



NO MORE MISSES

I DO - an affirmation of faith

It all began in September last year when Mo put a telephone ad in the gay press. "I placed this ad and the next night Liz rang. From the moment I heard her voice I knew she was someone I wanted to know better. I go a lot on voices, they tell me a lot about someone", she adds.

Liz takes up the story. "I was living in Birmingham when I answered the ad on the Tuesday and by the Wednesday I was over at Mo's place in Mansfield". After that Liz, spent most of her time in Mansfield, but has only recently given up her flat in Birmingham. "It was also a case of love me love my dogs as I had three; a labrador lurcher, boxer and terrier, who have quite got used to Mo's cat, Polly."

"Everything seemed to fit together since day one, I'd not had a relationship for several years and I was looking for friendship and companionship, my previous relationships had not turned out the way I wanted and had ended", says

Liz.



But it has not all been a bed of roses; Liz has been in poor health in recent years and it was only the strength which she says Mo gave her, to have the confidence to go through a serious operation with another one on the horizon.

Mo has lived in Mansfield for eighteen years since she was married. "We decided to have an Affirmation ceremony as the public and official seal on our relationship and as a way of showing to other people how much we care for each other," said Mo. "Our parents couldn't understand why we would want to go through an affirmation ceremony although they are quite supportive," says Liz.

Although their families know they are two lesbians living together, neither family chose to be present at the ceremony, but forty other friends were at the 'Charter Arms' in Mansfield to witness the officiant David Smith seal the relationship, including Mo's ex-husband Michael and his new wife. During the ceremony they recited part of a Shakespeare Sonnet and some Apache Indian poetry to each other.

"We are together because we absolutely adore each other and there's a little thing that says it is for life," says Liz. "The only thing that will separate us is if one of us passes over. Getting together is the best thing we ever did. We see this ceremony as a way of showing to the outside world how much we care for each other."



OUT HOUSE


Nottingham's OUT HOUSE community centre moved several steps nearer to fruition recently when an offer was accepted for a building near the city centre.



PLAQUE UNVEILED

Close family and friends will gather at midday on December 1st, as we go to press, to unveil a memorial plaque commemorating the life of Leicester man Warren Weisner. Warren, a well-respected campaigner for lesbian and gay equality and founding member of Leicestershire Aids Support Services died in June, 1994 aged 38 of an HIV related illness.

LIGHTS OF LOVE

Coventry & Warwickshire's leading AIDS Charity, the HIV Network, will mark World AIDS Day 1994 with the largest commemorative event ever to be held in this area.

The public are invited to take part in a LIGHTS OF LOVE event to be held in five locations simultaneously: Leamington Spa, Nuneaton, Stratford-upon-Avon, Rugby and Coventry on Thursday 1st December. It is hoped that over 10,000 people throughout the county will light a special nightlight in recognition of the global impact of AIDS.

Worldwide it is estimated that 17 million people are infected with HIV, the virus that can lead to AIDS. To mark this fact, members of the HIV Network will be handing out red ribbons (the international symbol of AIDS awareness) in front of huge maps of the world detailing the number of people living with

HIV.

At Shelton Square, Coventry between 10am and 5pm members of the public are invited to support World AIDS by coming along and taking part in this special commemorative event. At approximately 6.30pm people from all five events will converge en masse in Coventry City Centre, at Shelton Square amphitheatre, where a series of readings and testimonies will take place.

The Coventry event will be repeated in the City Centre on

Saturday 3rd December, 1994.

DERBY RAINBOW

Fed up with rows, schisms and petty politics that often prevent many voluntary groups working effectively together, a Derby man decided to do something about it in his city.

Dave Collins of Curzons Club invited representatives from each group to a meeting at the Club. "When they arrived I told them about my idea. If other cities can work together then so can we," he said. 'Rainbow' is a coalition of the Lesbian & Gay Youth Group, Body Positive, Derby Aidsline, Derby Friend, Derby MESMAC, Lesbian Line and the University LGB Group.

"We have a fund-raising day for the coalition on the third Wednesday of each month, donation of door admissions people can give what they like - going to the coalition's funds. At the end of the year the money raised will be split between the groups. So far over £800 has been raised. Dave added, "The coalition also gives us financial clout; it means we can attract more big-name acts who are more likely to give their services free to a group of organisations, rather than to a single fund-raiser. 
lookout for new volunteers to expand the Project. Volunteers from the Black and Asian community are especially welcome as they are currently underrepresented.





