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## HOMOPHOBIC BID FAILS

A Leicestershire County Councillor who recently came out as gay, narrowly survived moves to deselect him as a candidate for the forthcoming Council elections in Beaumont Leys Ward, Leicester.

Earlier this year Cllr. Eykelbosch came out publicly as gay, when statements were read out to the three main parties at County Hall. In them Cllr. Eykelbosch declared he was gay but that his private life was his own. There was a Sun expose in October over an alleged association with a teenager whom he was helping to re-house. The councillor who is in his forties, recently separated from his wife and two children.

The Chair of Beaumont Leys Ward Conservative Party, Peter Bromley said: "we owe it to the electorate and the party to ensure we put up appropriate candidates in all wards".

Cllr. Eykelbosch said "I don't understand why this motion was being put as the branch has been kept fully aware of any developments in my personal circumstances or lack of them. I'm not sure what has changed since I was re-confirmed as the candidate for next year's County Council elections." The

Conservatives need to win this seat if they are to take overall control of the Council which is currently hung.

Meanwhile Outright has spoken to several councillors in both Liberal and Labour parties as well as his own party and it would seem that Cllr. Eykelbosch is a respected member of the County Council, whose personal standing has been enhanced since his decision to come out as a gay man. Meanwhile, he could still be deselected by the executive of the West Leicestershire Conservative Party who meet shortly.

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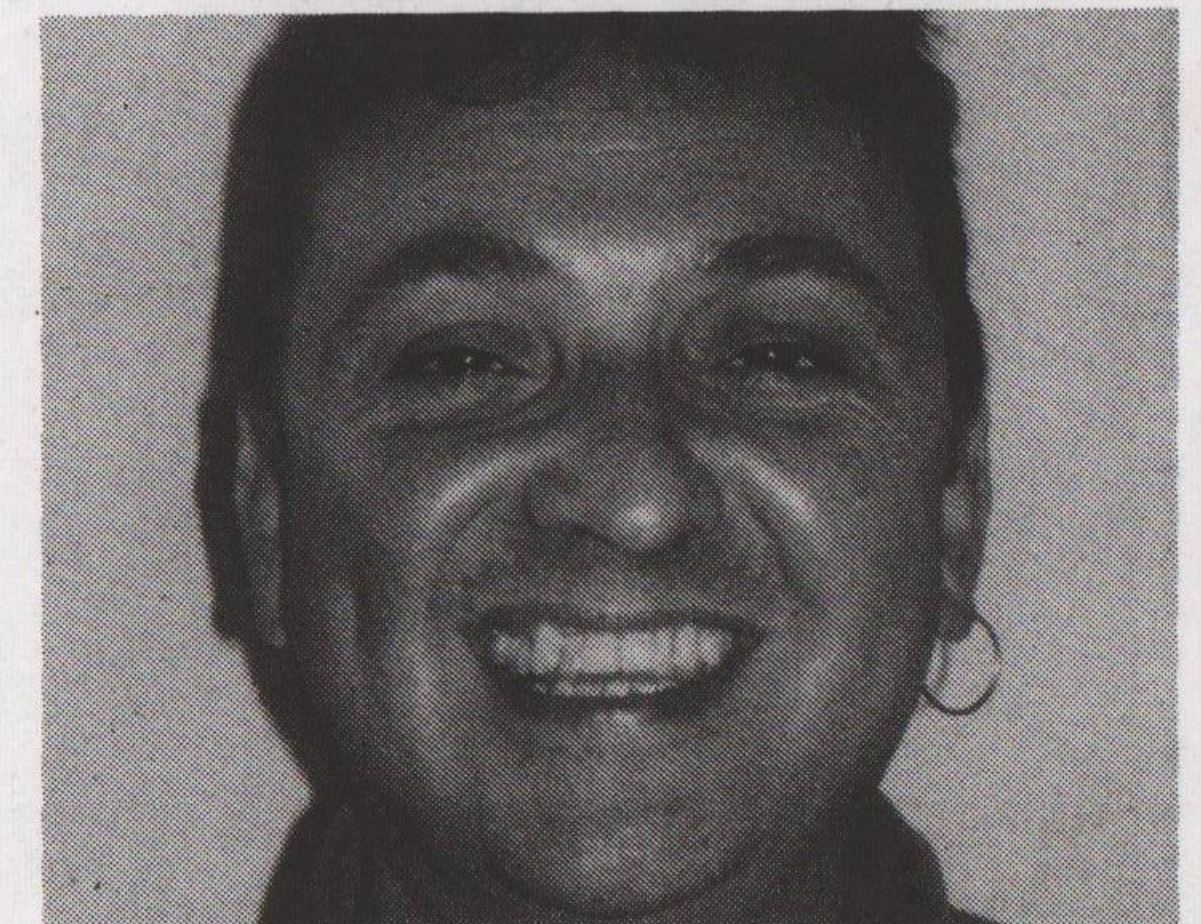

## FIRST FOR UNION



The Town Hall union NALGO becomes the first trade union in this country to appoint a full time paid officer at headquarters with responsibility for lesbian and gay rights. Kursad Kharamanoglu, former chair of NALGO's Black Self Organised Group was appointed to the post last month. A long time activist in lesbian and gay politics, he said that lesbians and gays had not yet managed to turn ourselves into a political force in this country. "Out of all the self-organized groups we are the last to have a paid official to look after our interests."

