CENSORS RULE ATTRENT UNIVERSITY



Nottingham Trent University cancelled a council-funded and arts-sponsored production of the show 'Geek' last month. The University chiefs pulled the plug on the Barclays New Stages Festival production of 'The Best of the Bravest', using a get-out clause in the rarely-used Theatres' Act 1937, which allows for cancellation of 'anything deemed obscene or likely to cause disorder'. The ban followed pressure from the Nottingham Evening Post and a readers' poll. The last time this Act was used was in the 1980's when Mary Whitehouse had Richard Eyre's production of "The Romans in Britain" banned.

The University's panicky, eleventh-hour, decision followed a three-day orchestrated campaign to cancel the show waged by the Nottingham Evening Post, This included a telephone poll, which claimed over 80% of those polled wanted the performance banned, because of a 30-second scene where a woman pulled a string of union jacks out of her vagina.

The New Stages Festival 'Best of the Bravest', is supported by both City and County Councils and the ban has been condemned by both council officers and the Chair of the City Council's Leisure Services Committee. Tim Challans, Assistant Director for the Arts at County Hall said: "We are disappointed that (continued on page 8)

The pub is owned by Tetleys Brewery of Leeds. When Outright phoned the Brewery they were unavailable for comment. So be warned Sheffield and try some of the other gay venues in town who will be much more welcoming!

Outburst!

We are printing extracts of a letter written by Mick Wallis, Lecturer in Drama at Loughborough University, to the Vice Chancellor of Nottingham Trent University because it raises a number of important issues.

'Dear Vice Chancellor,

It was with shock and dismay that I learned this morning of the University's decision to cancel tonight's performance of *Geek* at The Powerhouse, which was part of the Barclay's New Stages Season.

Perhaps you could confirm my understanding that the performance was cancelled on the instruction of your Deputy Vice Chancellor, whose attention had been drawn to recent press coverage of the show in the *Nottingham Evening Post*. My further understanding is that the given rationale for the cancellation was fear of transgressing the Licensing Act.

While it is clearly the proper duty of any venue and of public bodies such as yours to uphold the law, the particular circumstances of this case raise very

important questions.

The show in question ran without problem at the ICA, and is scheduled for performance at the Royal Court. It was programmed by Barclay's New Stages, in collaboration withacademic staff within your own institution, East Midlands Arts (of which you are Chair, I believe), and Nottinghamshire County Council. The decision to deny performance facilities for the show was made by a senior academic manager in your institution, without - to my knowledge any attempt at consultation with any of these agencies, internal or

external. This itself would be cause for concern. But the circumstances in which the decision was made are cause for much deeper concern. As you will be aware, the Nottingham Evening Post ran a campaign which linked one moment in the show (a woman producing Union Jack bunting from her vagina) with the failure of Nottingham City Council to fly the Union Jack on VE Day. A phone-in engineered by the newspaper solicited 1,000 calls, 84 per cent of which were in favour of the show being banned. I understand that these were the direct circumstances that caused your University to ban the show.

You must surely be aware that by choosing my medium carefully, I could run a campaign and then a phone-in, by which I could engineer an 80 per cent response calling for the closure of the Nottingham Evening Post. I would not expect you to support its closure. Equally, a seriously right-wing organisation could very conceivably engineer a poll which called for a number of books in your Universi-

ty's Library to be burned. I trust you would expect me to oppose such an action being carried out.

If my understanding of events is correct, then this has been a very bad day for academic freedom, for democracy, and for art. It is appalling to consider that a British University might have responded to populist tub-thumping by a newspaper renowned for its political campaigning in such a kneeierk fashion.

I am writing not only as a member of a disappointed theatre-going public, and not only as someone who holds the traditions of free speech in this country dear - traditions that my parents' generation fought so bravely to maintain. I am also writing as a theatre academic in a neighbouring institution who shares the non-heterosexual orientation of the company who made *Geek*. (I take it that the press hostility to the show had as much to do with this as with anything.)

But if my understanding of the circumstances of its banning is correct, I ask you to do two things: First, consider carefully whether the national

community can afford to have its hardwon liberties thrown so carelessly away. Second, ensure that such a situation never arises again.

PROCEEDS FROM READING

Reading from their work at an Outright! sponsored event on May 4th were novelist Alan Hollinghurst, whose book "The Folding Star" was shortlisted for last year's Booker Prize, and poet and critic Gregory Woods. Net proceeds of £60 from the evening were given to Nottingham's Out House Project.

Alan Hollinghurst, speaking before the reading, admitted to a feeling of 'slight relief' at not winning the major literary prize although he recognised that being on the shortlist, and tipped to win, had generally increased sales and made him a more prominent figure. I wondered whether now being a famous gay man he felt he had a role to play in the debate on sexual politics, especially as Gay Times has recently included him in a list of the two hundred most influential gay men and lesbians. Whilst he was relieved to find his name in the list he said that he could not imagine in what sense he had been influential in the gay community and had never thought it appropriate to speak out on such issues as the age of consent or the outing controversy.

Happy to be described as a 'gay novelist', although he stressed that his novels were about a lot more than gay life, Alan Hollinghurst spoke of being gay as 'the giver' of his fiction and feels it important to write without explanation or apology. Reading from 'The Folding Star' later, he seemed to gain as much enjoyment as did the audience. Here, it was plain to see, was a well justified pride in writing so well on gay

themes.



The Health Column Gay and Bisexual Health Issues

OK, so you've been seeing him a month, six months, a year...whatever! And you think this could be 'the

You've been fucking with condoms for a while now. You love him, you trust him, and you think that

maybe you could give up using them.

