JUST DESSERTS

A 23 year-old Lincoln man was sentenced to four years in jail and described by a judge 'as a merciless attacker', at Lincoln Crown Court last month. The sentence of four years is followed by a Probation Order for six years, which means that if he breaks the terms of the Probation Order he could be recalled immediately to prison.

Alan Morton of Carholme Road, Lincoln, was convicted of attacking Brian Davis and his friend Steven Newell who were both beaten up in August 1993 as they left the Swiss Cottage pub in Newland, which is the regular venue for lesbian and gay discos in the city. Mr. Davis sustained a fractured skull and his friend a broken nose after the attack.

The jury convicted Morton on charges of grievous bodily harm, assault and violent disorder by a majority of 10-2.

However, three other assailants who were involved in the incident still remain free and it is believed that they all work together for a local grass contracting company. It is also known that this gang make a habit of harassing women in the area.

One of the attackers was actually sitting in the public gallery and then came forward to give evidence for the defendant Morton. As a result of further information which has come to **outright!** we can reveal that several of the queerbashers involved in this incident are also believed to have threatened to kill the landlord of the Swiss Cottage.

A relieved Brian Davis said after the sentencing: "What they did to me and my friend was totally unacceptable. If I was black or a woman, society would not tolerate this kind of thing. There is no official backup for victims of queerbashing. I would have been happier if all four had been brought before the court. There comes a time when you have to take a stand, enough is enough."

POLICE TWIST KNICKERS

A Court case was stopped in mid-stream by a Judge when he told Police prosecution witnesses to go away and sort themselves out.

At the trial of Brian Sandell and Glyn Crowder, D.C. Stringer of Chesterfield Police was giving evidence to Nottingham Crown Court late last month, when it became clear that he had mixed up some photos which allegedly related to evidence against Brian Sandell. The judge ordered the proceedings to be stopped immediately and told both defendants they were free to return to their bail addresses until a resumed hearing could be fixed.

The case has now been going on since both men were arrested last October arising out of a police raid on Mr. Sandell's home in Higham. Initially both men were both remanded to Leicester Prison but, following their fourth court appearance, their bail applications were successful and they were allowed to return to homes of relatives in the area.

Both men have now been brought before the Courts nine times during the last six months, each time being remanded on bail, while the police asked for extra time to try and produce new evidence against them.

But it hasn't attracted the numbers on a regular basis that would make it viable. However, they aren't going out with a whimper, and you are invited to their leaving party on Saturday 6th May 9pm till late. If the present prospective purchasers sign the contract as expected, it will re-open as a straight pub with a victorian atmosphere.

