LEICESTERSHIRE'S POLICING A MOVE FORWARD

After consultation with the Leicester Lesbian, Gay & Bisexual Forum, Leicestershire Constabulary have issued a new policy on how they intend to deal with complaints about cottaging and cruising. The policy was developed in partnership with the police and lacked the acrimonious wrangles that have surrounded such discussions in other counties. Forum spokesperson Andy Griffiths said that the publication of the policy is an important step in reassuring gay men that the Leicestershire Police will not act indiscriminately and that strict controls are being placed on how they operate.

Chief Superintendent Mick Perry, head of the Force's Operations Department said "The job of the Police is to enforce the law but enforcement doesn't have to mean prosecutions in every case. We have no alternative to act on public complaints but the action we take has to be aimed at reassurance

and prevention."

The key points of the new

police policy are:

1. All complaints must be in writing; trivial or unsubstantiated complaints will not be acted on.

- 2. Uniformed officers, briefed to give advice where appropriate, will patrol the area as a deterrent.
- 3. If complaints persist, specially trained officers in plain clothes will mount observations in the area.
- 4. Any offenders will be liable to be cautioned.

Prosecution will only take place on the authority of the Detective Chief Superintendent and only as a last resort.

Closely linked to the policy is the Force's procedure for dealing with complaints of homophobic violence and harassment, including the unusual step of victims being able to make reports through the Forum's year-old anonymous Monitoring Scheme. The pioneering scheme has already led to several other counties expressing an interest in emulating

BOOK REVIEW

Homosexuality - A Guide for Parents & Teachers by Dr. Joan Gomez, Robert Hale Ltd. London.

Gomez perpetuates many stereotypes in this book such as causes of homosexuality which range from "strong mothering" to "loneliness and insecurity" or "fear of women". Even sick or dead mothers cannot escape Gomez. A daughter is "more likely to be a lesbian if her mother is dead or incapacitated by illness."

Gays are child-molesting bum bandits because of "The warm welcome given to new, young recruits" which "can ensnare a boy" into all kinds of activities "including sex" and "anal sex....as is the usual role for young boys and adolescents".

Gomez implies that we are irresponsible and immoral by our sexual behaviour and short term relationships and therefore have a price to pay such as "insecurity and a sense of alienation from family and the mainstream of humanity..." and loneliness when we are over 40.

Bisexuals also get it in the neck, "The Nottingham Women's Centre, (bisexual men) are such a highly sexed group that they enjoy intercourse with whichever sex is at hand". Finally, Gomez has a chapter entitled "Minimising the Likelihood of Homosexuality". Pass the sick bag Dorothy!







CHALKING UP A SUCCESS

It's now a year since six people met in Nottingham's International Community Centre to consider the need for a lesbian, gay and bisexual group for workers in education. With 60 people currently on the mailing list and up to 30 attending the monthly meetings, none of us could have foreseen how great that need was.

For many members the half-hour open forum with which all meetings begin has been a useful opportunity to bring up problems and anxieties, such as harassment by management and homophobic abuse in the

classroom, in a safe, and supportive environment.

Equality in the workplace has, of course, been a recurring issue. Coming out at work and how to promote equality for students and staff without being the lone crusading voice are important matters. These and other issues will be raised later this year when we question representatives from the trade unions.

The group also recognises its responsibilities to young people in education. At a recent meeting young lesbians and gay men talked about their experiences of school, we have also discussed the government's new sex education guidelines and at our next session we'll be visited by the Leicester Parents' Support Group.



Equality Show last December she certainly brought the house down at the Albert Hall, and there were not too many dry eyes left by the time she'd finished.

The star of "Whose Line Is It Anyway?" said that while waiting to come on in the wings, she was shaking all over. Following her entrance she read out a public apology from the Save the Children Fund, who had dropped her as compere of their 75th anniversary celebrations, following tabloid labelling of her as "bubbly blonde lesbian mother-of-three".

Following a huge outcry, including a zap from the direct action group the Lesbian Avengers, Save the Children Fund conceded that its decision to drop her was wrong and in breach of its own anti-discrimination policy.

Said Sandi: "At the end of the day, the only thing you can arm yourself with is honesty. If I'm teaching my children to tell the truth, then I have to tell the truth myself."



"I am writing to congratulate you, Mushroom Bookshop and Hiziki/Out to Munch on providing a brilliant housing service. It is through this network that I found my current safe secure housing.

"However, my experience of private rented accommodation with the Department of Social

Security is another matter.

"I had my income support cut off for five days because they assumed I was heterosexual, and having a relationship with my landlady. This is the second time this has happened in my recent housing history. I proudly stated my sexuality as soon as I realised their case of mistaken identity on the Department's official visit to my home.

"It would seem that same sex partnerships have an advantage over differently sexed partnerships at 'screwing' the system as they wont assume two men or two women possible of having a relationship and I'm sure bisexuality couldn't even fit into their narrow equation of the diverse human relationships we can, and do have.