The re-emergence of fascism and racist killings in Europe, particularly in Germany, was a strong reason for making links with anti-racist organisations both in this country and in Europe and Kursad welcomed the union's strengthening links with these organisations.

## WATCH OUT! THERE'S A COP ABOUT!

Following last month's Outright report 'Police Vendetta on Gays' we received a number of reports, which add up to a growing dossier on police entrapment. In particular, we can reveal that, despite denials by Inspector David Dawson of the Nottingham Anti-Vice Squad that "entrapment went out in the early 80's", at the time he made this statement to us, his officers were busily crouching in cupboards, jumping out and securing convictions using these methods. We have first hand evidence from several people, currently awaiting court appearances for 'entrapment style' convictions. (See page 2 for a guide to your rights by a local Solicitor.) 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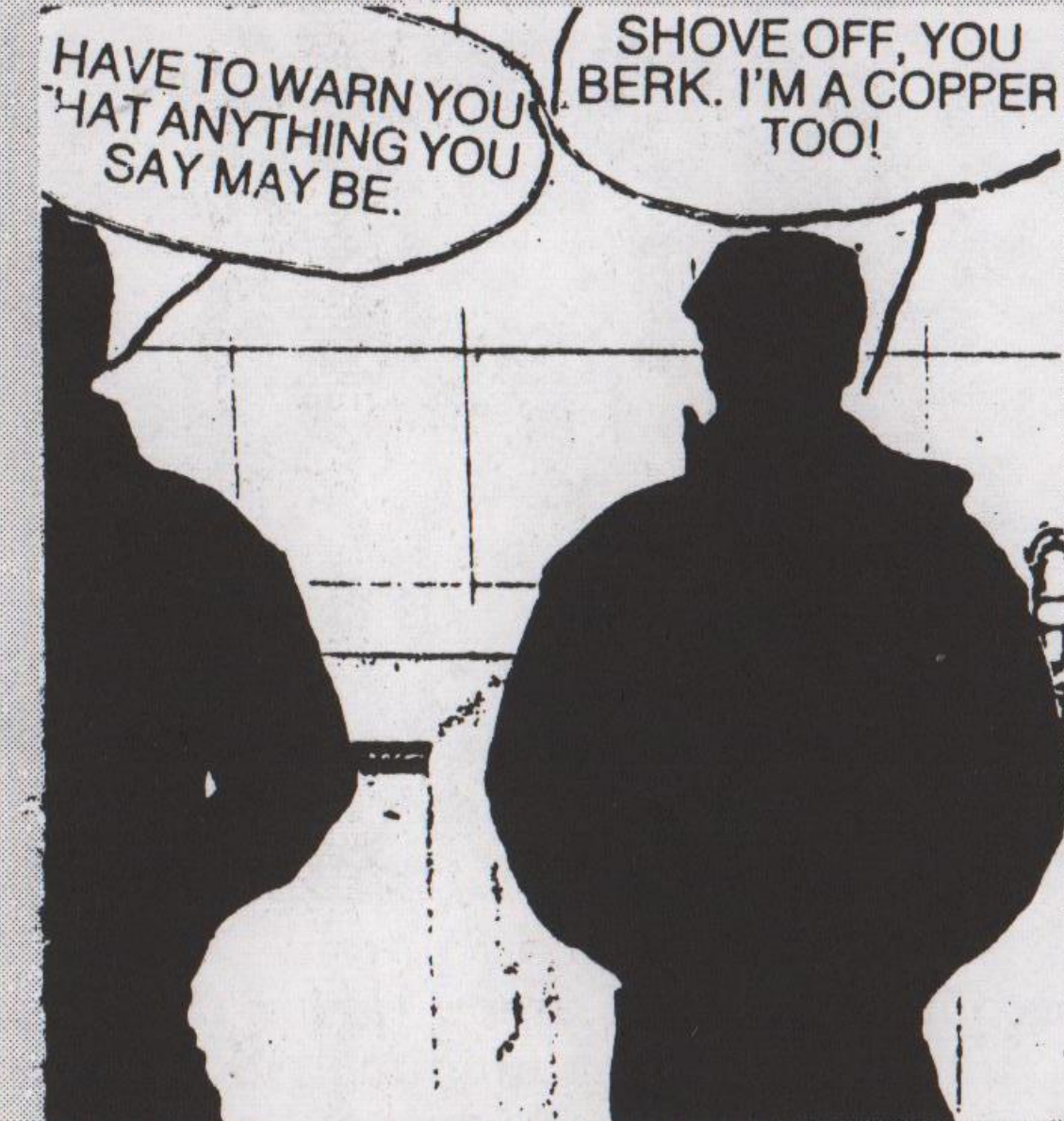

## TROUBLE WITH THE LAW?

Police activity against gay men has been stepped up dramatically in the last few months, resulting in large numbers of prosecutions, particularly in Nottingham. A local solicitor has drawn up some useful advice for Outright readers.