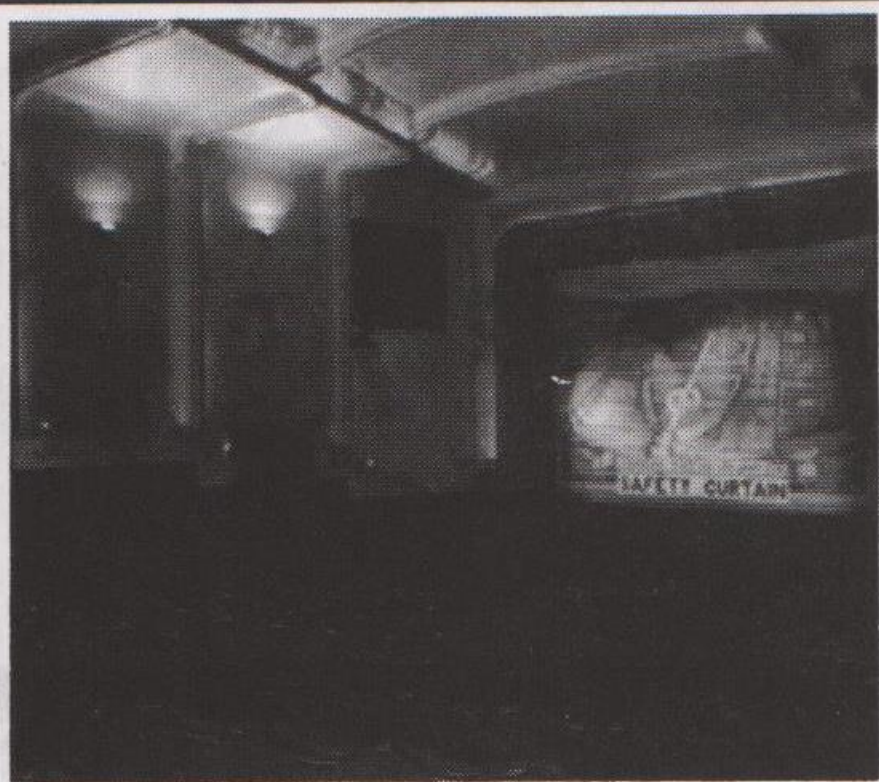

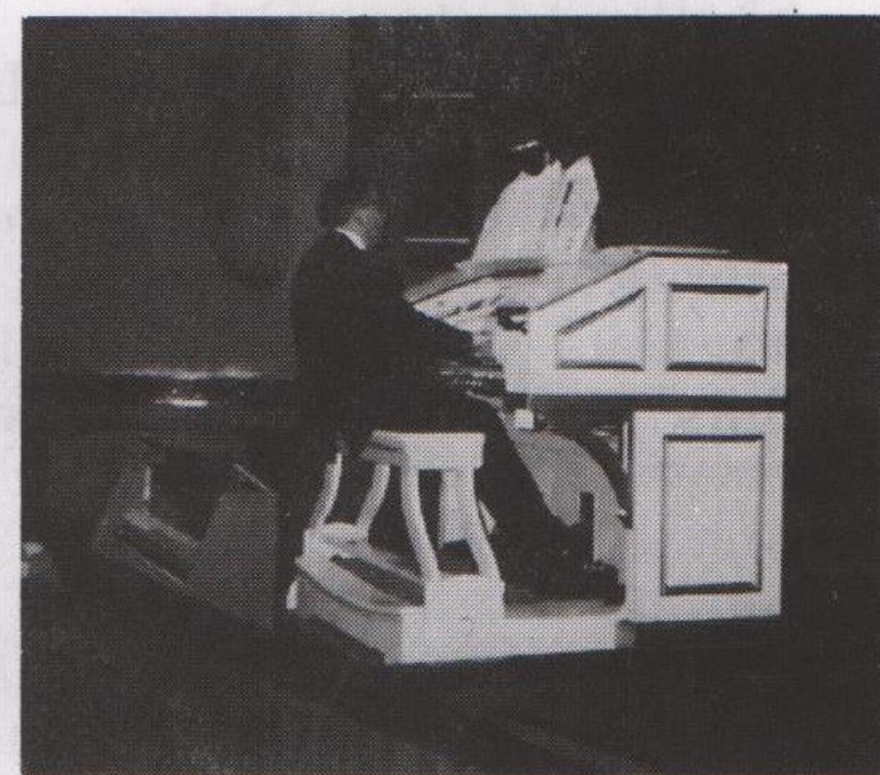
The cinema has recently begun a classic film season. Each screening is accompanied by a performance on the Wurlitzer organ from 7pm.

