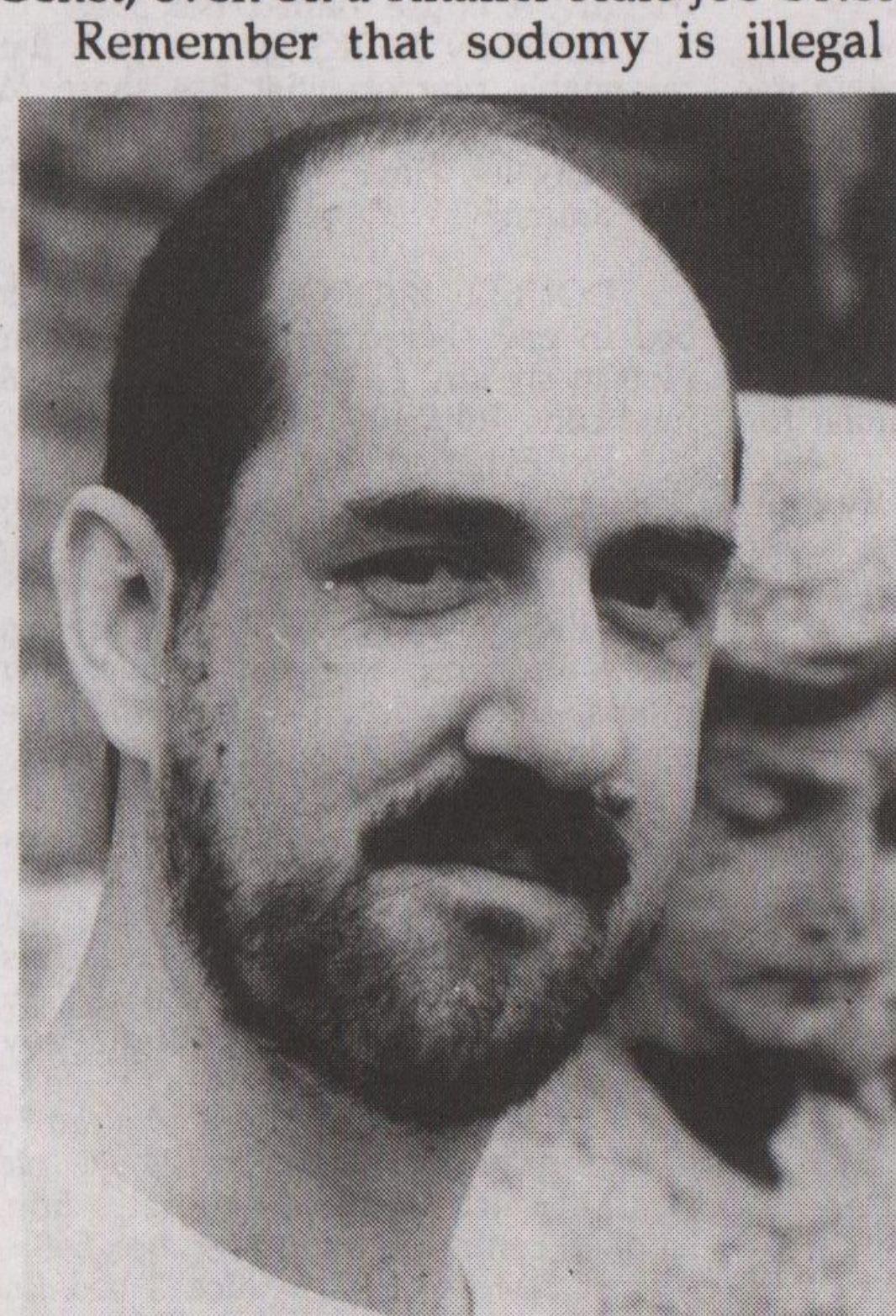


'THE LIVING END'

A review by Gregory Woods

American culture has always loved outlaws and gangsters (Billy the Kid, Al Capone). American film is full of pairs of fugitives (Bonnie and Clyde, Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid, Thelma and Louise). Similarly, gay culture has made a cult of its criminals (Oscar Wilde, Jean Genet, even on a smaller scale Joe Orton).

Remember that sodomy is illegal in half the States. Remember, too, that by overstepping one of a number of arbitrary limits any gay man in this country may find himself suddenly living outside the law. The idea of gay identity as a criminal condition is not mere fantasy.

