



## SHARON DUMPED KINNOCK Gay Group freezes Labour Party donation



'abnormal' (The Sun) or

'handicapped' (The Archbishop of Canterbury) or of being forgotten about altogether? There are lots of anti-gay bigots out there who are waiting for you to give them some stick. It's time to Bite Back. ♦ On April 11 The Sun's editorial told 12 million readers that gay sex is 'abnormal' and though 'the term Gay Plague upsets some people, that effectively is exactly what it is' After all, the majority of people with AIDS in Britain are gay, so it must be a gay plague, mustn't it? If this logic gives you a problem, join me in giving Sun Editor Kelvin McKenzie a ring - at 6pm on 15th May. The number is 01 481 4100. Archbishop Runcie had some nice things to say about gays in an interview in The Times. He's met 'homosexual couples' who offer 'simple human generosity, hospitality, artistic achievement and flair'. But, he continues: 'the action itself is sinful when it's against a Christian moral teaching based on the Bible' and 'they seem to do that out of what to me is a moral handicap'. So, all you morally handicapped sinners, how about dropping Dr Runcie a line (and a few tips on grammar) at Lambeth Palace, London SE17JU You should really address it to: The Most Reverend and Right Honourable Lord Archbishop of Canterbury. But you may not feel like it. His phone number is 01 928 8282. Duncie Runcie concludes, you'll be happy to hear: 'But then we learn to cherish the good things that come out of the handicapped' Neil Kinnock is a bit more shy with his views. Last year's Labour Party Conference voted - by a 79% majority - to order the Leadership to set up a committee to campaign on lesbian and gay issues. But Labour Party leaders have been just too busy to get round to it. Perhaps Neil has forgotten. So let's remind him. Letters to House of Commons, SW1A 0AA. The same **Conference told Labour Councils** 'to support, financially and otherwise, special lesbian and gay phonelines, centres and youth groups'. # MEN AT WORK-BEN TALKING

Ben Benson was Nottingham City Council's Gay Rights worker for nearly two years until his departure for London last month. In this interview with LAURENCE de SOUZA, Ben looks back over the two years at some of the problems of being an 'out' worker in Notitngham.

	Was Nottingham what you expected it to be in terms of an authority outside  London?  Nottingham Council gives out conflicting and confusing messages. On the one hand there is this progressive policy about lesbian and gay issues; on another level the Council wont follow through its paper policies with any political or any limited cash support.  Have you encountered any resistence to equal opportunities policies generally from chief officers and heads of departments?  I think chief officers are like a lot of council officers who tell you how absolutely dedicated they are to equal opportunities but that's really a smokescreen. In fact they use arguments in support of equal opportunities against the interests of the very groups which equal opportunities seeks to advantage. It's very clear with issues around harrassment; quite a lot of straight officers are claiming they are harrassed because they have to deal with papers relating to gay

There were quite a few controversial issues which occurred during your stay in Nottngham - one was the Safe Sex leaflet of the Terrence Higgins Trust which was circulated with Council papers. How do you think that was dealt with generally by the Labour Group on the Council?

If there had been more understanding and support from the Labour Group, there would have been a very clear indication that this is the sort of sex literature that needs to go out to gay men to enable us to protect our lives and of those we love. The fact that those initiatives are now being followed up by central government a year later shows that the Labour Group had a lack of political foresight at the time.

How was the job when you arrived? I thought there would have been much more agreement in the gay community about what the job would involve. People had been campaigning around

getting a gay rights worker on the council as I had in London, but they hadn't exactly thought out what they wanted me to do once in the job. Did you get any opposition from other workers?

job could be summarised as someone who is paid to be 'Out'. Quite a lot of people just weren't expecting to have to deal with someone representing other gay men. They had to stop making lavatory jokes about gay men and actually had to deal with one face to face in a responsible and professional way. This was a shock for them. Over the period of time the jokes lessened, yet I still feel that people didn't treat me as they treat other officers of comparable rank. I'm seen as a little upstart and not someone who is capable of doing a good job.

Quite often the attention my reports or the committee agendas got was far less than that of other officers.

If a black gay man came to the equal opportunities unit who would he be referred to in the first place?

It would be up to the person themselves to choose which worker was most useful for dealing with the particular case he was bringing to the unit. It would depend on whether he saw it as mainly a black issue or primarily a gay issue.


Do you think there was an expectation that you would turn up for work in a frock?