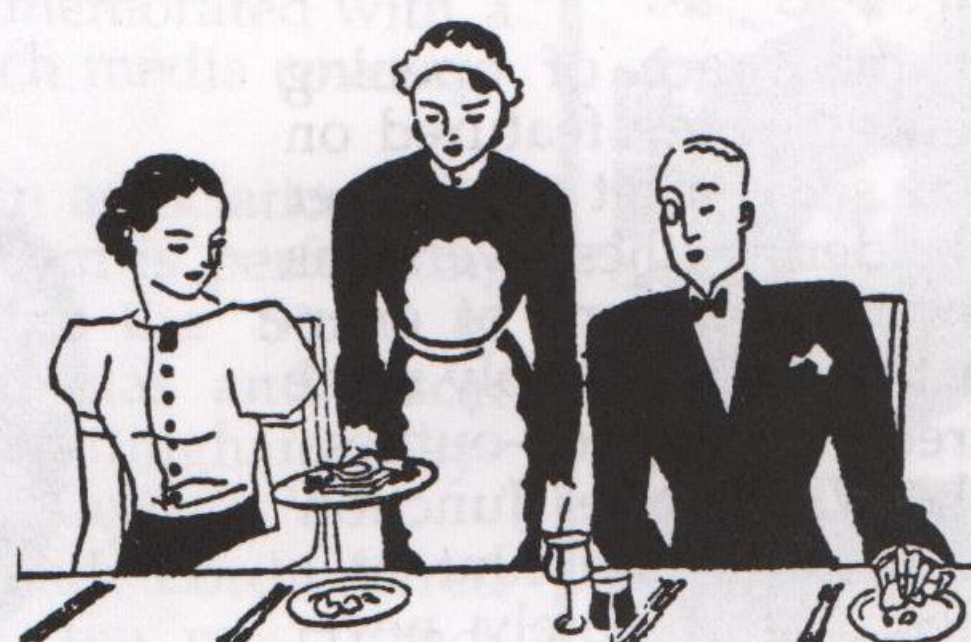
TASTY GOBSMACKERS from Loretta Lard

Well we did go overboard with the G&T's last time, so here's a nice little recipe which won't stretch your pocket. It's called 'wartime bean roast'; and let's face it there's a poverty war on for many these days. So here goes.



8 oz. butter beans, soaked, rinsed and cooked as usual
2 oz. margarine
1 onion, peeled and chopped
4 oz. breadcrumbs
4-6 tablespoons strongly flavoured tomato or curry sauce
Sea salt
Freshly ground black pepper
To finish:
beaten egg and dried crumbs to coat
A little margarine
Serves 4

Preheat the oven to 400F (200C), mark 6. Drain and mash the butter beans, but don't make them too smooth. Melt the margarine in a saucepan and fry the onion for about 10 minutes, until it's soft, then add it to the butter beans, together with the breadcrumbs and enough of the sauce to flavour and bind the mixture; season with sea salt and freshly ground black pepper. Then form the mixture into a roll and dip it first



in beaten egg and then into dried crumbs. Put the roll on to a well-greased baking sheet and dot it with a little extra margarine.

Bake for about 45 minutes in oven, until the roll is browned and crisp. Apple sauce goes well with this roast. It's also a

good idea to serve with a good, tasty sauce, a spicy tomato one or a really well-flavoured gravy, perhaps.

A tea-timely hint

An acquaintance asked me recently for my advice on a little matter of etiquette. 'At tea-time is it necessary to remove both gloves or only the left hand glove, as the left hand is used when eating scones etc?' Well, to avoid those unseemly faux-pas, both gloves should be removed at tea-time.

LOST IN SPACE by Simon Smalley

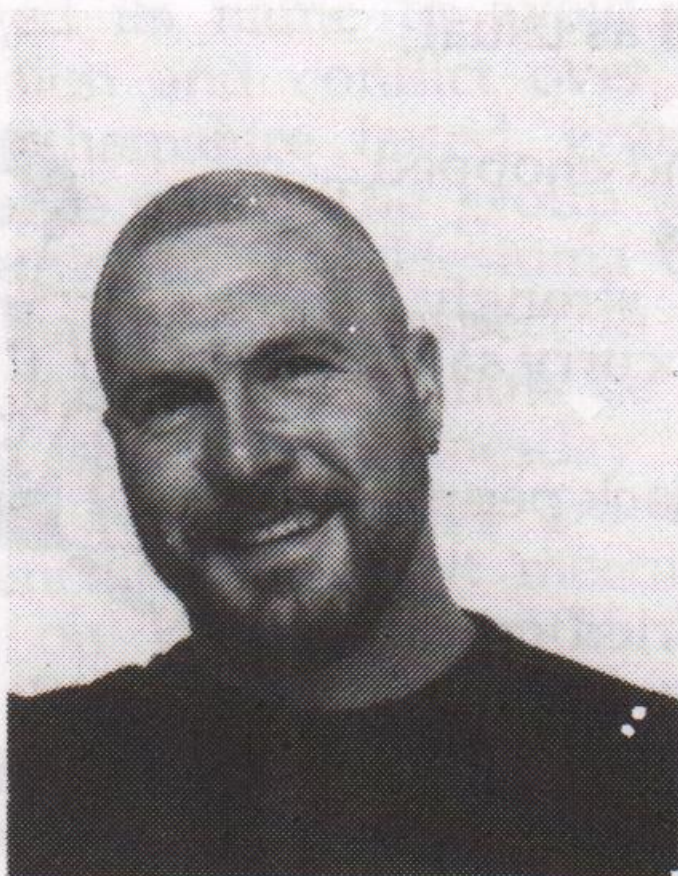
Call me old fashioned, but The Orb, previously namechecked in these pages with a sense of enthusiasm and unbridled admiration have, to my mind, finally gone and blown it by backsliding from the majestic canyon filling rumblings of previous releases to third rate leftovers on their latest album 'Orbus Terrarum'.

