

SECULAR FIRST

The first non-religious memorial ceremony organised by the Terrence Higgins Trust took place at St Martins-in-the-Field recently. It was conducted by a Humanist Officiant, Vivienne Robins-Grace, in place of a religious minister. The ceremony included poetry, readings and songs - but no prayers, hymns or religious lessons. The decision was prompted by complaints about the intrusiveness of religion, and the use of Gospel Singers at previous THT events. A spokesperson for the British Humanist Association, Matt Cherry, commented "It is about time that the organisers of these events took account of the many participants who feel excluded from a Christian service or who are uncomfortable or angry with religion because of its judgemental and unsupportive attitude to people with HIV and AIDS. A Humanist ceremony aims to include everyone by celebrating shared human values".

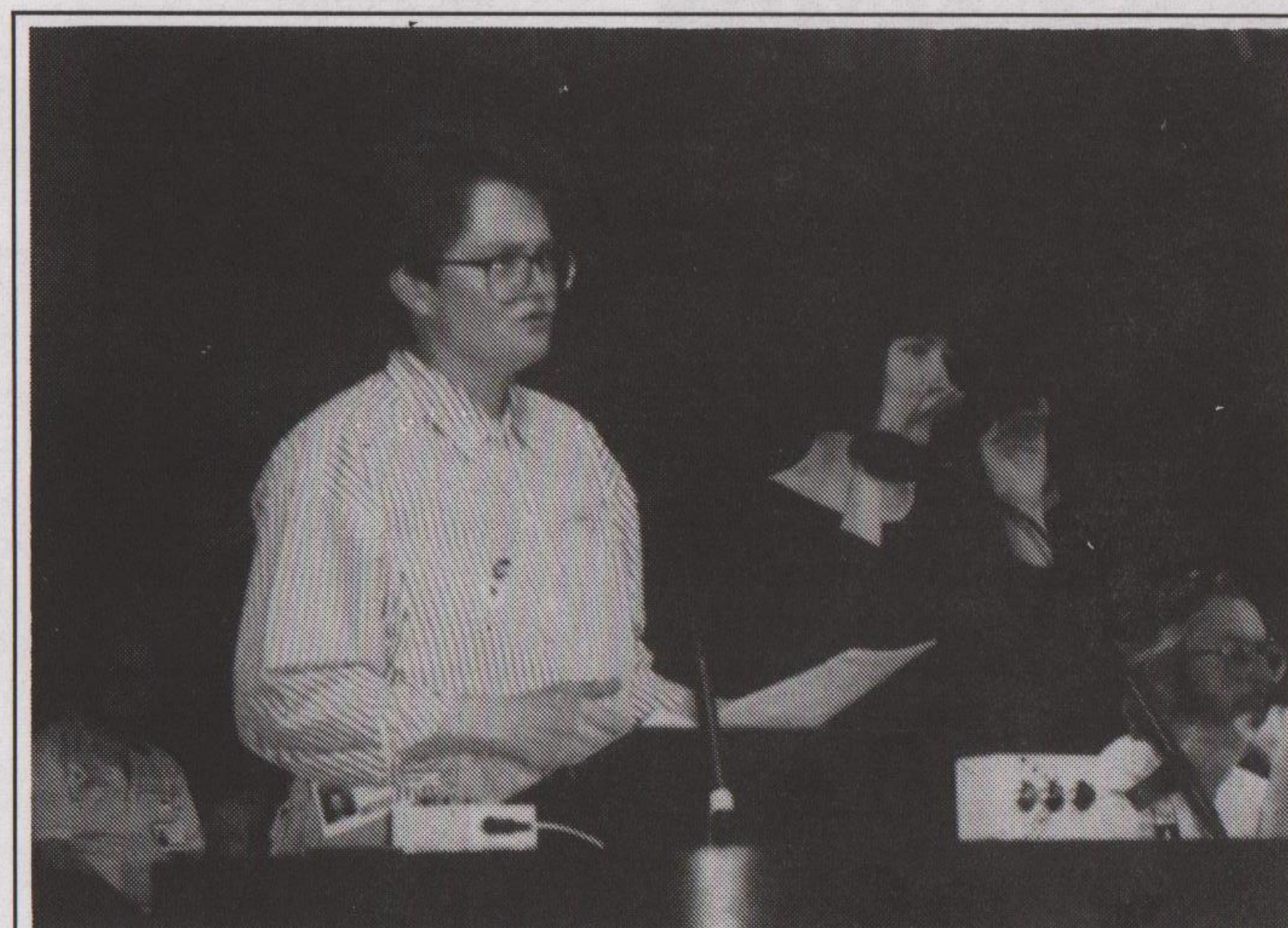

(continued from front page) work for justice and human rights and to give dignity and human worth to people whatever their sexuality."

However one opponent of the successful motion declared how she 'loved' homosexuals and that she and her husband contributed funds for fallen gays in London but she couldn't cope with what they did with their bodies. Messing about with anal orifices ruined the linings, she added. The Rev. Paul Flowers, Superintendent of the Bridlington Circuit said: "She even had her supporters gasping and holding their heads in their hands".