If you're going to do this safely, you need to know that neither of you are HIV+. If you're thinking of taking an HIV test, have a chat with a health advisor at your local GUM clinic or phone one of the numerous

AIDS helplines.

It's important that you use condoms until you know and continue to know that neither of you are HIV+. Then, if you're going to ditch condoms you need to be sure that neither of you has unsafe sex with anyone else. You'll have to agree that you either won't have sex with anyone else, or you'll only have safer sex outside the relationship. This needs total and absolute honesty.

If you're both HIV+, it is important that you use condoms to protect you from other sexually transmitted diseases, and possible re-infection of HIV, both of

which could damage your immune system.

if you're feeling pressured by your partner to fuck without condoms, and you don't want to, tell him. It's your body, and you've got a right to say no. Good sex is about choice and consent. A lot to think about maybe, but you, and him and your relationship are worth it, well worth it.

Calamity Takes The Stage



ARE YOU ASIAN OR AFRICAN/CARIBBEAN?



The Switchboard currently runs a helpline and information service staffed by volunteers (see helpline panel). A proportion of the proceeds from this screening will be donated to Switchboard.

A fancy dress contest on the night will take place with a prize for the best dressed. Categories are not


limited to drag.

The service began in 1975, when a Gay Advice Service was set up, and staffed, by Howard Hyman at 33 Mansfield Road. Now at 31a Mansfield Road and with a name change from 'Gay Switchboard' to Lesbian and Gay Switchboard', the service has expanded from one night to five nights with two telephone lines and from one operator to 33. In the last 20 years, over 35,000 calls have been received.

Waiting for Arnaldo

hibiscus flowers overhanging four rocking chairs basking on fades Spanish tiles. The only sounds are hummingbirds and bicycle bells - Fidel Castro bought a million bicycles from China to combat the petrol shortage.

Suddenly an antique yellow Oldsmobile roars up and a crowd of people tumble out, among them a young man with Hispanic features, sunglasses, a black moustache and a



big smile. "Welcome to my house!" he screams. A dog barks. Arnaldo is back from the beach.

Gay life on the socialist island of Cuba is changing. The dark days of police raids and imprisonment appear to be over -the security forces, says Arnaldo, are "turning a blind eye". Castro approved the country's first gay festival last February. "A crowd of us stayed out on the streets and the police tried to disperse us as they used to. But we stayed. They hung around a bit and then left because they could see we weren't causing any trouble," he explains.

Cuba is now providing HIV health care and safe sex education in schools. There's an official department for Sexual Orientation, an advice centre where condoms are freely available, and the first tentative steps are being made to form an organisation for gays and lesbians.

Cuban AIDS patients get star treatment: in many cases they get better care than people with other terminal illnesses. Interferon is produced here and researchers are in the final stages of testing an HIV vaccine. But bereft of Soviet money and blockaded by the USA, Cuban hospitals are bare. Soap is rationed to half a bar a month per person.

Little white bungalows dotted among a grove of coconut trees eight miles from Havana house around 200 people with AIDS. This is one of the capital's two "AIDS Sanatoria". Couples or families are allowed to live together and use community facilities including a theatre, swimming pool and cinema. 26

I'm waiting for Arnaldo. On a hot dusty street in friend here says the annual sanatorium drag show has Havana, I shelter from the blinding sun under scarlet inspired a surge of gay cabaret in Havana. "In the past there were transvestites but they were hidden and secretive. And when this illness came out, gays were condemned. But the sanatorium has turned dressing up into an art."

Also wandering around Havana were "Queers for Cuba" a Californian group who'd come to check out the scene. One of them, a 47 year old African American called "Blackberry", sampled a show. He says glamour must be in the blood: "The acts were great. The whole neighbourhood turned out for this show, they sat on rooftops, families with children, blowing up condoms like balloons....the people roared. They loved it."

"Strawberry and Chocolate" (the Oscar-nominated Cuban film about a gay man and his friendship with a young revolutionary) is now playing all over the island. Williams says it killed a lot of prejudice.

"I think all gays here would agree it was a big step forward. People think we are promiscuous, or evil. The film showed we're not like that, that we know what love is...maybe more so because of what we've suffered through the years."

There is still homophobia - discrimination at work, phone-tapping, insults on the street. A gay poet I met has to



disguise his love poems as heterosexual in order to be published. Arnaldo says there's a long way to go. "We meet on the beach, we have many parties - people rent out their houses for ten pesos for gay parties. But we have a slogan "If you see a gay person smiling, it doesn't mean they're happy". They want to demonstrate their independence so they smile but they're not always happy inside."

people who wanted to see the show will not now be able to do so."

Said City Council Chair of Leisure Services, Ian Maclennan "The war was fought to protect people's rights to both political and artistic freedom. I can think of lots of ways the Union Jack is used that are far more offensive, for example allowing the National Front to use it". However, Cllr. Maclennan was unsuccessful in persuading author Robert Pacitti to compromise by substituting the union flag for something else.

Robert Pacitti objects to the labelling of the act as a 'sex scene' and thinks people should see the work in its entirety before judging it. He said: "Artistic integrity is very important and I am saddened that my work has been picked apart to present an image in isolation which, of course, will then be misunderstood.

Mick Wallis, Lecturer in Drama at Loughborough University said: "It seems to be all too typical of the ways in which the right wing press are running the agendas of public institutions these days". (See 'Outburst', page 2)