"The offenses for which men are being prosecuted depends on what the police believe that they can prove. Often what the police can prove depends upon what the man himself has said to the



police. Therefore, it is obviously sensible not to discuss with the police under any circumstances what has occurred until legal advice is obtained. If arrested, you will be taken to the Police Station and told on arrival of your right to have a solicitor. For goodness sake, ask for one. **DO NOT AGREE TO BE INTERVIEWED WITHOUT A SOLICITOR.** There is a Duty Solicitor available around the clock who can normally be with you within about 20 minutes of a call. This is a free service!

Remember: (a) you are not obliged to go to the Police Station unless arrested (b) you are not obliged to say anything at all unless you wish to do so. Don't, until you have seen a solicitor.

Most prosecutions take these forms:

(1) **ACT OF GROSS INDECENCY** with another man or being a party, or procuring, or attempting to procure. The law is complicated. Get advice. It is not as straightforward as it may sometimes seem. Remember that what the police say the other man says happened, normally will not be evidence against you unless the other man is prepared to come to court to give evidence for the prosecution!

(2) **PERSISTENTLY SOLICIT** for an immoral purpose. Three elements therefore have to be proved (a) Soliciting (b) Persistence (c) Immoral Purpose. The law is complicated. Get advice. The last decision on what is "immoral purpose" was in 1978!

(3) **APPLICATION FOR A BIND OVER TO KEEP THE PEACE.** The court fixes a sum of money and period of time. If you commit an offence during that period, you are liable to lose the whole or part of that sum of money. It goes on record but is not a criminal conviction. You have to agree. Don't agree without advice.

(4) **CAUTION.** Sometimes the police may offer a Caution. This means that you will be asked to admit the offence for which you would get a "ticking off" by a senior officer. The trouble with this is that it does go on your record and in some cases, e.g. for teachers and lecturers, this could have serious implications for their jobs. Not only that, once a caution is recorded, any further offence will surely be prosecuted. Therefore, again, it is imperative to seek legal advice.

Remember, if you have not already obtained legal advice, there is a Duty Solicitor at court who can advise and represent you free of cost."

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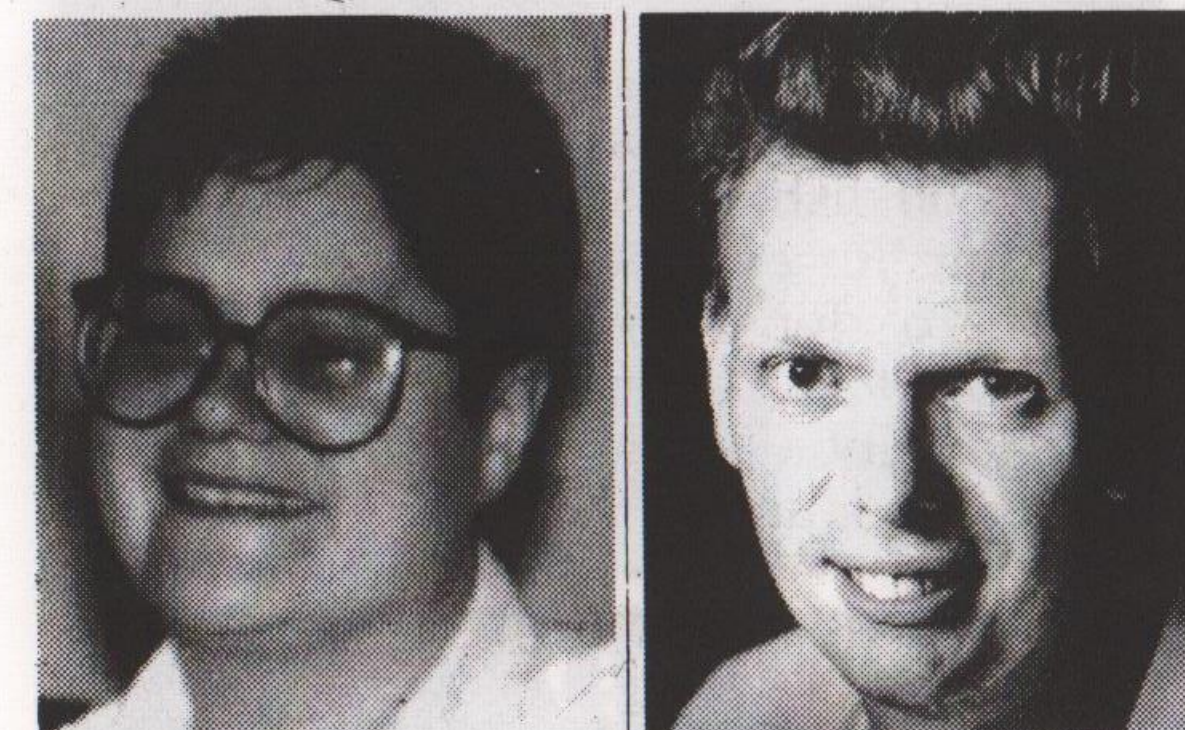
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# FORWARD IN UNISON