The positive Conference decision was immediately circulated to every church with a request that it be displayed or read out. Said Paul, "This proves that pressure groups like the Lesbian and Gay Christian Movement can influence change for the better".

Having first resolved that sexual orientation should not be a bar to the ordination of lesbians and gay men as ministers, the Conference had gone on to restate a 1939 motion advocating "chastity for all outside marriage and fidelity within it". So, having opened one door and seemingly closed another, there was surprise and jubilation when the lesbian and gay caucus's own resolution was approved by a large majority.

ATTACKERS ON THE LOOSE

Gay men are being terrorised and beaten up by a man posing as a punter around several cottages in Nottingham. Outright has received several reports recently from gay men who have been the victims of his attacks.

The attacker usually waits inside a cubicle, assaults people he believes are gay and robs them. There have also been allegations that he has broken someone's arm. On another occasion a man was locked in a cottage for several hours before managing to escape.

The assailant is described as white, 5' 10', slim, with fair curly hair, always well-dressed, usually in jeans or smart casual wear. A consistent description is that he 'has dull lifeless eyes'. His main targets are Trent Bridge, Mount Street, Arboretum and Embankment. He is known to be called Mark and comes from the Meadows area.

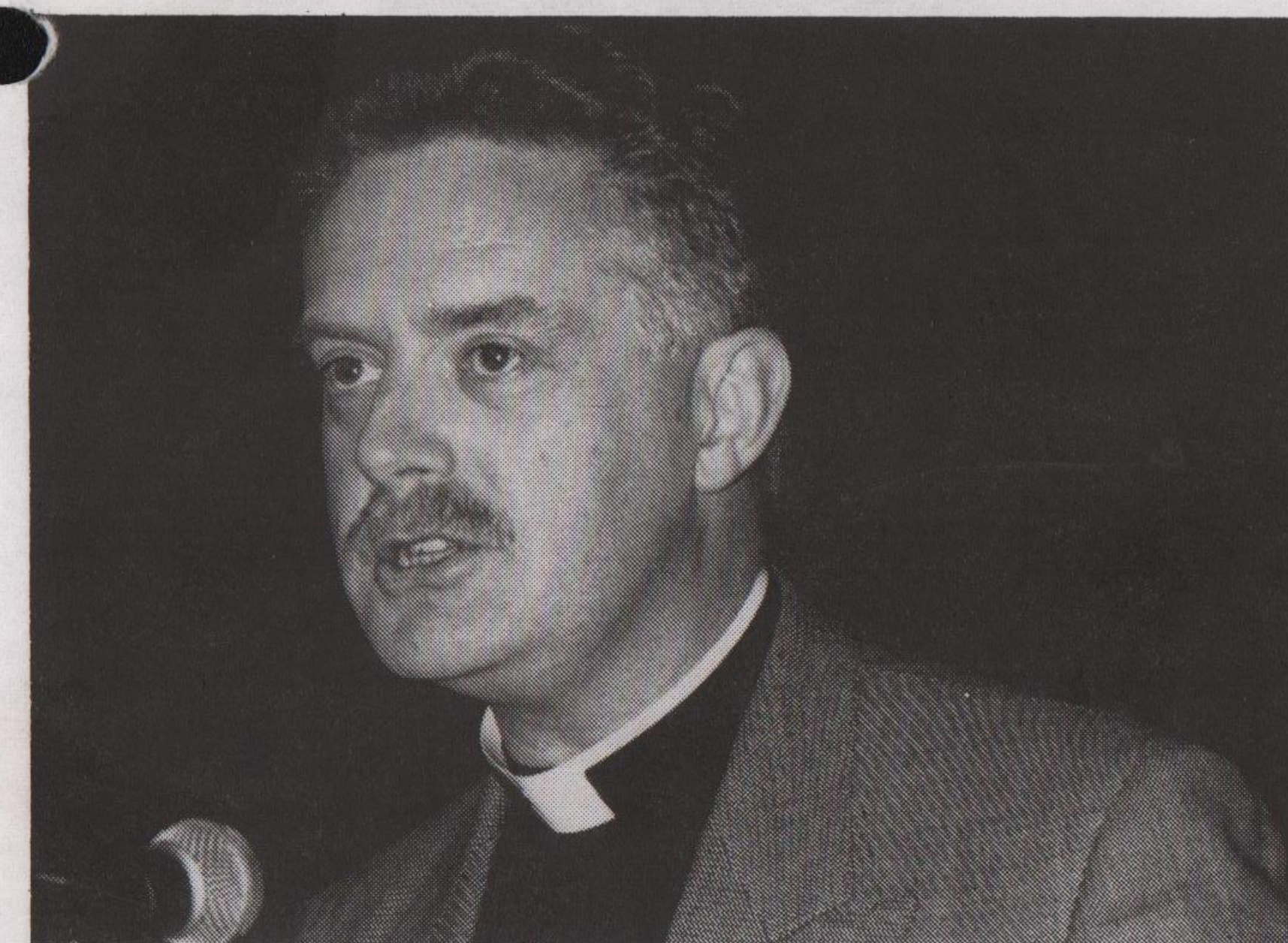
Clubbers clubbed

Also reports are coming in of late night attacks on gay men leaving Gatsbys and the Admiral Duncan recently. In one case the attackers were a group of three men. It is believed they came from the Staircase Club in Lower Parliament Street. They are described as around 6' tall, black, short curly hair, smartly dressed. A number of gay men leaving the Duncan saw this happen. A gay black man walking by with a friend intervened and fought back, the attackers were surprised by this and ran off. The man attacked sustained facial bruising and cuts but otherwise was not badly hurt.

