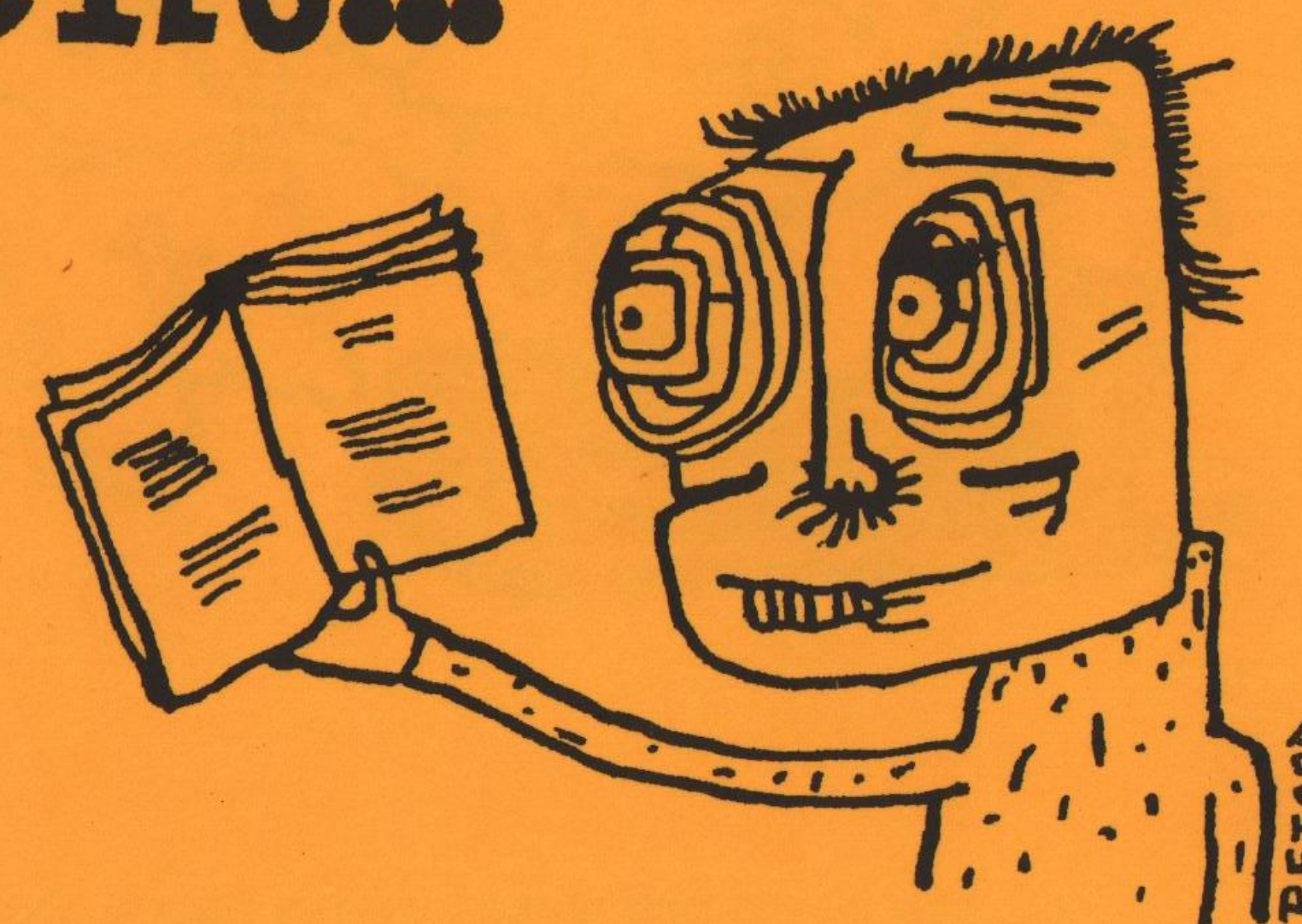

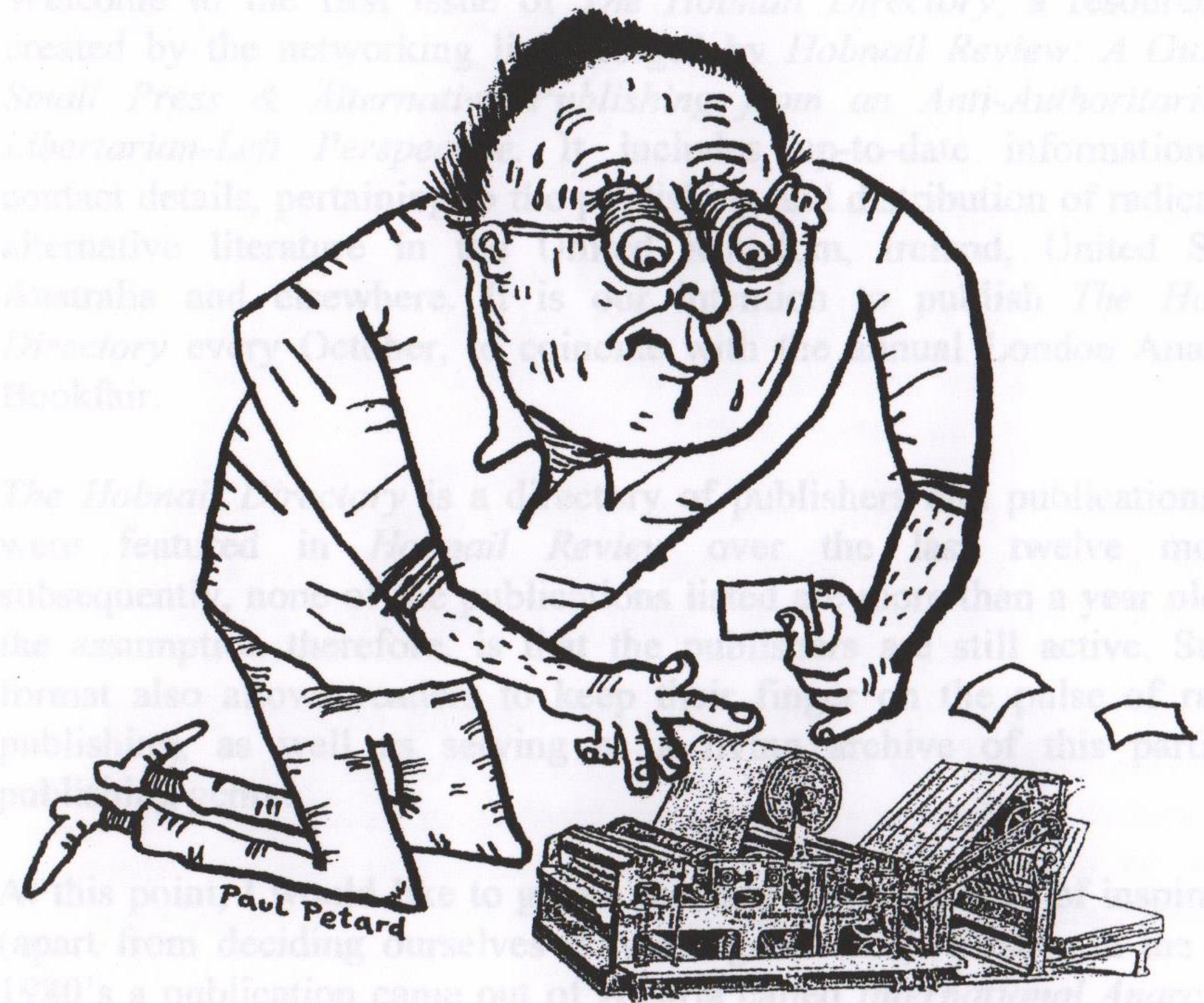

THE HOBNAIL DIRECTORY

Welcome to the first issue of *The Hobnail Directory*, a resource tool created by the networking links forged by *Hobnail Review: A Guide to Small Press & Alternative Publishing from an Anti-Authoritarian & Libertarian-Left Perspective*. It includes up-to-date information and contact details, pertaining to the publishing and distribution of radical and alternative literature in the United Kingdom, Ireland, United States, Australia and elsewhere. It is our intention to publish *The Hobnail Directory* every October, to coincide with the annual London Anarchist Bookfair.

The Hobnail Directory is a directory of publishers and publications that were featured in *Hobnail Review* over the last twelve months; subsequently, none of the publications listed are more than a year old and the assumption therefore, is that the publishers are still active. Such a format also allows readers to keep their finger on the pulse of radical publishing, as well as serving as a living archive of this particular publishing genre.

At this point, I would like to give a mention to our sources of inspiration, (apart from deciding ourselves it was a good idea): Firstly, in the early 1980's a publication came out of Austria called *International Anarchistic Address Book*, which listed anarchist groups and publications from around the world; not only in English, but German, Spanish, Italian, Danish, Dutch, Norwegian and Swedish. Each group wrote their bit in their own language - great if you are multi-lingual - but otherwise not much use. Secondly, there was Phoenix Press, who, in the 1990's, published the *Anarchist Year Book*. The *Anarchist Year Book* listed current organisations, periodicals and new titles. Then