The gains made by lesbians and gay men in the public sector union NALGO will be maintained in UNISON, the new merged union of NUPE, NALGO and COHSE. So said Paul Fairweather to the 450 delegates to the tenth and possibly final national lesbian and gay conference of NALGO in Plymouth last month. He

later paid tribute to outgoing co-chair Anita Southwell who had worked tirelessly during her time of office. At one point she literally fell off the platform, when an access step collapsed. She later told conference to gales of laughter, "I really didn't plan to exit in this way!"

The theme of this year's conference was 'differing abilities and ageism'. "Disabled people are not accepted by the lesbian and gay communities and their sexuality is not recognised by the disability community," guest speaker Kirsten Hearn told the conference. "I came out in 1982 and I thought that I was the only blind lesbian in this world," she revealed. "I found that the lesbian and gay community didn't accept me as I was. In the disabled world having any independent sexuality is not recognised, and is seen as abnormal," she said. She also attacked the "tyranny of the body beautiful" that dominates the lesbian and gay scenes.

The other guest speaker was Dorothy Dixon-Barrow (pictured above right) who made clear how strong a force ageism remained in society. "To be beautiful,



creatures" as they got older. "I can still flirt. I think flirting is an art - but that shows my age!" Falling in love "when you're about 40" was "quite an experience," she said. But it presented its own problems with coming out. "It's much easier to hear that your children are lesbian, rather than your mother!"

NALGO will also be forging links with the newly established Lesbian and Gay Anti-Racist Alliance to examine how to involve lesbian and gay trade unionists in its work. "Racism doesn't start on the streets. It starts in Parliament with every MP who votes for the Asylum Bill" delegate Daryl Telles told the conference.

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## ANCHORS AWAY!

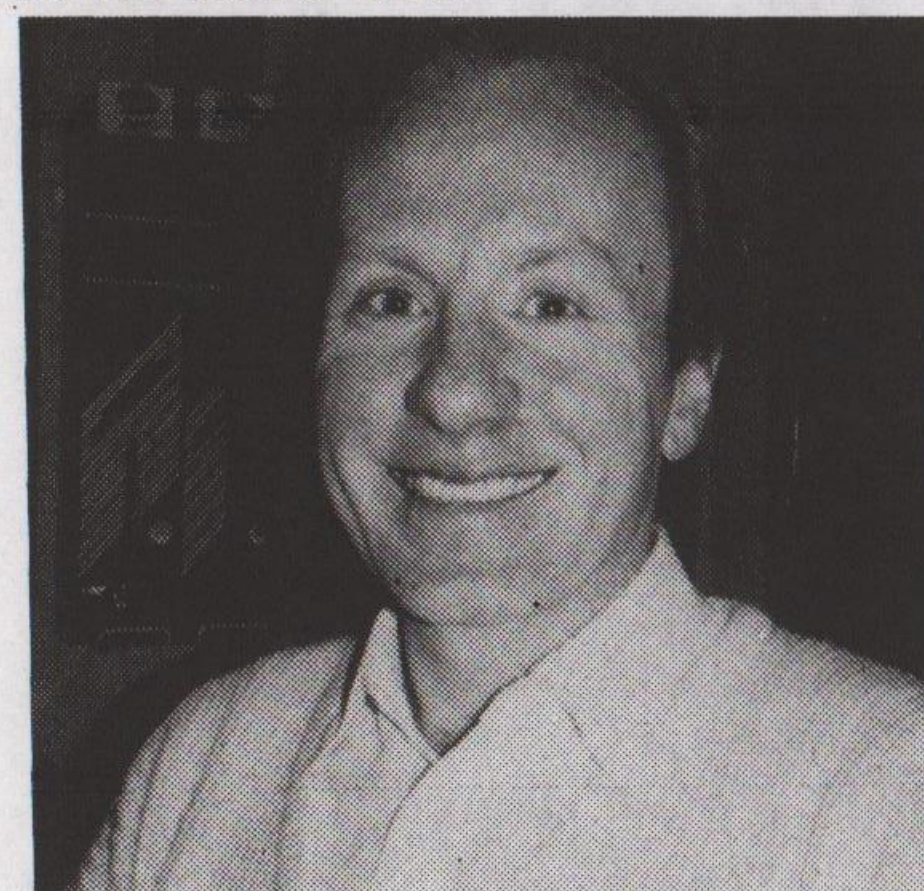

Trent Polytechnic's head barman wrote to the catering manager complaining of people in drag using the bar facilities. The catering manager wrote to the Director. The Director wrote to the President of the Students Union demanding that "homosexual elements" be removed or he would close the bar.