So there is clear logic to the recent wave of queer American movies about criminal perverses: Todd Haynes' *Poison*, Tom Kalin's *Swoon* and now Gregg Araki's *The Living End*. This cultural wave fol-

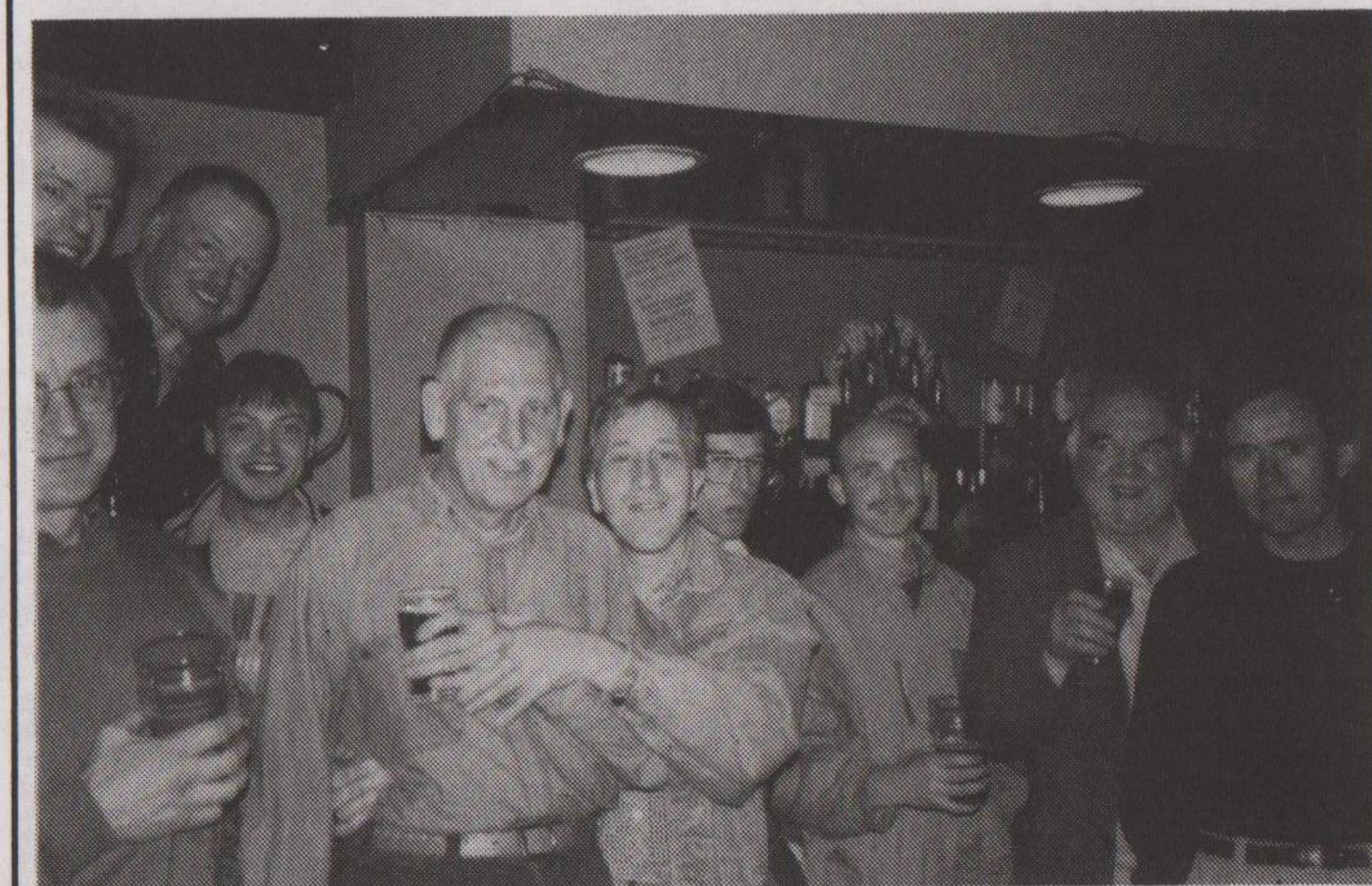
lowed straight people's increasing tendency, as a response to AIDS, to associate gay sex with death. Queer film makers have decided to take this association literally and to make movies about queers who kill.