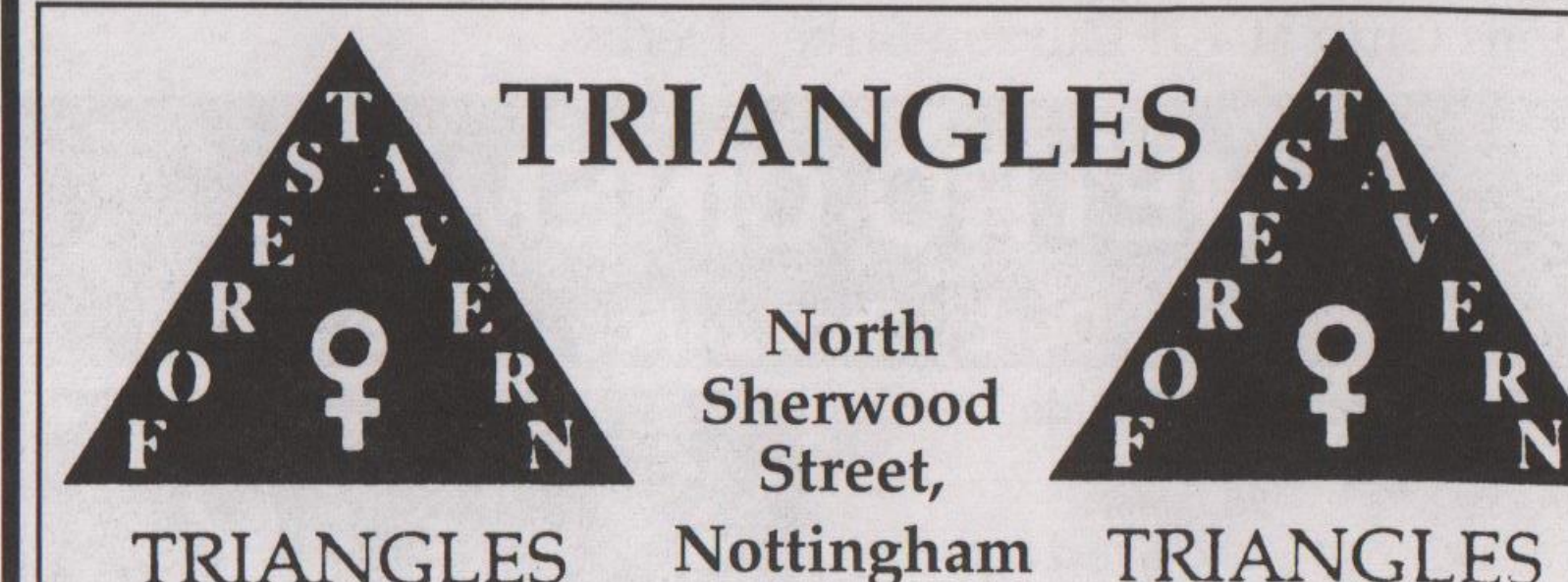

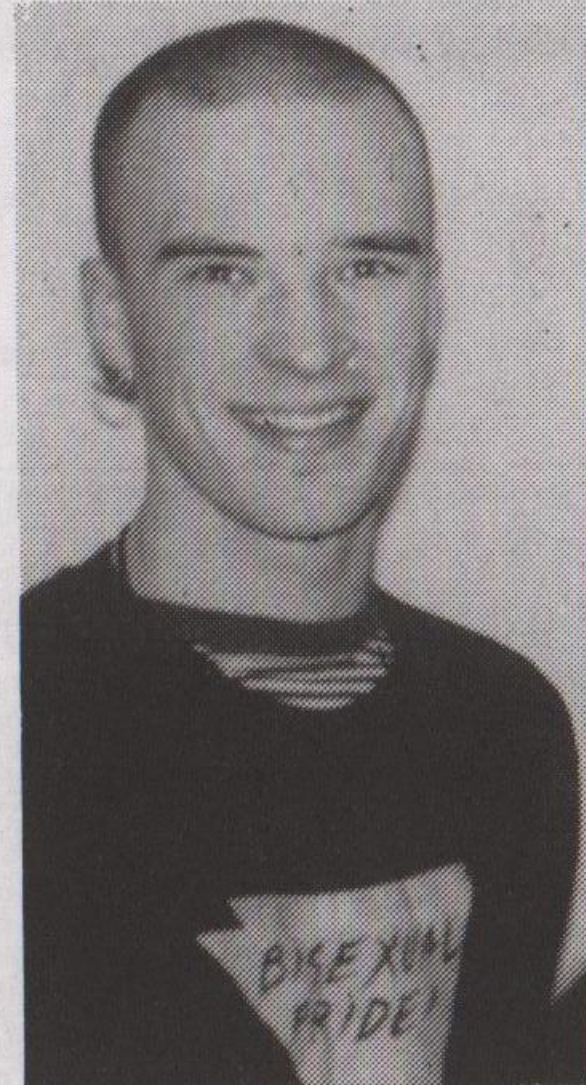

Twenty Years Ago

NOTTINGHAM: Magistrates approved a uniquely worded clause by granting a license to La Chic, a new £40,000 club which would allow the proprietors to refuse admission to a person on the grounds that he or she was not gay. The 'gay only' clause was unprecedented in Britain.

Magistrate chairman Colonel Harry Lucas said: "We found the proprietors suitable and experienced people. They claim, and we believe them, they will be able to recognise one of their own kind. It was difficult decision which we think is in keeping with the more humane and compassionate attitude by the government and increasingly by society towards people with special problems."

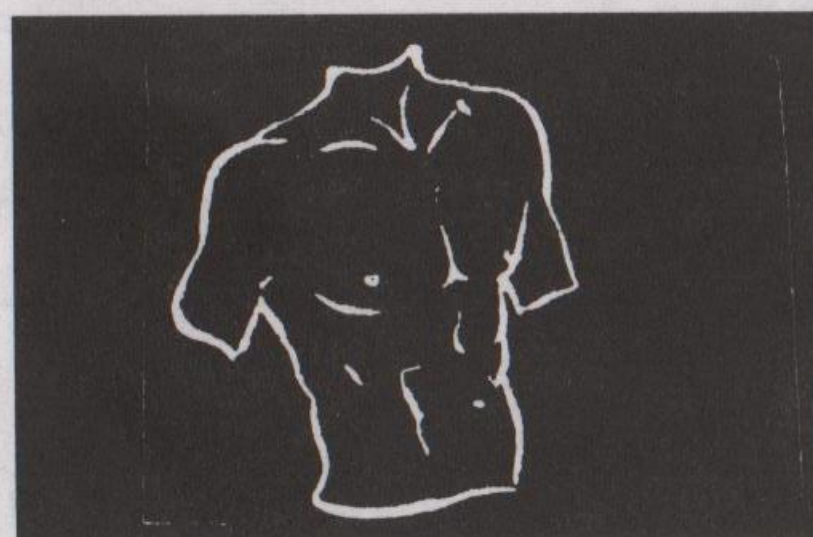

FOR POSITIVE CHANGE

Aspiring to Excellence -

Like so many voluntary organisations Nottingham Aids Information Project began with an office no bigger than a shoe box until Health Authority funding led to a suite of offices atop three flights of stairs. Their new comfortable premises in the city centre are a far cry from 1985 when a Nottingham-based gay man, living with HIV, started the self-help group that was to become NAIP.

Sue Loakes was recruited as Project Co-ordinator just a year ago, joining Chris Hinchley, the Development and Outreach worker and Tess Rodgers the Administration worker in time to help make the transition from the rather sterile attic premises to the more accessible premises they now have. This move also represented a time for change and taking stock. The Management Committee soon realised the only effective way forward

was to close for three months, to review what was on offer to the public, the volunteers and the paid workers. Some thought the decision was controversial others that it was courageous. Either way, it wasn't easy to withdraw vital services when little else was on offer.

A pre-requisite for volunteers in an agency serving many different communities are positive attitudes over a range of issues like race, sexuality, age and dis-ability. The Management Committee took a fresh look at their policies. Existing volunteers were then invited to submit themselves for reselection under the new conditions and around twenty were ratified.

"We are here to provide high quality professional services to people directly affected by HIV, which now includes a greater number of heterosexual people using our service. There is a distinction between amateurs and volunteers who are only as good as their training. We need to know when it's right to refer on rather than trying to hold everything. At the moment we don't provide a service to black people or people

