



The Papacy has issued a document claiming that gays and lesbians suffer from an "objective disorder". The document was produced by the Vatican's doctrinal watchdog for use by the Catholic Church in America where it is under siege from the so-called 'liberation theology' and was not intended for publication. "Sexual orientation does not constitute a quality comparable to race, ethnic background etc in respect to non-discrimination" claims the document. It goes on to say that discrimination against gays and lesbians is justified in adoption ad fostering, military training, and the training of "teachers or athletic coaches". 
WHAT'S UP DOC!


PINK CADILLAC WANTED

RECORD ROUNDUP

Ayup! You'd best fetch out yer gladdies and stuff 'em into a convenient orifice 'cos the long out of circulation recordings by Manchester's finest (after Buzzcocks and Elsie Tanner) the Smiths are about to hit the streets in a flash of sheer dazzling top ten-ness. Fourteen of their despairridden classics are gathered together on the first instalment of a two part greatest hits album with the incredibly inventive title of "Best Of The Smiths Volume One" So, still on the subject of the bequiffed, lantern-jawed prince of ambiguity and doomed never to marry, Morrissey is back on Lonely Street, not yet at Heartbreak Hotel, but out and about with follow up to the disappointing "Kill Uncle" album. "Your Arsenal" sees the Mo back on form again with a good mixture of jingle jangles, sub-AC/D riffs and plaintive moaning

a-plenty.


COMING SOON....



OUTlook "I've been involved in Greenham Common for ten years. I saw the nuclear silos being built and I was there to see them off last year". Chris Drake's involvement with the Peace Movement has been interwoven with lesbian/gay politics and the politics around AIDS. 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



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

NINA LONGDEN An appreciation

Nina Longden came to Nottingham from Crewe over twelve years ago and for most of that time she worked relentlessly for Nottingham Women's Aid and later Lesbian Line. Poverty and deprivation were not new to her.

For most people single-parenting three children in the mean Eighties would be challenge enough, but Nina was driven by a desire, through her own experience, to see women dishing the dirt, and rising above abuse, and begin to plough their own furrows, often for the first time, taking control of their own lives.

With her children into adulthood and streetwise in the University of Life, Nina went on to complete a Sociology degree at Nottingham University. Despite the death of her mother during her studies, which were interrupted for some time, she went back to finish the task.

Her friends came from many quarters. To say she was popular was an understatement. Her unmistakeable presence, ambling through Nottingham often provoked a "Hey up, Nina!" from someone she knew whose home was a cardboard box but to whom that person was a unique individual in Nina's eyes. She had only recently moved from Nottingham to Fiskerton to live with her partner Carol, and, for the first time, she was really finding contentment in her personal life which was beginning to work out for her.

When someone dies with little warning, there is often no time to prepare to say goodbye, and for many of her friends this was the case. Her funeral was as empowering as it was sad and a testament to the solidarity that is part of the Women's Movement. A lesbian Minister from the Metropolitan Community Church led the gathering of nearly one hundred women, and several men from all over Britain. And when it was over the women carried Nina aloft through the village to the cemetery, where young and old alike, with spades and their bare hands, completed her passage. Her contribution to the Women's Movement and Nottingham Women's Aid, in particular, is incalculable. She will be conspicuous by her absence but will live on in the folk memory of many women and men who won't forget the space she occupied in their lives, the woman with the heart as big as a volcano.