Gregg Araki says of himself, "I'm not particularly political, except in my art. I'm not an activist sort of person. I essentially make music and buy records". He is proud to promote *The Living End* as an 'irresponsible' film. It is about two lovers who, being HIV+, feel they have nothing to lose. So they set off on a passionate and violent spree across the American landscape. This is not HIV as any friend of mine has experienced it.

According to Araki, *The Living End* is not a sex film but a romance. "Frankly," he says, "when sex is in the air, I'm much more interested in what's going on in the two men's heads than in their dicks." Personally, I was more interested in their dicks.

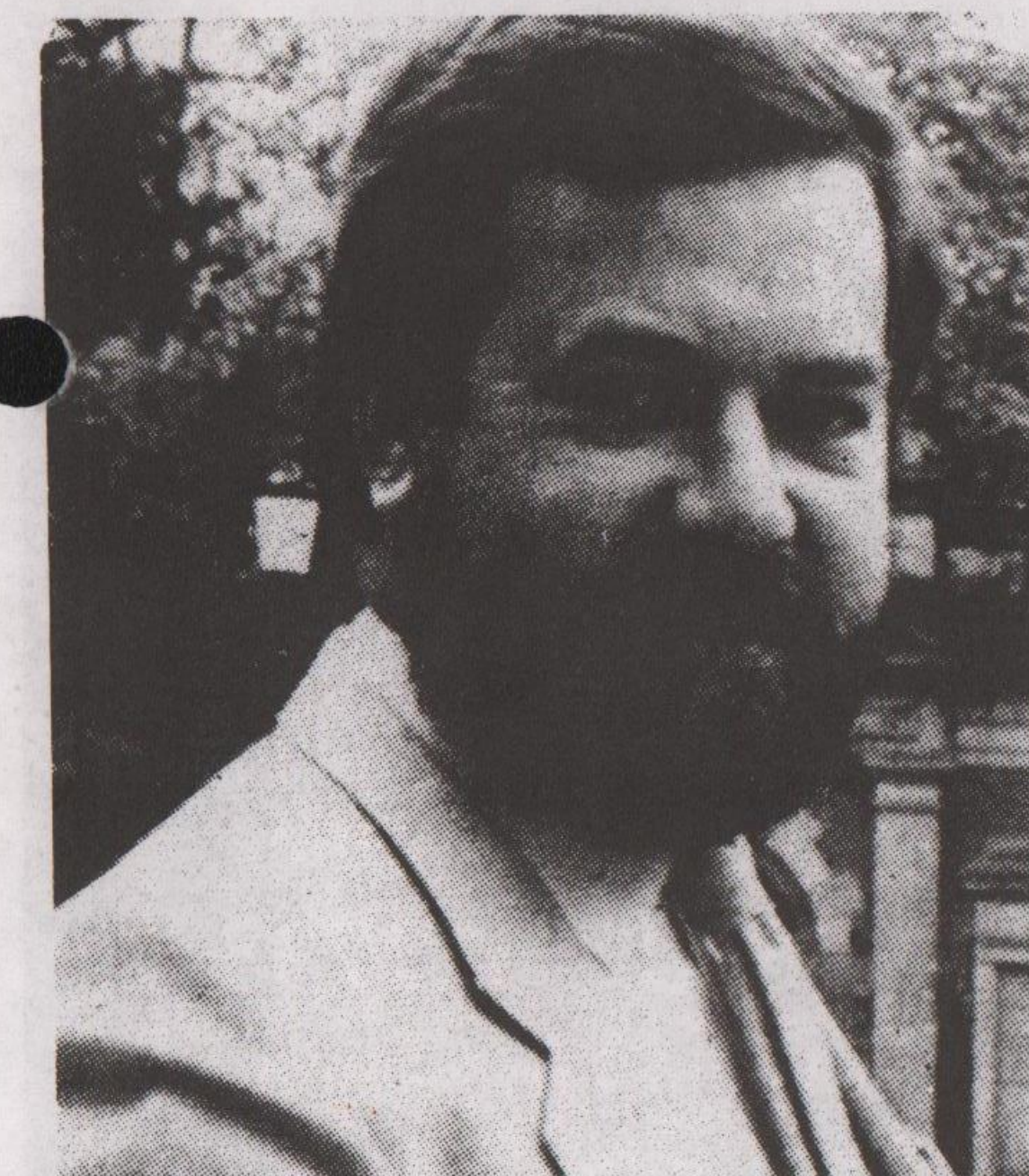

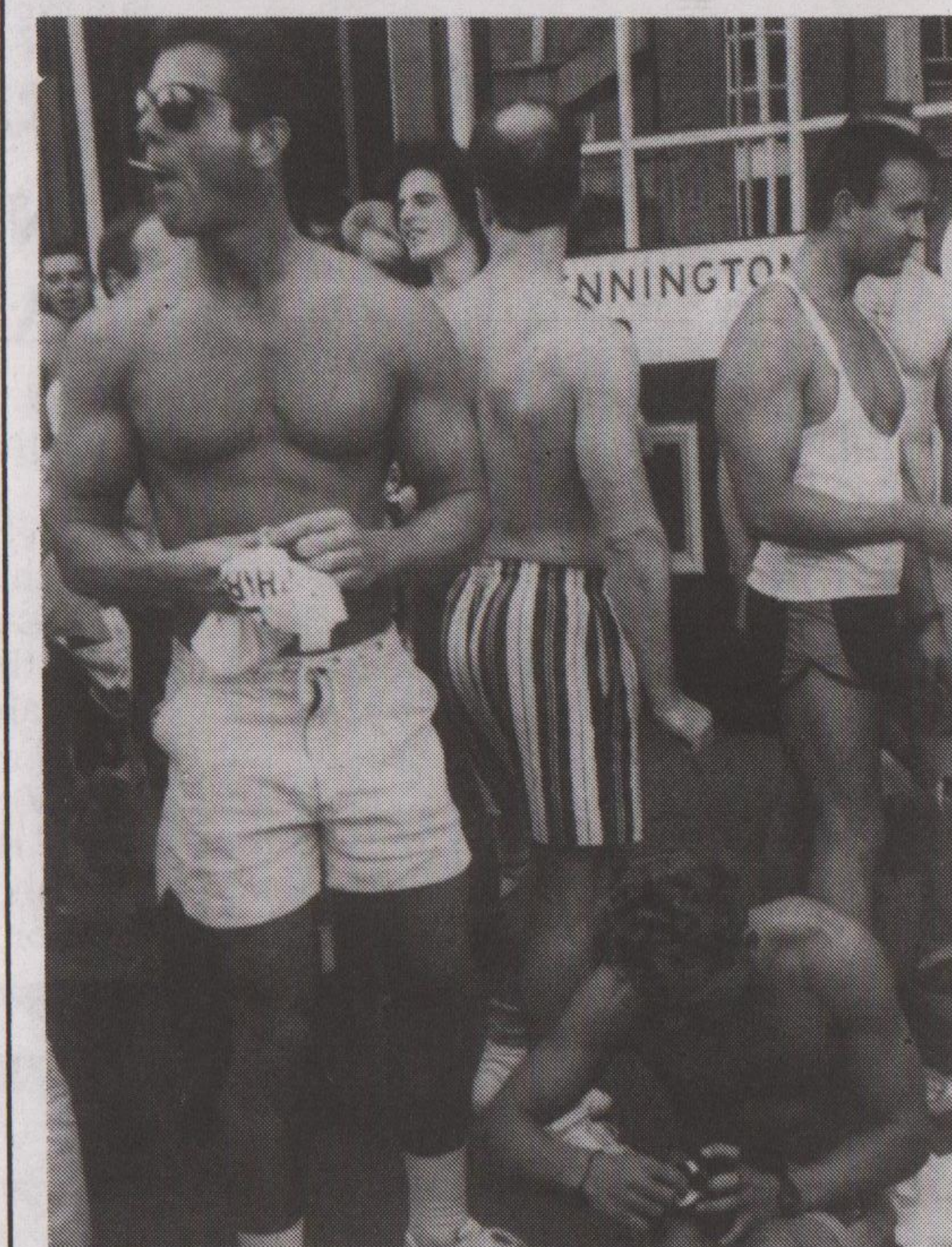
SHAKTI'S FOURTH BIRTHDAY BHANGRA

SECTION OBJECTION

The government's new draft circular on sex education in schools is doing the rounds of consultation at the moment and the Gay and Lesbian Humanist Association is asking for letters of objection to Clause 25 to be sent to the Department For Education.