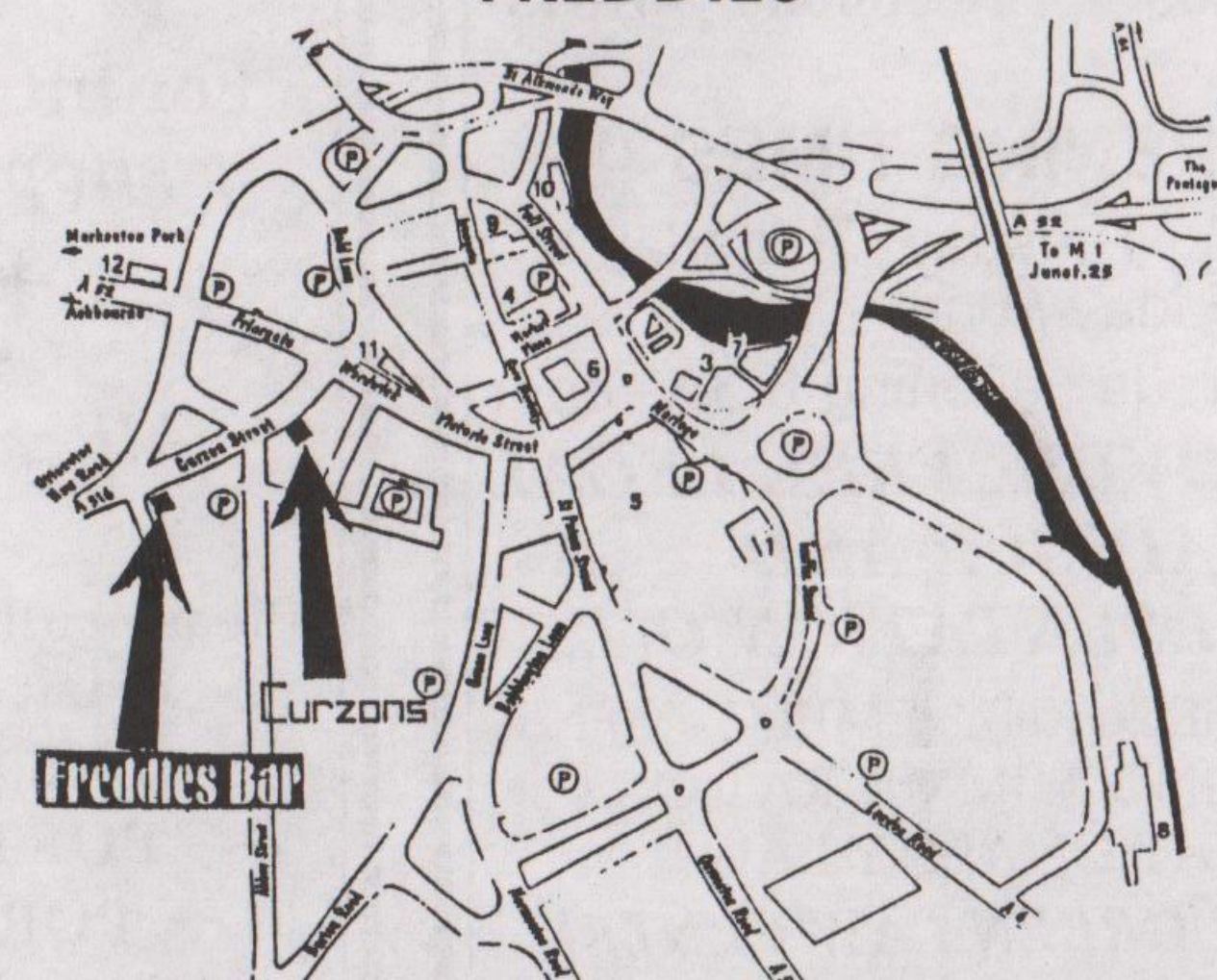

with dis-abilities and we should like to redress this in a non-tokenistic way" said Sue.

Sue is out as a lesbian and speaks as someone with a rich background of work in the voluntary and statutory sector. An ex-drug user who set up WHIP the prostitute's pressure group, she drew on her own experience as a former prostitute. She went on to run a social services Day Centre and take a university qualifying course in social work.

Since they re-opened in mid June, bang on target incidentally, services now on offer include befriending (which includes buddying) a telephone advice helpline, staffed by paid workers, a hardship fund for anyone living with HIV, and outreach and training. They are keen to encourage unfunded groups to use their premises which include lounge/kitchen, aromatherapy/medical room and library. Already Nottingham Gay and Lesbian Young People (GLYP) meet there regularly.

Future plans include a move away from the emphasis on HIV to general health, providing an integrated service rather