The very fact that the brace of opening tracks, 'Valley' and 'Plateau' were featured on the 'Orb Live '93' double set is a bit of a pisser in itself, especially considering these versions are unnecessary studiobound re-runs of energetic live exercises which were noticeably more far-reaching in their freeform wiggled-outness. These titles, along with 'White River Junction' give an initial expectant surge and hint at a pastoral tripiness which unfortunately never materialises, the tracks becoming as boring as being stuck on the M25 on a hot summer's day with no food, no drink and no dru...er...car stereo. The only saving grace of the whole set is 'Oxbow Lakes', a seven-odd minute piano plinker backed with a swathe of sinister sounding percussion & ribcage rattling bass drops.

Although the pain of saying it is akin to enduring a meeting of the Garry Bushell Fan Club, it hurts me to say, O faithful Samplesfan, that Captain of Starship Orb, the good Dr. Alex Patterson has obviously taken one too many trip down the Wobbly Wobbly Way and emerged to find himself stuck firmly up the creative cul-de-sac of his own art school chemical-induced pretentious arsehole. The Emperor's New Clothes indeedy.

UNPLUG THE JUKEBOX

Coincidentally (ahem) released at the same time as a new offering from the 40-something Ms. Ant, a clutch(bag) of his previous hits & misses find UK CD release for the first time. Almost as if to add credence to the track 'Here Comes The



Grump' from 'Friend or Foe' ("When you get a number one, the only way is down") Adam received the true build 'em up, knock 'em down fickle treatment also experienced by other 80's icons including Boy George and Bros. (Who?). However, 1985's 'Vive Le Rock' LP was a sparkling balls in both hands tugging slice of homopunk-cockrock, with the sleeve depicting Adam and his lads as leather-clad Brylcreem-slick pouting scowling bikerdelic thugettes which was reflected in the titles 'Mohair Lockeroom Pin-Up Boys', 'Scorpio Rising', (after the Kenneth Anger film) and 'Miss Thing', which is practically selected sentences plucked from Charles White's 1984 biography

of the gravity-defying quiff queen Little Richard, as Richard and his gay friends in 50's Smalltown USA would greet each other "How you doin', Miss Thing?". Continuing Adam & guitar gangster Marco's tradition of flinging a camp spanner into the works at every drop of a Muir cap, such one-liners as "I've been where I was going and it's not Tom of Finland", "Happy as a punk in Boystown" and "Leather jackets, big packets", results in American Brando biker chic meets the under-the-counter 50's & 60's English homoeroticism of "The Leather Boys".

Pour moi, 'Vive Le Rock' is one of the most cruelly neglected and under rated LP's from the past decade. Although the music press has now relegated Adam Ant from national hero to national joke, there is, as they say, life in the old dog yet. It's a shame no one realised it ten years ago.

FATAL FRIENDSHIP

Fatal Friendship, The story of Lord Alfred Douglas and Oscar Wilde, Written and Directed by Campbell Kay.

May 1995 marks the centenary of the trials of Oscar Wilde. Already this year Wilde's genius as a writer and wit has been celebrated and commemorated with a stained glass window in Poets Corner in Westminster Abbey, much media coverage and an evening devoted to him on BBC2.

