The publication of the Government's White Paper, New Training Initiative:

a Programme for Action, heralds the imminent massive expansion of "training" schemes for increasing numbers of unemployed young people. While issues such as the level of trainee allowance, compulsory or voluntary entry, remain unresolved at present, there is a measure of agreement over the nature and aims of this additional period of training.

The schemes set out to train the young for the needs of industry in such social and life "skills" as "flexibility, responsibility, respect for authority, adjustment and adaptation". The White Paper


at its most blunt states that the new scheme will "aim to equip young people to adapt successfully to the demands of employment".

This new package is more about containment, conformity and reducing the unemployment statistics than offering policies to provide meaningful work opportunities for all over 16's.




Are young people on YOP and WEEP schemes being abused, or is that just a reactionary statement as some would have us believe?

- 1). Evidence suggests that 35% of Employers regard WEEP entrants as an extra pair of hands.
- 2). All work experience programmes are supposed to involve induction, day release and counselling but, according to a survey in summer 1979, only 13% of WEEP trainees were receiving off-the-job training.

- 4). There is reason to suspect that these schemes are affect-ing the availability of apprenticeships, the numbers of these have fallen to half the 1968 provision.

He goes on to state thatthose who benefit from training contribute to its costs

The Document also statesthat due to the lack of training 'many peopleare less productive and derive less satisfaction and reward from their workthan they might! but your productivity benefits them before it does you: 7% of the population have got 84% of the loot- earned through your productivity!

The training bias; 'It's one thing to train them, (but) there is absolutely no guarantee of a job at the endof it'.




Tories hate people who are not pulling their weight- thats why YOP and Dole rates are low, and you are made to feel like 2nd class citizens by society (which they run).
