POLICE VENDETTA ON GAYS



Reports have been coming in over the last few weeks of large numbers of arrests in lavatories around the city with the main focus of activity in Theatre Square cottage Nottingham, with up to 40 gay men arrested in a week, as well as a number of arrests in Trinity Square cottage. Witnesses confirm men being seen frogmarched away by police.

OUTRIGHT has obtained information from a number of independent witnesses and sources within the Police itself which confirms that a crackdown has been mounted. Council employees were told of a three month 'clean up' operation which began in September.

Recently, the glass-walled attendant's cubicle in Theatre Royal Cottage has been covered with brown paper, leaving only a black peephole visible from the inside.


One witness says: "I went in to the cottage there two weeks" ago. There were two men standing at the top of the steps as I went in. When I came out I decided to follow one of the men. He went down King Street, and out of sight of cottage, pulled out a radio."

Several other witnesses have independently testified to OUT-RIGHT. One said: "I saw two police in plain clothes come hurriedly out of the attendant's room, it was previously darkened. One stood in the disabled toilet tying a shoe lace, a note was passed to him under the door. He told the punter not to flush the chain and to open the door".

A further witness takes up the story: "Two men were lounging around the sinks trying to blend into the furniture. I thought at first they were rent boys. Suddenly the door of the attendant's room opened from the inside and two men came out and made for a cubicle. I went to wash my hands. There was a light in the room and I could see a low table with a list of names, some checked off."

A friendly police officer confirmed that the Theatre Royal management had given the police permission to watch the lavatories from the Dress Circle Bar and Foyer. (continued on page 3)

BRITANNIA WAIVES THE RULES?



Three bar staff were sacked from a Nottingham pub recently because, it is claimed, they 'appeared' to be gay. The allegations were made by Kevin Doran (pictured), Manager of the Britannia Inn, Huntingdon Street, who claims he was told to sack three members of his staff. One of them was a gay friend, another a lesbian friend and the third, his brother who is not

"I was so angry, but the only reason I didn't leave the job then was because I had organised a charity night to send a twelve year-old Leukaemia sufferer to Disneyworld and I wanted this to go ahead. However I told the Director of my company, Tenancy Services that I was also gay and what I thought of their attitude. They agreed I could continue with the benefit". Kevin claims that when he turned up on the night two of the Directors were present and one of

them, Colin Chamberlain said "I'm not having any more queers in this pub". Outright contacted Scottish & Newcastle Breweries and spoke to Area Manager Tony Mee, who said he couldn't comment. Later Ms. Jo Hutchinson, Marketing Manager phoned Outright and said that they had no jurisdiction over decisions taken by Tenancy Services as they leased the premises to them. (continued on page 2)

Outright spoke to Colin Chamberlain who claimed the trouble had arisen because Mr. Doran had left the premises with one barwoman in charge at 9pm and while he was away £300 was snatched from a till. "We offered to retain Mr. Doran on the staff but with the addition of a co-Manager but he refused this offer" he said. He also denied being abusive to Mr. Doran. Meanwhile the Britannia Inn is closed and awaiting a new Tenant.








Unmarked police vans also park by the stage door of the Theatre Royal and in the Royal Centre layby in North Sherwood Street.

Several other witnesses claim to have seen police operating in pairs, carting off men from the Theatre Square and Trinity Square toilets over a number of weeks.

The Assistant Chief Constable Culley, who was responsible for the Anti-Vice Squad retired in August, but before he left sources confirm that he went on record as saying that only uniformed officers should raid cottages, and only

RECORD ROUNDUP

Owner of one of the sophisticatedly smooth voices to come to prominence in the mid-70s, soulful crooner Al Green has a greatest hits collection out at the moment. Although highly esteemed 20 years ago he is now not held in such high regard commercially as his contemporaries James Brown, Geno Washington et al. It's easy to see how the nouveau white slick soulsters (come in, Mick Hucknall) were inspired by such a classy, laidback approach. Turn out the lights and turn it up.

Still on the subject of prestigious vocal talent, in the racks now is a delicious double CD set charting the course of swoonsome-toned quintet The Platters. Unfortunately only noted by many of their obvious biggies 'Smoke Gets in Your Eyes' and 'Only You', this release gathers together the commercial top-end of their extensive career. Along with the likes of Nat 'King' Cole and Ella Fitzgerald, you just don't get such vocal purity of this calibre any more. Angelic harmonies and cascading string arrangements make this a joy to hear.

Ever improving with age, the B-52s have more good stuff out shortly in the form of 'Is That You, Mo-Dean?', the third release from their latest album. Given the subject matter (UFO encounters) the video should be a wow to see. The CD single comes in a limited edition hologram sleeve. Astral projection indeed.

Chucked out of the band "Dignity" for being crap, chart-topping warbler Tasmin Archer certainly has shown 'em, hasn't she, pop pickers. I remember meeting Tas (as close friends call her) at the record company shindig to launch her soon-to-be number one single. There were many sceptics there rattling on about does the weird, wild world of pop really need another Tracy Armatrading Joan Chapman, but the quality of ...er what's her name's work showed through. Rapidly rushed out to capitalise on the single's success, Tassie's offering will rank alongside other fave females's first forays into popdom.

What happened? I'll tell you what happened. As a companion to the excellent tapes of the 'Round the Horne' radio series, some bona ohme at the Beeb has compiled the Jules & Sandy sketches onto a bijou double cassette collectionette for your delight, heartface. Two dozen priceless classics of polari-spouting campness including 'Bona Seances', 'Keep Britain Bona', 'Bona Bijou Tourettes' and 'Le Casserole de Bona Gourmet' (and that is yer actual French). Essentially fantabulosa. And that's yer lot. Ta Ra!

BACK TO THE DRAWING BOARD

Michael Cashman appears in a major new version of Christopher Marlowe's compelling tale, 'Dr. Faustus' the story of a man who sells his soul to the devil. Many will remember Michael as gay graphic designer Colin in 'East Enders'. "Once you leave a long-running soap" says Michael "you have to hone your career, and rebuild it to change your employer's perception of what you can do otherwise you're forever typecast". But that was sometime ago and Michael has moved full circle. Richard McCance caught up with him between rehearsals at Nottingham Playhouse to find out that he is more than pleased to be celebrating another gay man's work. Indeed, Marlowe helped launch Ian McKellen on his career in 'Edward II' not so many years ago.

His eyes light up as he enthuses about 'Dr. Faustus'. "It will excite your eyes, tastebuds and combine elements of Speilberg, the classics and Francis Bacon with a very strong cast".

But Michael the actor and Michael the campaigner are indivisible. Michael is a self-styled "establishment socialist" who, with Ian McKellen, founded the Stonewall Group, the lesbian and gay rights campaing organisation. Michael believes that pressure on the government needs to come from all sides and therefore Outrage! and ActUp are equally important.

He was born in the East End, when it was definitely not fashionable, and unlike some, he regards his roots as important. "My mother was a cleaner and my father a docker. They had to fight for their rights and I have never forgotten that". On the day we spoke, the news of the pit closures was announced and he had plenty to say about that. "It's obscene to be shedding all these jobs as if it had nothing to do with the individuals involved. If all the Notts miners had stuck together they would be in a stronger bargaining position than they are now".

Michael appears as Mephistophilis at Nottingham Playhouse until the 28th November. His next television appearance is in 'Casualty' some time in January 1993.