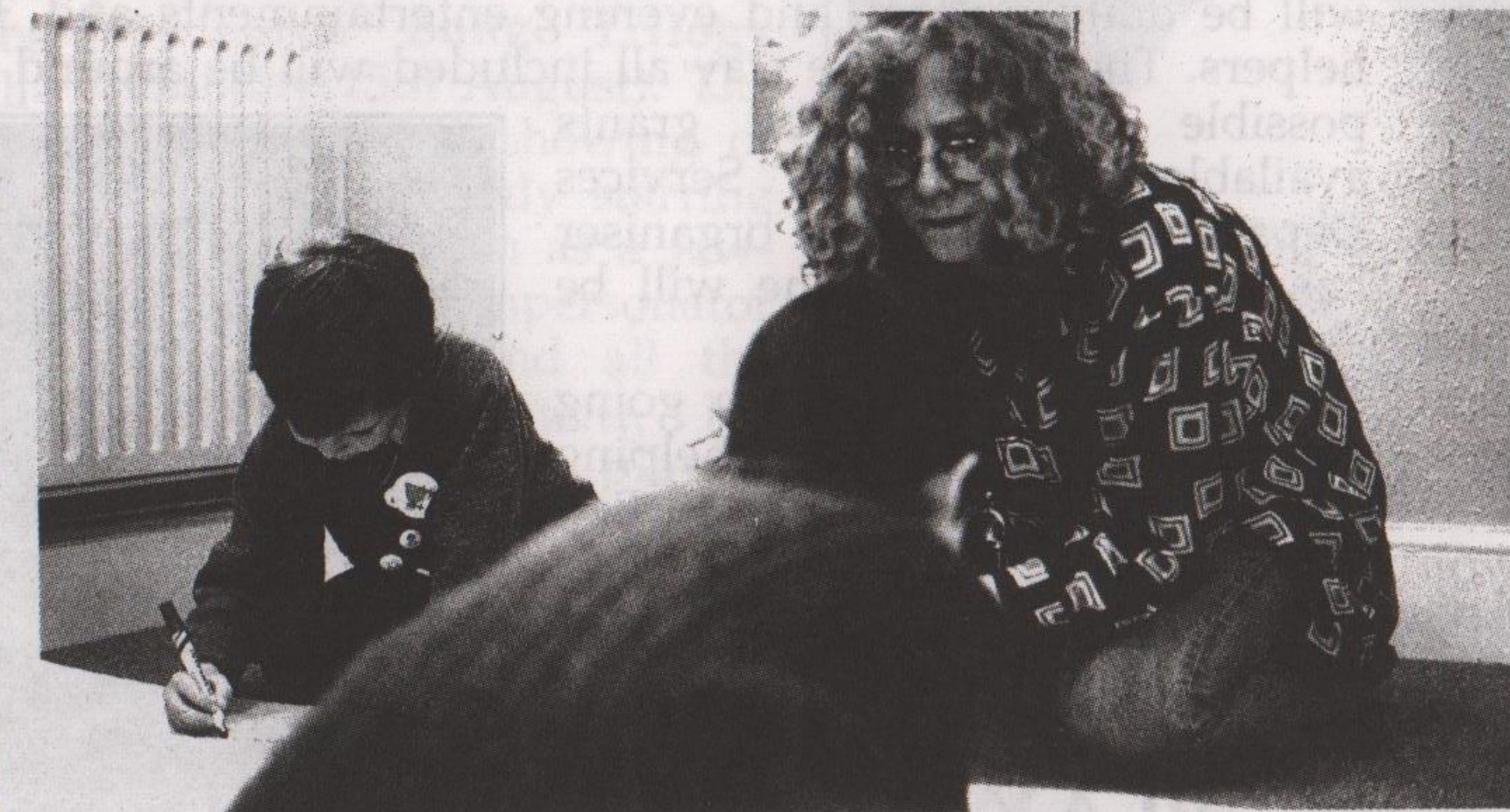
than a fragmented one. A new training intake is planned for October. "We have come through these changes, which have not been easy, only because the volunteers and paid staff worked together with the support of the Nottingham Health Authority who are fully behind what we are doing" says Sue.

James Baldwin wrote in 'The Fire Next Time' that 'it is better to aspire to excellence than to make peace with mediocrity'. Nottingham Aids Information Project seems well on the road to that goal.

