in Chicago and deserted children in Thailand. From his interviews and observations, the message is unmistakable – in all these places the key to success is deep respect for every young person.