Gay News in December 1972 commented "He justifies his prejudices against what he affectionately terms "hard line homosexuals" by referring to what is generally believed to be a fictitious telephone call from the Assistant Chief Constable who allegedly warned repressed Gruppenfuhrer Hedley [Poly Director] that hordes of nasty offensive queers were changing their patronage from Mario's club in Stanford Street, which was following police advice and discouraging overt homosexuality."

Readers of the gay press during the past few months have been intrigued by adverts for a new service called RAINBOW. Based in Brighton the service is unique to Britain but has similarities with the 'Gay Book' yellow pages in San Francisco. Gays and lesbians wanting a service, from cleaning the drains to hot air ballooning, phone a number and are put in touch with a gay or lesbian business offering that service in their area.

Rainbow's launch comes in January and offers a free 0800 Freephone business listing. Unlike other 0800 listings Rainbow encourages custom by paying for every call received. 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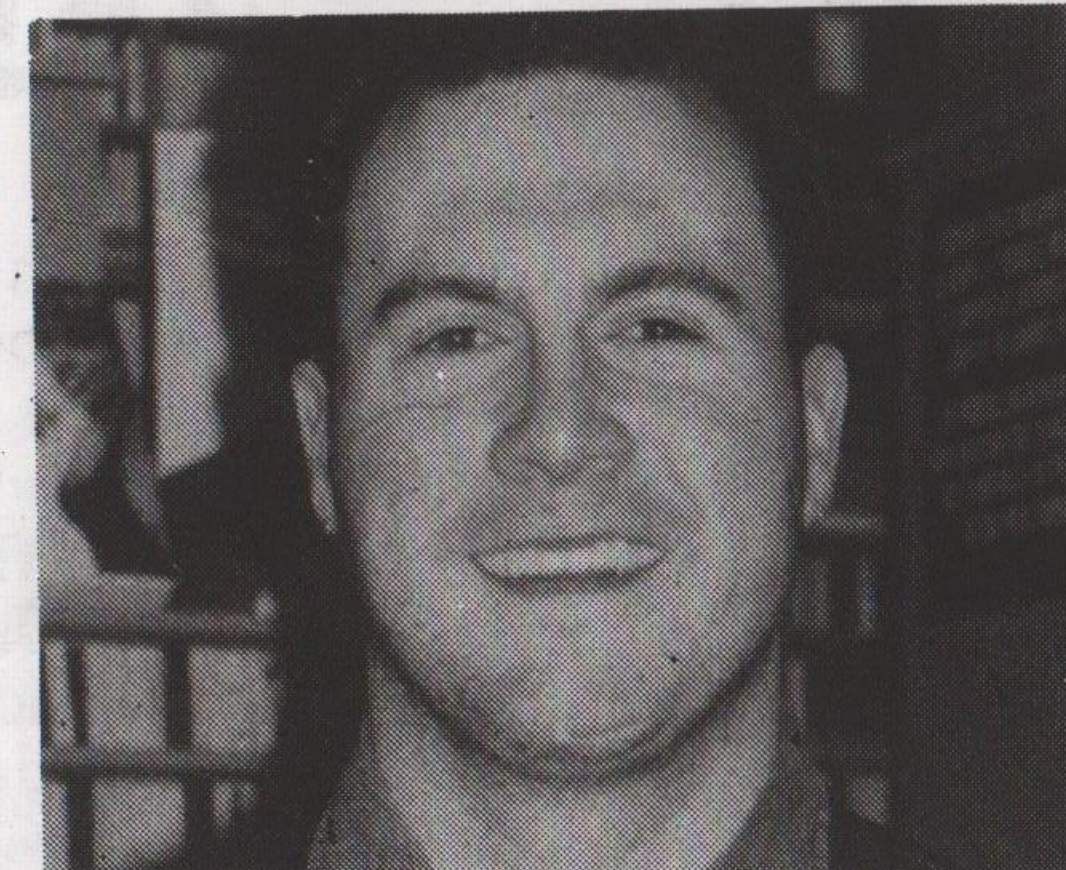
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## RECORD ROUNDUP

# THE SIGN OF THE BIG '45!



Take a walk along King Street in Leicester until you reach a door with a big '45' painted on it. From the outside it looks just like any other office, but there the similarity ends. Follow the flight of stairs and hey presto you are in the Lesbian and Gay Centre.

Once upstairs there are racks of magazines and free leaflets in the hallway, with two rooms on either side which are the main cafe areas. One room houses the servery where you can buy refreshments, snacks and salads, and the other is a quieter eating room overlooking King Street. A roof garden leads off the coffee bar and is a firm favourite in summer, with a large, split level patio with hanging baskets, which comes as something of a surprise to new visitors. On the second floor are counselling rooms and an office.