GROOVY CHICKS

Often out-dazzled by the prismatic and charismatic supernova that was Dusty Springfield, Sandie Shaw nonetheless left an impression on the British pop scene and has a treasure trove of hits and not-so-hits out now as testimony to this. 'Nothing Less Than Brilliant' collects the finest moments of this eloquent chanteuse who, bereft of footwear, admirably barefooted her way into the top twenty on no less than nine occasions. All you could want from this sad-eyed songstress is compiled on one Kleenex wetting collection of pantingly yearnful sagas of woe, mis-directed passion and luuuurv. Included are 'Long Live Love', the poignant 'Girl Don't Come', the kickstart to her

chart career 'There's Always Something There To Remind Me' and the ultimate paean to S&M 'Puppet On A String', surely preceding Depeche Mode's 'Master and Servant' by a good seventeen years. Alongside of Dusty, Sandie surely (geddit?) seemed to be the epitome of those groovy chicks in films such as 'Up The Junction', 'The Leather Boys' and the like. Crank up the Dansette, kick off your shoes and relive with relish!



WARP FACTOR

As the ambient genre fractures, fractalises and falls prey to hopeless chancers and dozens of poorly-constructed stoned twiddlings, it's bona to feast one's lugholes upon something refreshingly inventive. Filtering from the darkside of the third dimension comes Woob, a musical Tardis where the 32-minute opener 'On Earth' pulls you up and out with tribal drums resonating ominously across an overlay of spiritual chants and Eastern percussion, evoking sultry atmospheres where the calls from birds of paradise and assorted insects mesh with the lonely call of a solitary harmonica.

Mixed, mashed and moved live at Nottingham's Square Centre studio and utilising the spatially expanding Roland Sound Space 3-D sound imaging system, it's time to unwind your mind with this ethereal passport to plateaus of

subconscious serendipity.

The HEALTH Column Gay and Bisexual Health Issues

With World Aids Day on 1st December 1994 perhaps it is time to reflect on the progress that has been made in preventing the spread of HIV, and in supporting those who are HIV positive.

All the current statistics show that the rate of infection spread across the world is still increasing, with devastating

consequences for individuals and countries alike.

Whilst care for those with a positive HIV status has improved in the UK in the last few years, there is still a need to do more and to challenge the prejudice and myths that surround HIV and the gay community.

This years theme for the World Aids Day was 'the family'

and focuses on the need to address HIV and AIDS within the family setting. It would be easy to misinterpret the theme as the 2.4 children syndrome. However, in this author's view the family can be any group of individuals, or partnerships that come together in a supportive and caring relationship.

As Gays and Lesbians we need to reassert two important rights. First that our relationships should be valued by society, and second that 'our' families also need care and support when individuals within our family are affected by HIV. We ask no more than equality, but equality with no strings or prejudice attached.

The World Aids Day theme of 'family' whilst being an admirable concept needs to address the extended family, called the human race of which we are part and like all family members we ask for the respect, care and support of

our fellow human beings.



WERE YOU THERE?

This trio of sartorially elegant clubbers appeared 21 years ago this month in the long defunct Gay News, celebrating the opening of Nottingham's newest gay niterie, La Chic.

Now, two decades on and with the closure of Nero's, Nottingham is still minus a regular gay nightclub. What is happening? the trend for one-nighters seems to be escalating, influenced by the almost nomadic existence of peripatetic dance/rave events. That's all fine and dandy if you fancy a transient club night restricted to certain venues on certain nights, but where does it leave gay men and women who work late and have missed the pubs that close at 11pm? What happens if you're all revved up and in cruise mode? 13-odd years ago, in the halcyon days of La Chic's successor La Chic Part Two, visitors from more provincial towns and villages could come to Nottingham knowing that after pub closing time things could really kick off. A gay club of such high standard has not been witnessed in Nottingham since Part 2's demise in 1985.



A few half-heartedly attempted to claim the crown but failed, seemingly solely motivated by making a quick buck and supplying such shoddy conditions that you'd have more chance of an exciting night staying in with a mug of Horlicks and a copy of Zipper. Nottingham's gay men have always trolled over to Leicester, Manchester, Sheffield and Birmingham, always on the quiveve for something hot and happening, but why should that have to be the only available option?

You constantly overhear people expounding wisdom along the lines of "What I'd do if I ran a gay club" - there are plenty of people out there who have periodically worked on the commercial gay scene in Nottingham, so what about a co-operative? A prime success story is the Nightingale in Birmingham, so why can't that happen here, where the clientele get a say in what's happening and we can stick two fingers up to gay and straight profiteers creaming off Nottingham's gay men and lesbians.