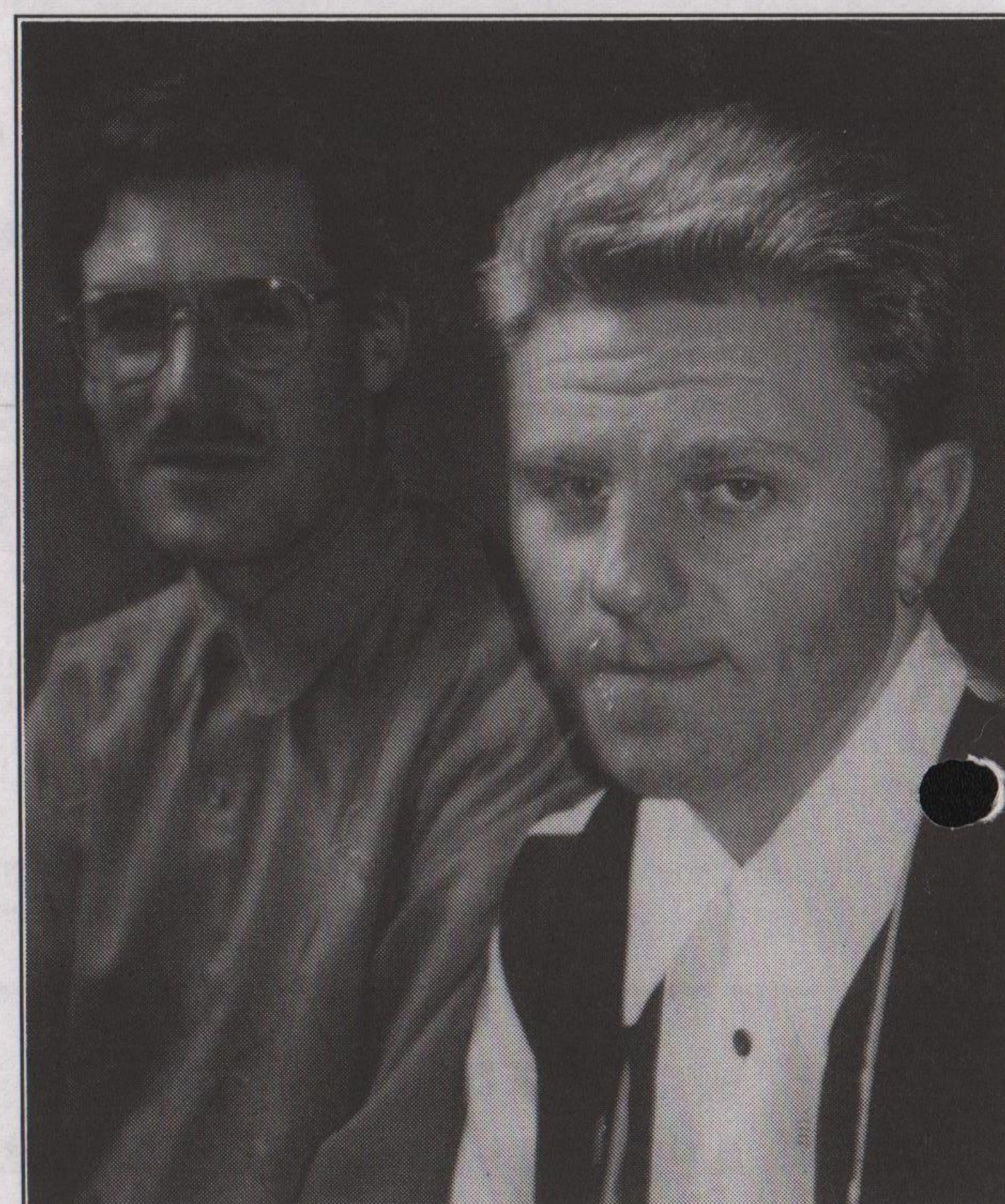
HOLIDAYS FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