Attractively decorated in pastels, it is a pleasant place to visit for regulars and newcomers alike, and is a welcome friendly alternative to the commercial scene. For many of Leicester's lesbians and gays their weekend would not be complete without a visit to the centre.

Anne Harris has been working there since it was set up in 1987 and apart from a closure for a month in March 1990 for a complete refit, it never shuts except for the Saturday of Pride week. "Linda Grant (now with LASS) and Warren Weisner (now Aids Liaison Officer with the Health Authority), helped make this dream a reality and without their hard work it would never have opened at all", she says. And I also know that Anne and the other volunteers provide a warm and genuine welcome to anyone who visits the centre. So why not see for yourself.

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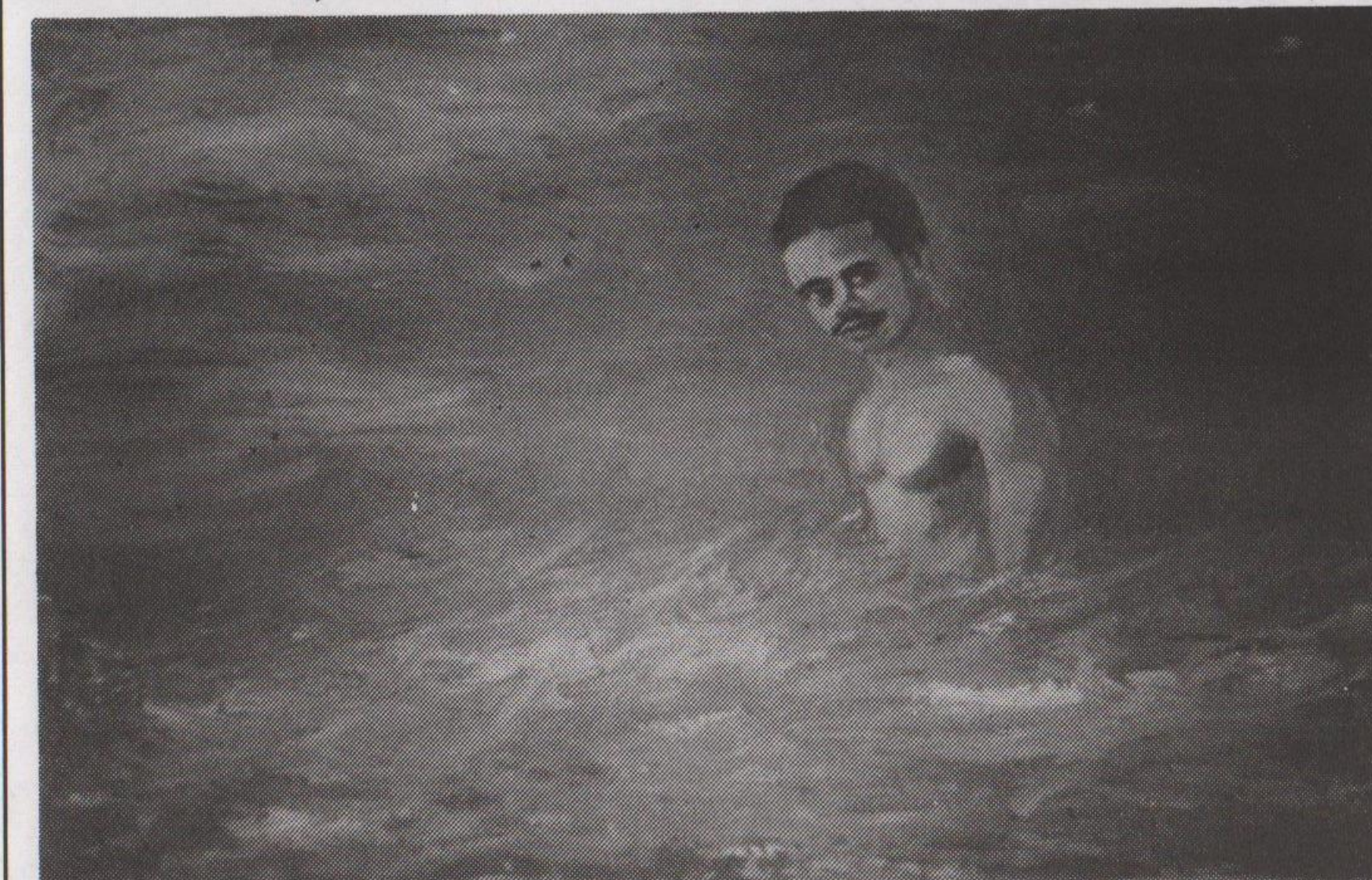
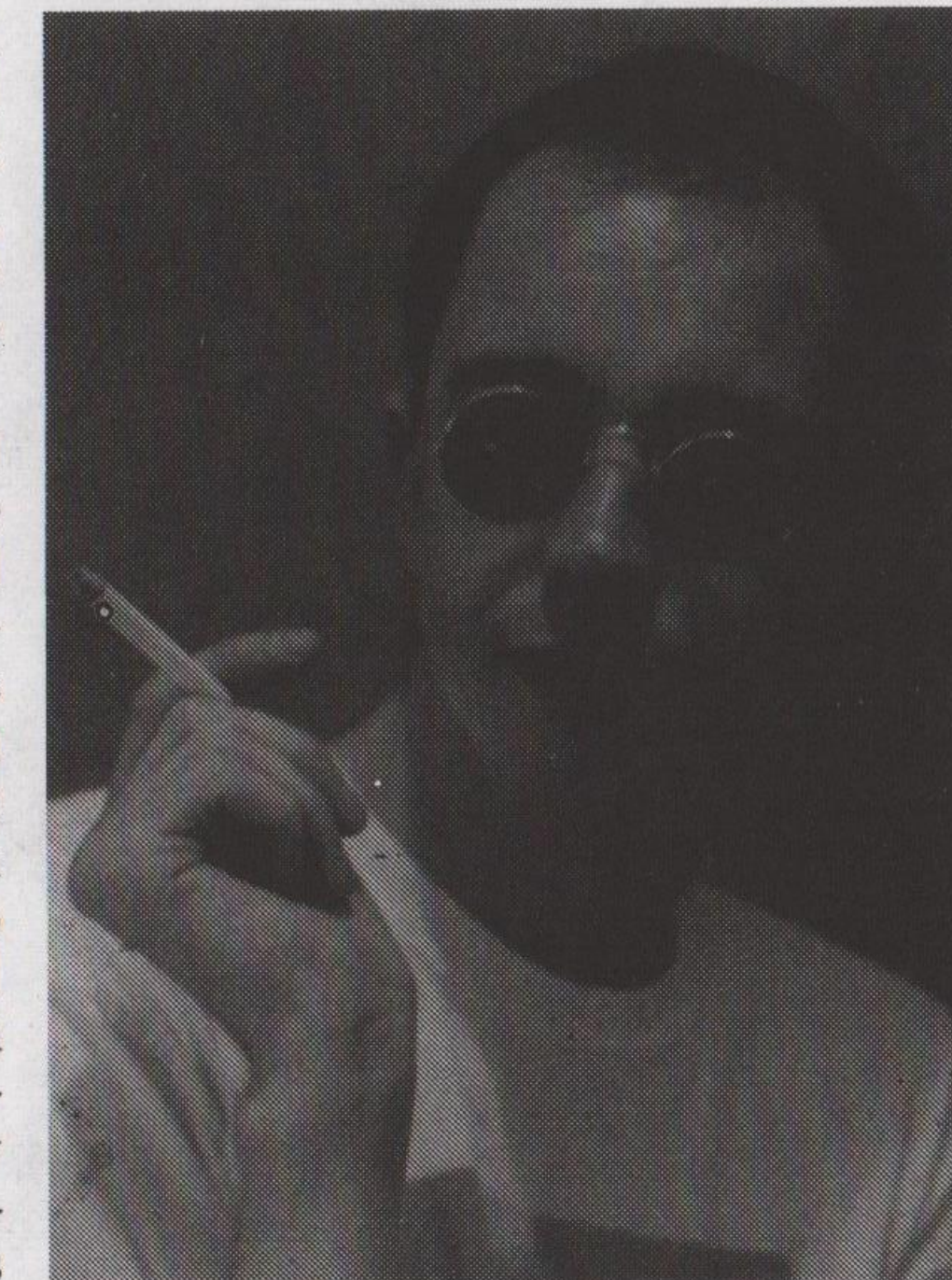