The clause begins with the statement "There is no place in any school in any circumstances for teaching which advocates homosexual behaviour, which presents it as the norm, or which encourages homosexual experimentation by pupils". It goes on to imply that people with religious prejudices against homosexuality should be given special consideration in classroom discussions on homosexuality.

GALHA compares the near-detrimental attitudes of the Education Department with recent guidelines from the Department of Health relating to the Children Act in which the needs of the child receive priority.

RECORD ROUNDUP by Simon Smalley

Philly-Delphia Freedom

After the dismal failure of his second album, it seemed as if the golden egg laying goose called Terrence Trent-D'Arby had laid an out-of-date Cadbury's Creme Egg that had been left out in the sun too long. After a drastic re-think and a handful of Lenny Kravitz tapes, the ex-boxing warbler is hot to trot once more on the third instalment of his career. Loftily titled 'Terrence Trent-D'Arby's Symphony Or Damn-Exploring The Tension Inside The Sweetness', it chucks you headfirst into the deep end from track one. 'Are You Happy?' is a slice of mid-70s Philly Soul with a drum sound lifted straight from Gladys Knight's 'I've Really Got To Use My Imagination'. From the Latin laziness of 'Delicate' to the almost PSB-intro'd 'She Kissed Me', which then kickstarts into an almost Nirvana like track, we find ode Tel back on form. If there's any justice, 'I Still Love You' should see 45 release as it's the epitome of the summer single, sweet, honeyed vocals with a mellow acoustic backing. An all-round thumbs-up.

God's Groover

At one time, in the days before Take That's balls dropped, Cliff Richard was considered to be the UK equivalent of Elvis Presley - a pouting, sneering, hip-swivelling sex machine just itchin' to get his hands on yer daughters. Those three days of risque fame have long gone and now, Cliff has more wrinkles than a Rhino's scrotum and is about as dangerous as a tangerine leatherette clutchbag. His twenty-trillionth album, imaginatively called 'The Album' shamelessly relies on soft-core sentimentalism and soporific self-righteousness, an innocuous pre-meditated murder of music contrived to increase his bank balance. And they're just the good points. Time to call it a day, girl, and open them there closet doors wide!

Girls on Film

John Foxx, owner of cheekbones you could balance plates on and founder member of Ultravox! (when they still had the "I") split from the band a couple of years before they hit the



big time on the back of the New Romantic bandwagon. During those intermittent years, he recorded two LP's that did little at the time, but have since been regarded (well, by me) as prime examples of pioneering synth-pop. 'Metamatic', which spawned the sizeable hit 'Underpass' and the follow-up album 'The Garden' are now re-available after several years gathering dust in the cupboard marked 'Cult, but crap'. Foxx, along with such electro-instigators as Cabaret Voltaire, Fad Gadget and Human League plugged into the electronic sound a good eighteen months before pretty boys like Duran Duran and Spandau Ballet raided their Mam's wardrobes

and slapped on the No. 7 blusher. Sparse, yet intricate arrangements show how truly avant-garde he really was and these are worth lending an ear to. Rumour has it that he's now in the licensing trade. What a waste.

Indeed, Money for Nothing

The 1980's Shadows, those dullards of twang Dire Straits have also gone for the 'greatest hits live' option on 'On The Night'. Perfectly executed rolls of finger-twitching frippery grace the recording, but it's sooooo uninteresting, it's unreal. Talk about 'Wake Me Up Before You Go-Go' - you can visualise the fag lighters aloft, waving 'Sailing'-style to 'Romeo & Juliet' and almost see the secretaries hand-jiving to 'Money For Nothing' (with 'Faggot' line intact, shame on you, Miss Mark K-Nopfler). Can you believe there's a video to accompany this release as well? I mean, like Wow!, rush out to buy it or what? I suppose you had to be there. Zzzzzero.

Well, that's yer lot. Ta Ra fer now, Simon.