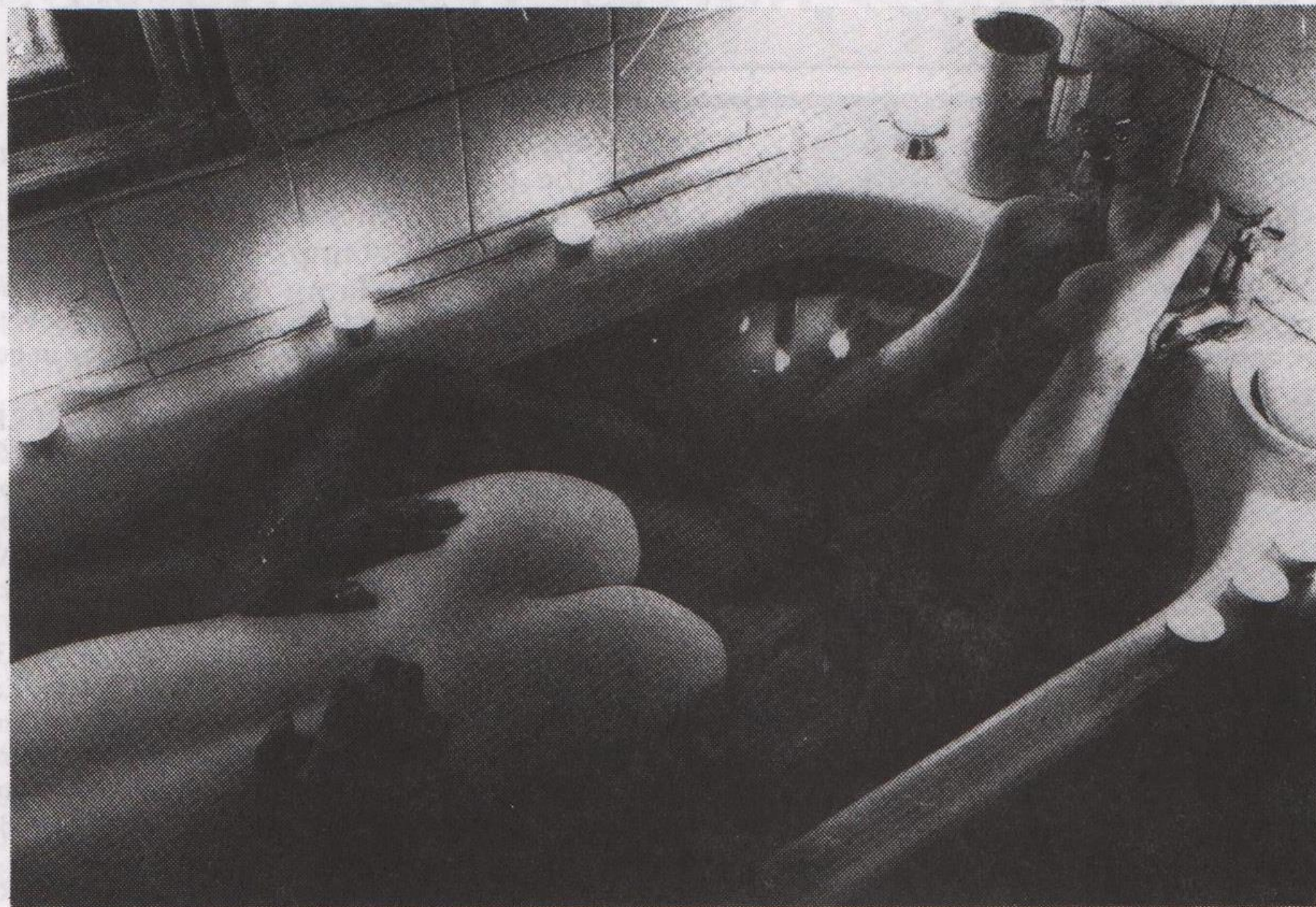