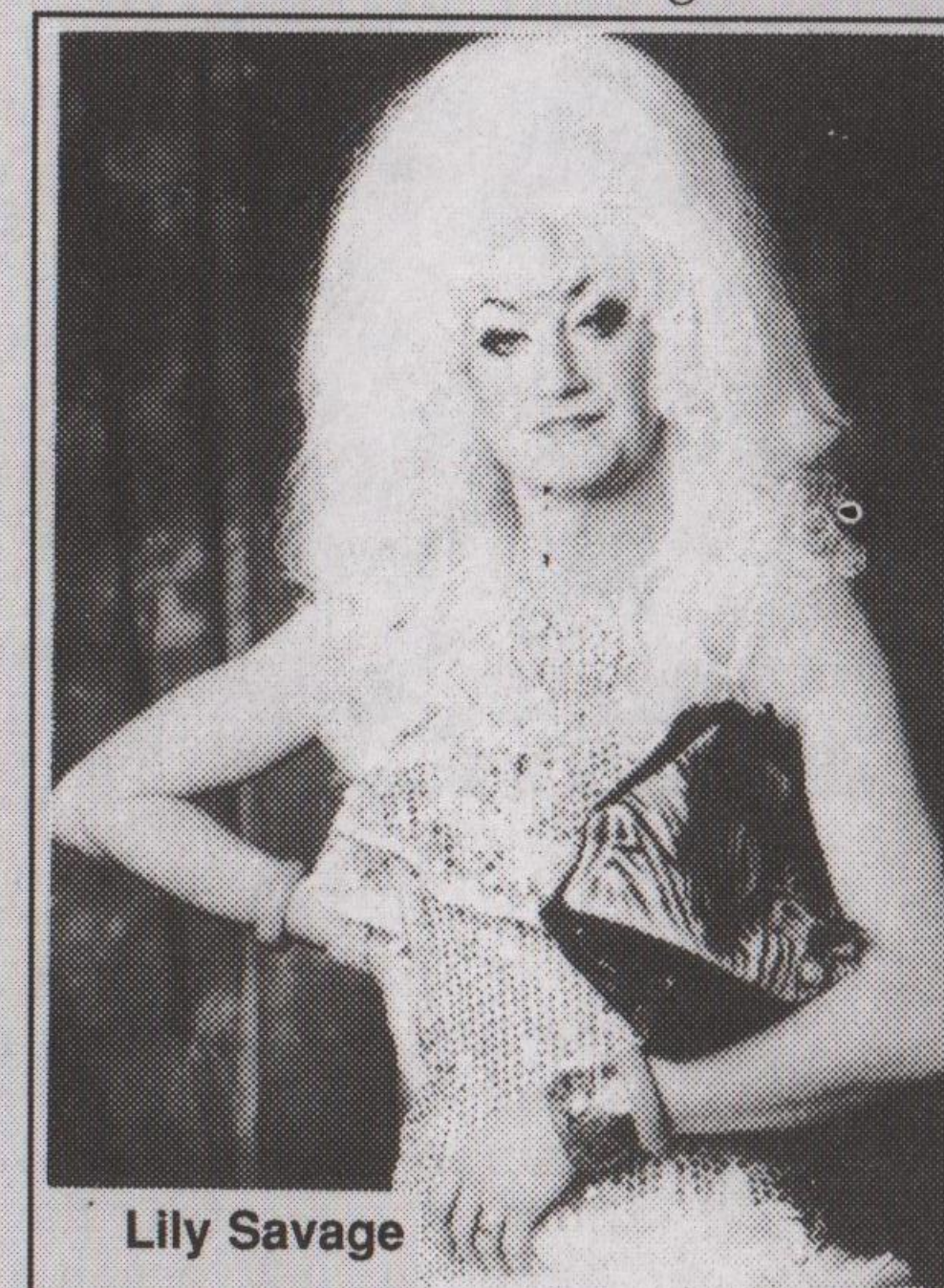

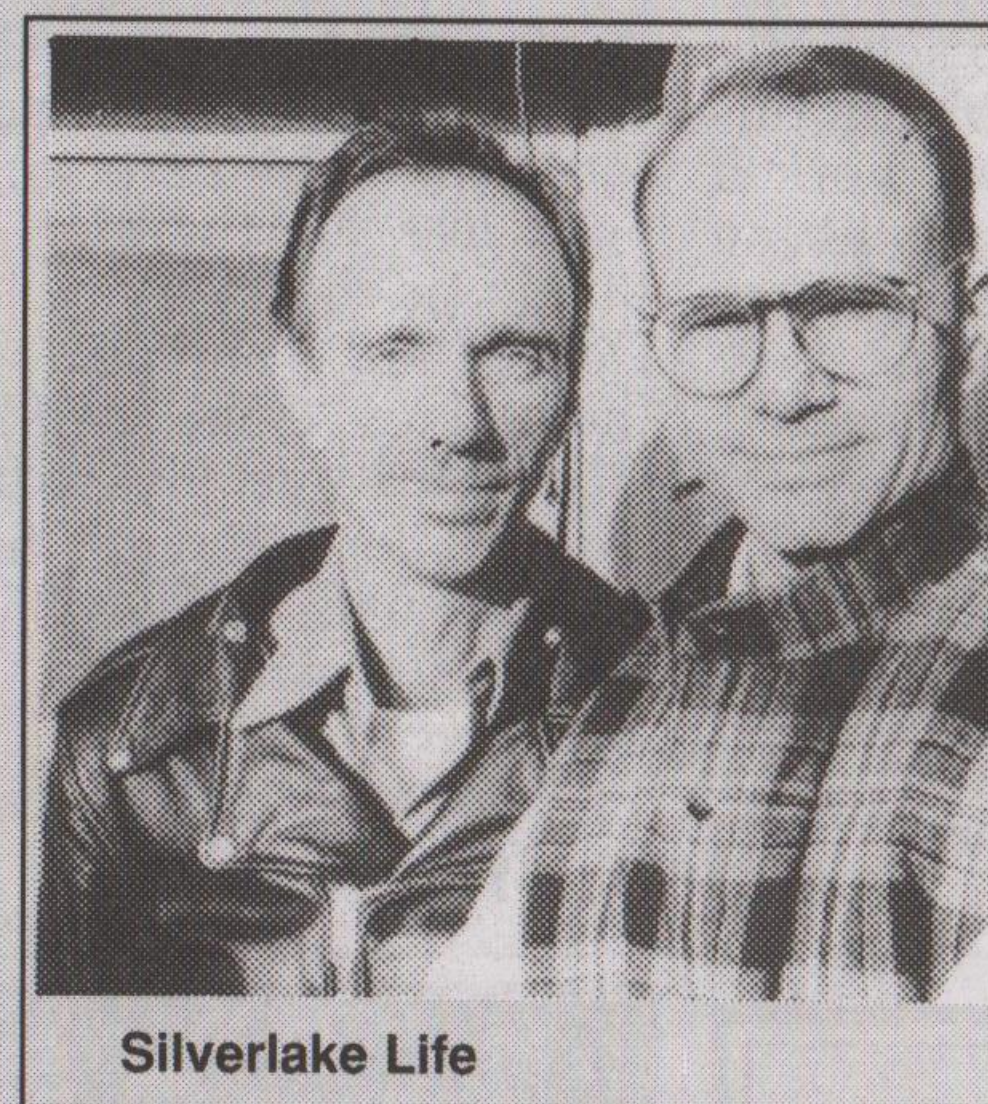
Queer TV (Tuesday 24th August). Lily Savage presents a look at how broadcasters around the world have followed Channel 4's lead in regular gay programming.
