LESBIAN CHALLENGES EMPLOYER THROUGH EUROPEAN COURT

A lesbian couple who sued South West Trains (formerly British Rail) for equal travel and other concessions have had their case referred to the European Court of Justice in Luxembourg for a ruling. Lisa Grant was refused a concessionary travel pass for her partner Jill Percey because they are both women. In a landmark decision, Southampton Industrial Tribunal agreed that this might be sex discrimination.

The tribunal based its decision on the recent important ruling by the European Court of Justice that discrimination against transsexuals counts as sex discrimination (thus giving a wide definition to sex discrimination).

If Lisa Grant is successful immediately lesbians, gay men and bisexuals would be entitled to equal treatment and equal pay - not just in Britain but throughout the European union. The case is expected to take up to two years before Ms. Grant's case is heard.

In the meantime the tribunal's decision paves the way for a whole host of claims by others facing discrimination at work and lesbians and gay men should start their claims now, rather than wait for the Grant decision in two years time.

Any benefits provided to common-law partners of the opposite sex but denied to same-sex partners can now form the basis of an equal pay claim. Benefits worth checking include pensions, health insurance, and free or discount use of employer's services - such as cheap mortgages for people working in banks.

Anyone with an equal pay claim should bring it immediately to ensure that they can claim for any loss suffered between now and the eventual decision. Moreover, anyone who is dismissed for being gay or lesbian can now lodge a claim for sex discrimination. Until now only people who had been with their employers for two years could take a claim for unfair dismissal.

Stonewall has produced a fact sheet to send to anyone interested in bringing a claim in the wake of the tribunal ruling.



Interview

From canvas to hide



Stepping into the entrance hall of The D.C. Tattoo Saloon you are instantly timewarped back to the dusty cow-poke days of the Wild West. Greeted at the door by the amiable grin of proprietor Daz, prime mover in the tattooing world, a firm handshake immediately reassures any virgin to the tattooing experience and negates the preconceived expectation of being confronted by a wobbly handed skin butcher of old. To say that

butcher of old. To say that considerable thought and use of a highly fertile, mature imagination had been employed in the design of the Saloon would be an understatement of the highest

order. The inspiration for the style derives from "Sideshow burlesque western meets a brothel."

An earth-brown velvet curtain cordens off the rear of the premises, immediately invoking a childhood 'what's behind there?' curiosity. I try to sneak a glimpse past the curtain and the ornate 'private' notice into the dark shadows beyond, but am intercepted by Daz who returns bearing mugs of tea. In the saloon the walls are adorned with examples of tattooing over the ages, the essential health authority certificates and what surely must be pride of place, a real ??? skull, horns 'n' all, the eye sockets watching blankly down on the proceedings.

Daz aims to make your tattooing experience a highlight of your life, an Event, so that the hours that are spent beneath the buzzing needle will be as memorable and as lasting as the tattoo itself. He is not endeared with the idea of the straight in-slap it on-straight out school of thinking.

Daz holds a lifelong fascination with tattoos, having had his first needle to skin experience when he was nineteen, the artwork being "the famous swallows", illustrating his personal preference for the old school post-war tattooists such as Jack Ziek. He has an admiration for the traditional designs that are slightly rough around the edges, although this personal taste has no bearing on his own intricate designs or his meticulous ability. He believes tattoos should be unique to the individual



and that serious thought should be applied to the idea, design and the position. "It shouldn't just be Mam and Dad", he says, "You need to discuss the whole thinking process behind the desire to be tattooed which reflects the person's individuality and character." Although most first tattoos are done on the arm, he works on larger expanses such as the back and the chest.

Each item is individually priced and varies with the time spent and pre-tattooing involvement where a client visits, they talk through their ideas, Daz does a mock-up and then goes through any amendments with the customer consultation.

Daz finds that a lot of clients know what they want doing but find that regular tattooists won't do, or are unable to do other than the standard designs. He deals with an appointments only system that distances itself from the Saturday afternoon full waiting room and shout of "Next!" Daz prefers to call his workspace 'the surgery' because unlike a workshop it's clean, sterile and hygienic. He is highly aware of Hepatitis B and HIV infection, so although the decor evokes a century old scenario, the Buffalo Bill atmosphere contrasts noticeably with the sterile high tech equipment.