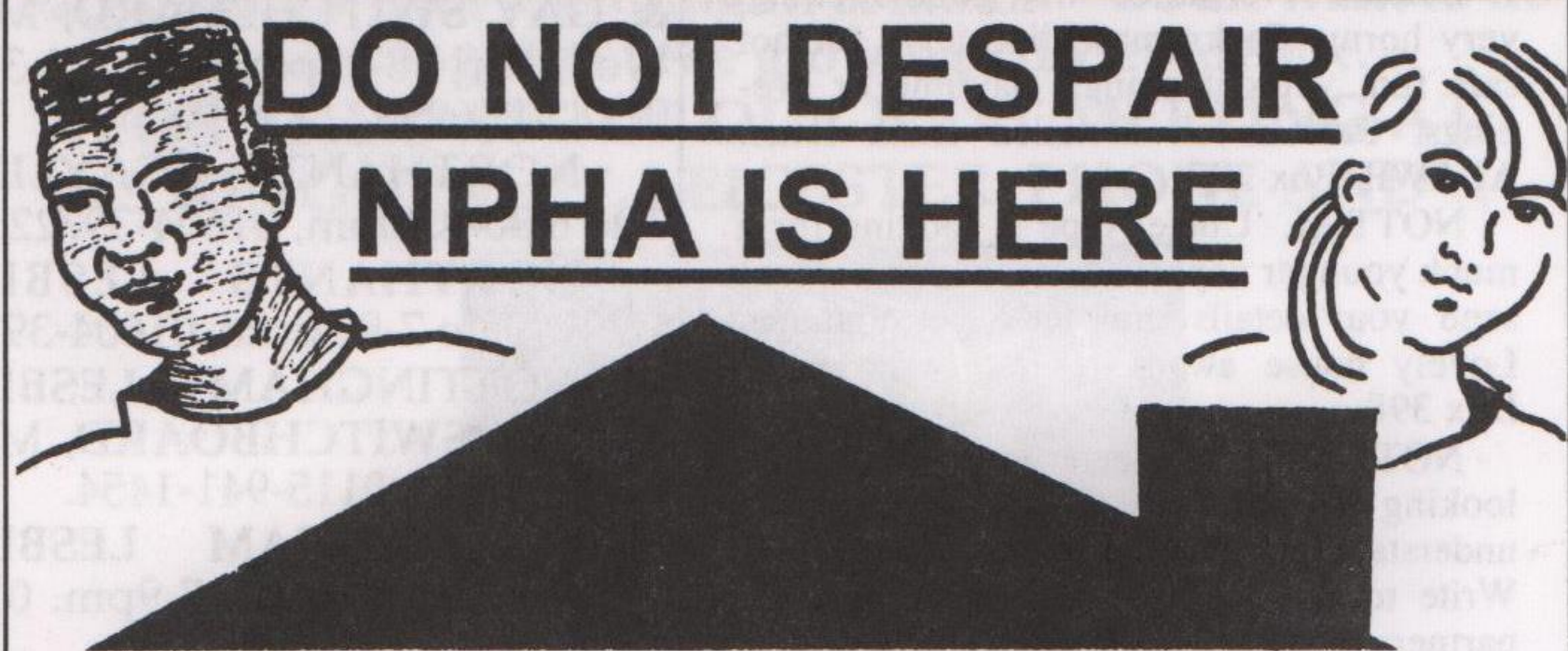

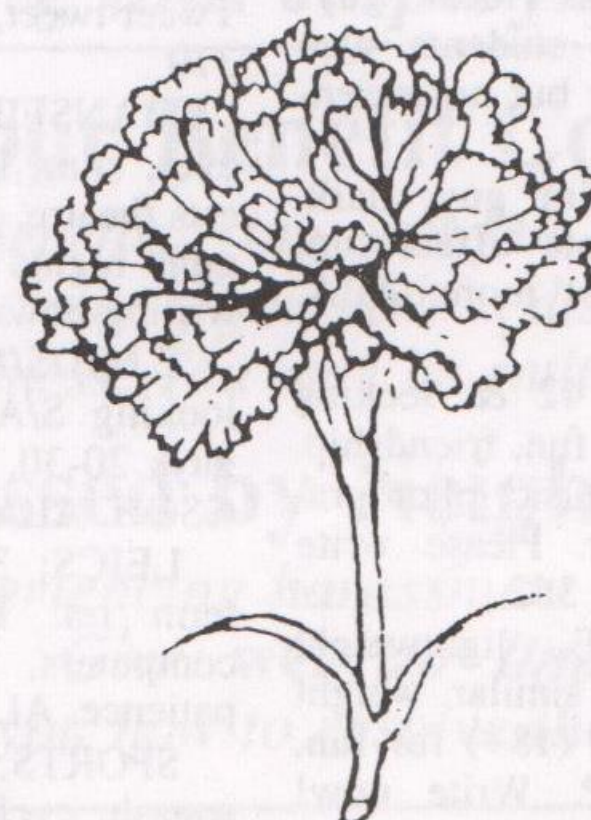
