## SWORDS INTO PLOUGHSHARES

## THE ACTION

On the 21st March 1990, in the first few hours of the first day of spring, Mike Hutchinson and Stephen Hancock cut through the perimeter fence of USAF Upper Heyford in Oxfordshire and made their way to the nearby hangers, and beyond onto the floodlit runway area. The base is home to about 100 F-111 nuclear bombers, some of which were used in the American strike against Libya.

They walked over to an F-111. Stephen entered the cockpit and disarmed some instruments linked to the weapons and delivery systems, while Mike hammered on an empty pylon which would carry the weapons. As security personnel arrived, Stephen emerged from the cockpit to hang a banner reading: SWORDS INTO PLOUGHSHARES - DISARMAMENT HAS BEGUN, and shouted to the guards "It's OK, we've disarmed it." They left their hammers, a teddy bear, and a piece of the Berlin Wall, and a ripped up copy of the INF Treaty together with their own Grassroots Disarmament Treaty. They had disarmed the plane in a real way, causing just under  $\pounds 1/4$  million worth of disarmament.

"For a short time today we created a small breathing space - enough of a crevice for hope to lodge itself in. For a short time we disarmed a nuclear sword. A little symbol, Apparently, the whole air-force was grounded for checks. Something I had never even thought of. It seems a little crazy - two people, household courage and hammers, can enact disarmament. A little crazy - but also a source of great joy. To walk through, pass through, all that fear which has twisted inside me over the last vear. To walk through that fear and feel the liberation of taking responsibility for this nuclear world of ours washing over and through my whole body." (Stephen)

- They face up to twenty years in prison for their peace protest. -