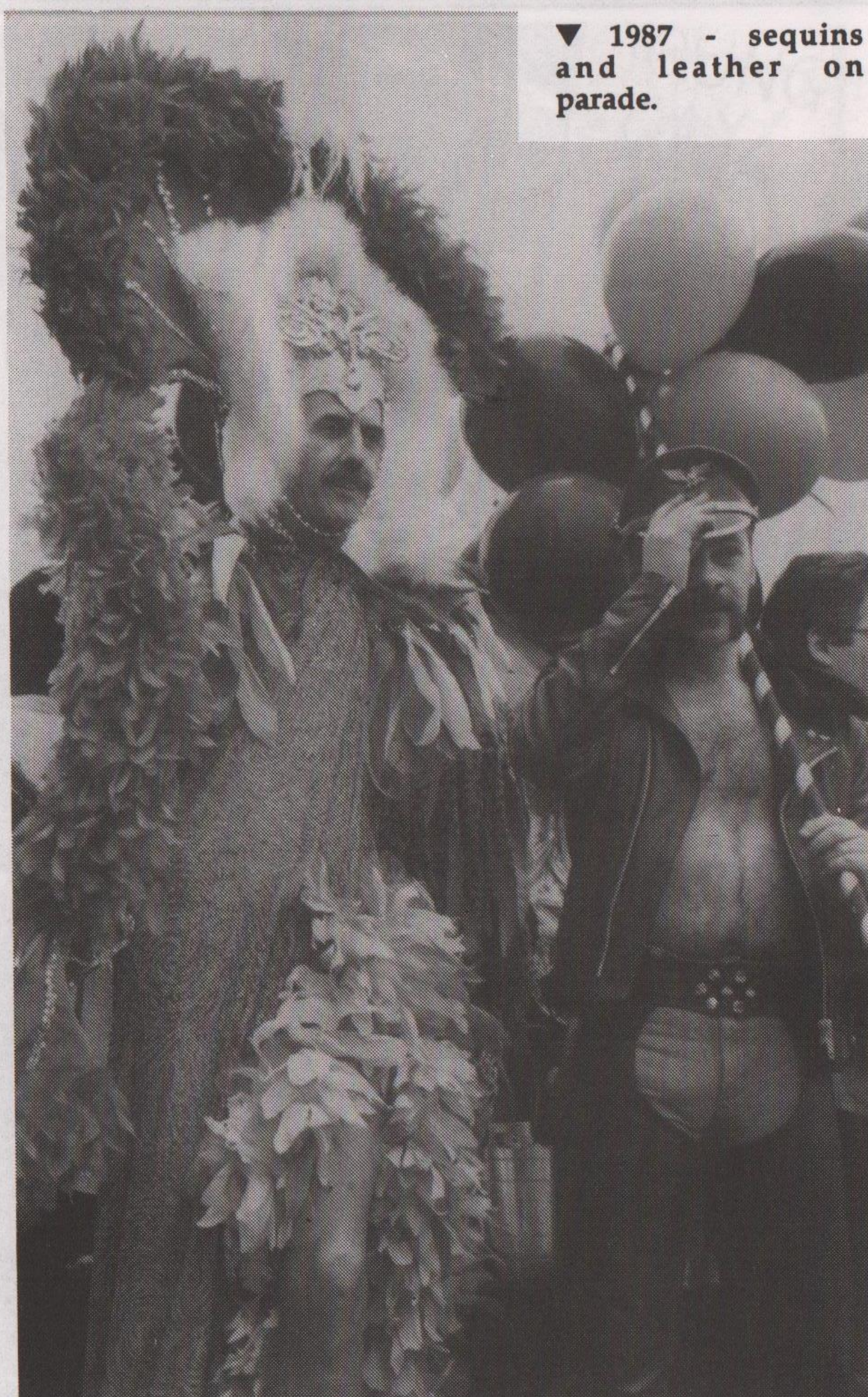

'OUT AND ABOUT' IN DUDLEY

Dudley Health Authority have approved funding for a needs assessment through Aidsline West Midlands, the leading charity for people affected by HIV and AIDS in the West Midlands. The assessment will be carried out with volunteer support from the Dudley area. Help is needed from local gay men and men who identify with gay lifestyles. MCC IN NOTTINGHAM

Wendy Snell of the Metropolitan Community Church asks us to point out that she is a co-ordinator, not the Pastor of the Nottingham congregation as we reported in the last issue of 'Outright'.