From his background as an artist working with metal, wood, glass and canvas, Daz finds that using skin is yet another medium with different possibilities. His gay artwork

and imagery (which is far more sexually explicit) appears on a range of items available from Clone Zone outlets, and apart from having approaching exhibitions, some London gay bars have expressed a desire to display his work.

The DC Tattoo Saloon tends to get a high proportion of female customers. Many of them know Daz is gay and that he is therefore removed from the laddish ambience of the high street tattoo parlours. Equally, he has no problems from heterosexual men as, after all, it is the quality of his work and not his sexuality that they are paying for.

The phone rang yet again and as Daz is a busy man, I left him to his next eager client. As he bade me farewell I had the overall impression of an artist who takes extreme pride in his craft, from the smallest detail upwards. I said I'd be riding back down the dusty trail to the DC Tattoo for some more inking the steer skull knew I meant it. (The DC Tattoo Saloon can be reached on 0115 950 6830).


Larking around





Having your say

If successful, local people in one part of Nottingham can look forward to having their say about how council money and resources are deployed next year. A new attempt at community-based consultation has been funded by the City Council to operate in the Hyson Green, Radford and Forest Fields districts. The Partnership Council will be composed of local residents, the business sector, voluntary sector and public bodies.

Lesbians, gay men and bisexual people comprise a significant proportion of the area's population but unless they take part to identify their needs they will be ignored.

Local city-wide consultation has taken place over the years in an attempt to encourage local residents to participate. These meetings were run by council officers, and chaired by leading Councillors, and though some useful changes came from them, the spirit of real consultation was often absent, being little more than a public relations exercise.

Development Worker, Christina Ashworth said it was important to have honest consultation so that people can stand as equals with each other. "What people want stems from their own personal experience of life, and they need to be able to share in the belief that positive change is possible," she added.

If you live in the area and want to find out more, you could start by attending one of several public meetings in the area which take place through September and October. To find out more phone Christina on 0115 970 8200.

Amsterdam - the city never sleeps



You can't move because of all the prostitutes. You can't move because of all the drug pushers. You can't move for all the people out of it on drugs. It's full of homosexuals all eager to pounce on you. Trannies and grannies parade in rubber and lycra. Peddlers push porn from video shops where King Dong sits next to King Kong. Amsterdam. A den of sleaze, disease and desire.

Well, that's the popular image portrayed by those who profess to be in the know. As a more than frequent visitor to Amsterdam for some years now, and particularly after reading a reputation-damaging article in an issue of Gay Times a while back, I thought it was about time the scores were evened.

Certainly, a laid back atmosphere prevails in a city that never seems to recognise the clock hands pointing at 4am. For such a constantly full city, even at that early hour, the only street trouble (which is highly infrequent) appears to be caused by visitors, particularly the British, who carry their tanked-up traditions over the waters and stumble through the streets of the red light district unintentionally yelling their sexual inadequacies as they giggle at the displayed porn paraphenalia and sniggering at the Tom of Finland men coming in and out of the Warmosstraat leather bars.

Amsterdam is a city where at 5am on a Sunday morning there are still dozens of people around, not just gay, dropouts and young people, but couples of all ages, not clad in rubber and leather, but suits & ties, casual gear, walking or cycling home.

The big misconception about Amsterdam is that it is a city fuelled by green leafery. It's not all dope, dope and more dope. It's there if you want it, but for all of the coffee shops that sell and welcome the use of it, there are an equal - if not more - number of establishments that will steadfastly

not tolerate the practice. Dope-Free zones in other words.

The city is a beautiful place in any season, in spring the canals are lined with the vibrant greenery of the trees and the autumn and winter frosts transform the city into the skating scene from Disney's 'Fantasia' (sorry, I slipped into Judith Chalmers mode there). With the lack of hills it's so easy for the sauntering explorer to get around on by foot or cycle and a healthy splash of street life; buskers and artists, not just 'spare us some change, mate' but travellers worldwide with an innovative and unique array of performances.

Whatever your gay scene is, you can find it in Amsterdam. from pretty boy/girl disco dollies preening and posing in the latest designer label clothes where the reek of expensive aftershave equals the heady poppers buzz from the backrooms of the leather bars, across the board to whooping it up in traditional Dutch singalong style, to easy-pace bars.