## LEICESTER ARTIST EXHIBITED

Robert James Mullins, a student of Art and Design at Leicester's Charles Keene College, exhibited his work at the Lesbian and Gay Centre recently.

Twenty eight year old Robert is a familiar face on the local gay scene and much of his work is inspired by his experiences on the scene. "I'm often known to come home from a night club and pick up a paint brush, trying to capture the moods and emotions of the night in paint," he says. "Whenever I embark on a new painting I try to incorporate human emotions my work as well as sexuality."

"I cover a variety of topics in my art work. Mostly I depict erotic male art, but I have been known to create scenic works, and



more recently I have become interested in female erotic art." Robert expresses surprise that there are so few modern works that depict lesbian art and emotions.

"What motivates me in my artwork tends to be emotions, each face or pose being able to tell a story. I try to make my work something that will make people look past the sexual overtones and more into the mind of the subject."

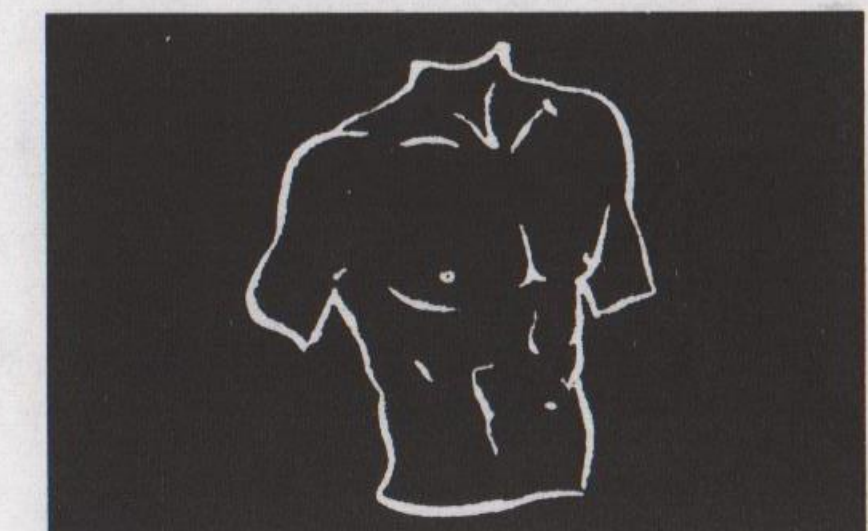

## A VERY PINK PRACTICE

Former Nottingham University Medical School student and Gay Switch-board operator, Tim Worden is one of the first out gay GP's in the country to open a 'gay friendly' medical practice in the centre of a large city.

He has recently moved into premises in Canal Street in Manchester, in the heart of the gay village. Richard McCance paid a visit to the 'pink practitioner' at his warm and welcoming modern premises.

Tim told me that the aim of the practice is to fulfil the existing needs of city-centre dwellers which include private residents, students, the homeless, prostitutes, drug-abusers, and in particular Manchester's gay community.

an 'out' gay G.P., or to take over a single-handed practice and mould it to some of the ideas I believe in. This has been much harder than I thought. All too often there is a 'trial by sherry' approach to obtaining new partners for practices here. "Do bring your wife around to the senior partner's house and meet the rest of the partners and their wives!" I'm afraid people like me just don't fit in to that kind of setting."

Realising that there was no National Health Service G.P. provision at all in Manchester city-

centre, which incorporates the gay village, Tim spotted a gap in the health market. He made proposals which impressed the local health authority, but it has still taken two years and a considerable personal investment to realise his plans (he lives nearby, in a one-bedroom council flat which he shares with two cuddly cats and a cuddly Caledonian called Charlie). And just to keep it all in the family there is a gay practice manager and a lesbian practice nurse on hand to assist in women's health issues.

As for his future plans for the practice, Tim is looking to extend its range of services and support to the lesbian and gay communities. 'I'd hope to see it expand to more than a single-handed practice and would hope to appoint other partners committed to serving the needs of gay men, lesbians, and city-centre populations.

And that's a tonic enough to keep Manchester's lesbian and gay communities on the road to better health. (Thanks to Jim Hackett of MANKIE for permission to amend, add and reproduce).

Dr. Worden's practice not only represents the first to serve the city-centre area, but will also be the first of its kind in the city to be run by an openly gay G.P. It is a challenge he believes has long been neglected by the city's medical establishment.

Still a child of Sixties idealism, he qualified (appropriately) at Queens Medical School Nottingham in 1979, before opting to become a partner in a socialist equal-pay collective practice in Sheffield.

But setting up his own practice in Manchester has aroused frustrations on both a personal and professional level. "When I moved to Manchester, I wanted either to join a practice which would be happy to accept me and recognise me as

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## WHAT'S UP DOC?

Dear Dr Shaw.

I have really bad breath - which causes me major embarrassment - when I am out. Why? Is there anything I can do?

Yours sincerely, Marion.

Dear Marion.

Bad breath (halitosis) can have a variety of causes, the majority related to diet or oral hygiene. Very rarely is bad breath indicative of ill health. To a large extent we smell of what we eat: we all know that eating certain foods such as curries, garlic, onions, alcohol, can all leave their signatures on our breath. Bad teeth, or an unclean mouth, can similarly odourise our breath. Watch what you eat and drink, brush your teeth and clean your mouth at least twice daily and if you have any dental problems, see your dentist. Mouth freshness, mints etc help, but remember they only temporarily mask the problem and don't cure it. Though they are useful in emergency situations, the sugar in many mint sweets makes them unsuitable for regular use.

Dear Dr Shaw

I'm a vegetarian and have been for around two years, but ever since then I've had a real problem with farting. Is this related to my diet - what can I do?

Yours hopefully, Kevin.

Dear Kevin.

In a nutshell the answer is probably yes - though to be honest a vegetarian existence is generally a healthy one. Much of the fibre and indigestible material in your diet can lead to an unexpected bowel activity. This indigestible material is fermented by naturally occurring organisms in your bowel - which in turn leads to a tendency to fart, as well as more voluminous shits. Try manipulating your diet. Some foods, rice for instance, are less inclined to lead to gas production than, say, beans and pulses, but remember to keep your diet balanced.