lastly, there was of course, *The Anarchist Yellow Pages*, published in 2004 in Canada. At the moment Hobnail Press cannot hope to emulate the 460 listings from the *International Anarchistic Address Book* or the 2000 listings in the *Yellow Pages* (In both cases, of course, not all listings are publications).

In the tradition of annual reviews/reports, as is customary, we treat you to a few dull statistics: In the 9 issues published since October 2006, *Hobnail Review* has featured, 167 periodicals and 51 booklets and pamphlets from 75 different publishers and organisations; profiles on 12 current publishers and projects and 6 articles of historical interest, as well as numerous reports, news and assorted trivia. From our observations, I think it would be fair to say, that alternative publishing of our particular genre, is pretty healthy, if not verging on the prolific; bearing in mind that we catch only a moderate percentage of everything published and that's only in the English speaking world. (Incidentally, foreign language publications are welcome!).

Looking at our own publishing ventures, *Hobnail Review* aside, we also managed to put out six pamphlets since November 2006. That's a grand total of 21 since 2003, all of which are listed in *The Hobnail Directory*.

At this point we would like to reiterate our ongoing editorial appeal - *Hobnail Review* depends on the support of Editors, Publishers and readers alike to continue publishing - so keep on sending in your publications; information on what you are doing, new developments in your publishing projects and information on resources and services etc.

Hope you enjoy our humble contribution to the cut-and-thrust world of publishing in general, and our celebration of the enduring nature of radical and alternative publishing.