"Yet again the system fails to provide for the diversity of our communities by failing to even acknowledge that we do live our lives true to ourselves and externalise the heterosexist oppression we are continually bombarded with. Perhaps they are victims of their own oppression and refuse to see past the blinkers society has given them.

THERE ARE NO WORDS...

Sections of the British AIDS Memorial Quilt were on display in Leicester last month at the City Rooms. The Quilt which commemorates the lives and loves of those who died from AIDS-related illnesses, had been brought to the city by Leicestershire Social Services, Leicestershire Health and Leicester City Council who joined forces with LASS and the Men's Sexual Health Project to mount and pay for the costs of the display.

Since the project began in 1987, more than 27,000 panels have been made worldwide. The panels, made from a variety of materials have been painstakingly made by the lovers, families and

friends of those who died.

Dr. Rashmi Shukla, Chairperson of Leicestershire's multi-agency working group on AIDS said of the display: "Seeing the AIDS National Quilt is an emotional experience. It illustrates the impact of the HIV epidemic by revealing the names behind the numbers and by providing glimpses of the lives that have been lost."

One of the most moving panels came from Brighton. It shows a night sky illuminated by hundredsof stars. Each star represents a life lost to AIDS. I counted over 300. As one person wrote in the comments book, "there are no words".....

Clattering along like some speeding mutant luurvchild of Man 2 Man and Bobby "O", Burning Up' is a galloping formulated synth-throbbing amyl and uppers-friendly Capella-ish pounder with a typical middlebreak that, when this hits the top 5 (and it will), the resulting TOTP performances will have all the girlies woooohing and screaming as if they've never heard this particular effect before. The 5 track CD single features real off ya head mixes guaranteed to bring a punch of Saturday night fever to bedrooms and living rooms nationwide. Crank it up!

SOME KANDY TALKIN'

East Midlands-based groove-encrusted kickin' quartet Atomic Kandy have 4 cracking new tracks out now. The turbulence which follows a line up shake up has subsided and the funky foursome kick ass big style with the 'Doctor' EP. A nuance of change in musical cohesion is apparent, particularly on the title track which is a belting piece of commerciality which, really, some music biz bigwig should pick up on sharpish. Jealous Heart' is the air-punching ballad of the set and erupts in a forceful (dare I say) Cher/US rock anthemstyle with delicate Spanish guitar embellishments. The Toud mix' of 'Stand Up' comes over as a throbbing Hendrixesque packhorse with sturdy Paul Kossoff influenced rhythm and a solid bass & drum foundation for the constantly maturing vocals of singer Claire. 

Gay and Bisexual Health Issues

Servicing Who?

Services for gay and bisexual men seem very much flavour of the month at the moment. After years of neglect, purchasers of services are suddenly waking up and smelling the coffee. Targeted work with gay men is beginning to become less of an attitude of "how do we talk to the Martians/", or sometimes "where do we find them?", and more what are our needs and how can they be met?

In some areas this is part of a genuine commitment to prioritising work with our communities, but in some it is little more than a belated embarrassment that somehow we got "overlooked" in the enthusiasm to set up services for heterosexuals who might be at risk in future epidemics (I

wonder why?).

Now, as monies for services are being savaged, purchasers are only too keen to try to redress the balance, if only as much money hadn't already been committed to other services.

Gay and bisexual men are not traditional users of services. We are brought up in a culture which does not respect or validate our sexualities, and are generally treated as second class citizens. It's not surprising therefore that we don't always find it easy to respond immediately when asked what we

It is not up to us however to take responsibility if few gay men are using services, not to be threatened that these will be withdrawn if we don't get our act together and appear in our

thousands at clinics, drop-ins etc.

Responsibility for encouraging us to use services rests firmly with those services that have ignored or excluded us for so long. And this should be done in partnership with gay and bisexual men, not by trying to frighten us into taking whatever is on offer whether is appropriate or not.

Receiving poor services is almost as bad as receiving no services at all. We should not have to apologise for not getting our needs met, nor should we be blamed, or blame ourselves,

for it.

6,712 dead, 5,025 of whom were gay. 15,869 living with HIV/AIDS, 8,635 gay. How many more will it take before real services for real people will take our needs on board?

BLATANT HOMOPHOBIA

Birmingham City Council has refused to register Pride Place, a six bedroom home because it says it fears the children there will face further "stigmatisation and labelling". The decision has prompted a row between social workers, childcare experts and councillors and may mean that teenagers who have been abused themselves because of their sexuality may end up back in the homes of their abusers.

Bill Marsden, co-ordinator of Triangle Courses and Resources, an established training agency approved by the Central Council for Education and Training of Social Workers which trains carers and social workers at Pride Place has branded the decision "blatantly homophobic", a claim the Labour-controlled authority strongly denies.