Certainly the air of sexual freedom entices the mass of gay visitors there. It's so easy to nip over for a weekend but a tip for the first time visitor: leave your hangups, paranoia, guilt and repression that goes with the majority of the UK scene behind with your housekeys.



but it is very entertaining. It suffered in Edinburgh from being performed at too small avenue. When all eight cast members are singing at full pelt the sound does tend to storm over your head.

A gay man has been killed in a queer -bashing event. Some media reaction is homophobic. In a fairly small English town a group of friends meet at 'the pub' and decide to form a group and then make a public stand in a way that will embarrass the guilty. This inspires some of the group and turns off one professional man, who makes a speech and then exits. They throw up many amusing possible names for themselves, before deciding on 'Q.U.E.E.R' - Queers using

Entertainment to End Repression. A group with that name could be very useful.

This play needs more space, and perhaps needs to be extended, so that we learn more about what makes certain characters - such as the American - tick. Short incidents involving only 2 or 3 characters that tell us more about them would be useful. And why is the barmaid silent? What does she think of the proceedings? But this play is pointing in a healthy direction, and I hope it prospers.

For the rest of my stay I must try to look beyond the Anglo-American zone. That way, I'm sure, lie fresh joys and insights.

Toxic Shock Syndrome

In 1994, three women died as a known result of the tampon-linked disease Toxic Shock Syndrome (TSS).

TSS is rare but extremely dangerous. Beginning with flu-like symptoms it can progress into major organ failure in as little as eight to twelve hours. Although exact figures are hard to come by, it's estimated that it is responsible for two to four deaths per year in this country and approximately thirty serious cases. The precise cause of TSS is not known, but since high absorbency tampons are more likely to produce TSS, it is probable that the trigger for toxin production is man-made fibres such as rayon. The toxins may quickly overwhelm the immune system. Although it is possible to make a full recovery, survivors may suffer blindness, deafness, arthritis, memory loss, kidney and liver failure.

In 1992, £88.2 million worth of tampons were sold in the UK, but despite warnings about TSS being placed on tampon packaging by the end of '93, there is no regulated size for this labelling. Britain, unlike many other countries has no safety standard for tampons.

Publicity and information regarding TSS is almost non-existent, so initial symptoms are frequently misunderstood. Symptoms usually begin after the start of a period and include headaches, sore throats, muscular aches, vomiting, watery diarrhoea, high temperatures, low blood pressure, confusion and diziness, and a sunburn-like rash, although only one or two of these symptoms may occur.

If you experience any of these symptoms, remove the tampon immediately and seek medical attention. Tell the doctor that you are menstruating and have used a tampon. Many women may experience a mild form of toxic shock without realising what is causing it. Foreign same-sex partners of UKlovers are being advised by Stonewall immigration Group to avoid marriages of convenience. These can lead to prosecution, being exploited and at worst, deportation. "We have had 15 successful applications in a year for same sex partnerships, and no failures," says Stonewall's Mark Watson. "In the past, many couples have only found out about the group's existence after things started to go wrong". The advice is: apply for a foreign partner to stay on the basis of the relationship. Mark adds: "It is essential that lesbians and gay men are aware that there is something they can do to stay together without risking the consequences of breaking the law." The above



SILVIA BREAKS RANK

Queen Silvia of Sweden is hosting the first ever international conference on pornography in Stockholm this month, but she also broke an unwritten rule in the Swedish constitution that the royal family should not be outspoken about anything at all.

In a hard-hitting TV interview the 50-year old queen spoke eloquently of the horrors of child pornography, saying she had forced herself to watch one of the films impounded by police and that it had made her weep. "It is

torture of the worst kind, the worst thing I had ever seen". She urged politicians to stop dragging their feet over banning the possession of such material.

Western men are conspicuous as the patrons of a trade in young boys, most of them forced onto the streets by poverty or shattered homes. They survive any way they can, from begging to picking over rubbish and frelancing as prostitutes catering to the French, British, German and Australian men who seem to provide most of the business in South East Asia.

In November Australian courts will hear the case against John Holloway, one of the country's most able and experienced ambassadors, charged with abusing under-age youths after a federal police investigation. Asian countries including the Philippines are slowly beginning to invoke laws against child molesters and in one recent arrest another Australian man was found with several hundred photographs he had taken of children, including one of an eight year old girl weeping as she was forced to perform oral sex. He received a custodial sentence of two and a half years.
