

One flat was opened on the Browning Estate, this being the sixth in the last few days, but was found to be unsuitable, so they went off to another just off Morcombe St.

After taking out the putty from a window as described in Wire Cracking Lesson No. 1, they were disturbed by a hostile tenant climbing the stairs. It was this character who 'phoned the pigs.

After this they thought it was in the best interests of all concerned to leave and try to enter a flat in Dawes House.

HARD-TO-LET OF NOT HARD-TO-LET

The District Housing Office are still maintaining the absurd stance that King-lake and Alvey Estates are not 'hard-to-let'. This thinly-veiled attempt to justify eviction of squatters who should be tenants on the grounds that some-one, somewhere on the waiting list might want these popular (not hard-to-let) flats is strongly opposed by Kinglake & Alvey TA and the local Labour Party.

There is probably a financial motive in the move too because removal of hard-to-let status weakens arguments for estate improvement.

PREPARE!

The Council so far has had a relative-It peaceful time with squatters (although they might not think so!). The organised equatting movement in Southwerk has always worked alonguide tenants and in harmony with the essence of the Councils' allocation policy. However the bloody-minded, manipulative approach of the Council leadership and some officials could end all this. If HOMELESS PEOPLE ARE GOING TO GET EVICTED FOR SQUATTING IN THE WORST FLATS (which were termed hard-to-let) JUST AS THEY DO FROM THE BEST PLATS THEN THEY MIGHT AS WELL SQUAT IN THE BEST FLATS ANT-WAY. FURTHERMORE, IF THE COUNCIL CARRY ON REFUSING TENANCIES AND THREATENING TO EVICT (OR EVICTING) PROPLE, WE MIGHT JUST AS WELL CAUSE THEM REAL BOTHER.

Squatters in Lambeth in 1976, Squatters disrupted Council Meetings until they closed, fought the Police, over-ran Council Offices, occupied a number of District Offices and other Council Buildings simultaneously, and took over some wards of the Labour Party. The Council was ignominously defeated and the leader of the Council forced to resign. Similar confrontations in Camden in 1973 resulted in squatters and Councillors rioting against each other in the Council chamber.

This is food for thoughts for the Council leadership and food for our own thoughes. We need to :-

* resist the Councils' every move against every squatter in Southwark

* support and assist all applications for tenancies from squatters, and follow them up

* build an effective network for organising and communications between squatters all over Southwark

* build support with tenants in filling empty flats and halting the run-downof estates. Assist with empty property surveys etc.

EVICTIONS ON THE HORIZON

As some people may have heard the squatters in 108 Dawes House on Rodney Road are going to evicted soon. Their story has been unable to be obtained for various reasons. Since Dawes is not on the Kinglake & Alvey St. Estate events they may not seem very important (except to those who live there, of course!) but even more significant and disturbing is the news that two squats on Kinglake & Alvey are also facing eviction.

An eviction order has been made out on 9 Keston, naming Dave Baur and Paul Jenkinson as the occupiers. It's tough cheese again, however, for Ruby St. Housing Office as the present occupiers are not the persons named. The squatters living there at the moment moved into the flat in late September after the order had been made. Now the possibility exists for them to go back in after the bailiffs have taken possession on 14th February, unless anybody has any ideas about a little direct action

Jeff and Drew's gaff at 20 Southborough, like sevepal other squate in the area, has been given notice of legal action being when in their case after moving in last August. They received the notice last month and have heard nothing since, but plan in any case to give the place to other people.

Anybody who receives notice of legal action should leave a notice on the board at the SNOW office so that the Collective knows exactly what the situation is;

Housing Committee which Piers represents on the Housing Committee?





Yes, it happened: Long-standing activiete of the former SAS (Squat Against (Council House) Sales Campaign started by the L.S.V. in 1979) and some intrapid crackers from the Ambulance Station openod up a disused factory-office building at 29a, Vauxhall Grove on Wed/Thurs 29th December, which we named "Wext".

Homeless people kipping in "Crisis at Christmas" came round as shon as they got leaflets and moved into the office rooms.

An organisation room was set up at the door and the idea of "Next!" explained to all comers ... it was NOT the Sally Army, not a bostol where you are told what to do, not something controlled by someone else, not a derelict skipper into which the police might come at any time ... BUT A SQUAT - a building WE (YOU) CONTROL ... a door to a better future ... a future which the Sally Army and hestelscenoshow no way towards. (The Sally Army makes a large profit out of 'doseers' and has no interest in showing them elternatives.)

A lot of people coming in got the idea of NEXT and eproad the message far and wide, through leaflets and word of mouth.

Of course, such projects are vulnerable to abuse so although one group got things working in the building, another, probably connected with a scrap-yard around the corner, stole the aluminium floor in the main room!!

People are still in the building, however, and the people who came off the street and got it working are squattingon elsewhere.

A YOUNG PERSONS GUIDE TO SMOKING - PART II

Greetings, wiped ones. This time, the more 'radical' of your intrepid comrades have repaired down to the double-bar of the 'dogmatic trendy' to earnestly discuss the relative sex-life of the aardvaark, along with all it's profound implications (available soon in suitably complex form).

So, once again, you're on your tod (well, you might as well be) and just wasting with bated breath to see what comes next in the creation of a beast that will surely take pride of place in any black museum. So, you have your tubes and bung. Now you need a bottle. Paul Masson wine carages are perfect for this (the wine itself can be used for stripping paint or clearing drains) as these have wide necks just right for the diameter tubing you are using.

Moving on to the bowl now. This is simply a matter of trial and error. The only thing you need to remember here is that you are seeking as airtight a fit as possible. The number of people who will partake and the measure of your gluttony are the yard-stick by which you

arrive at its size.



Suleyman Ali (The Wire no 10) seems to think the equatting movement can develop into a model for the rest of society - a collective model where people relate to each other as equals, without leaders, and without discrimination against women and gays. He even sees squatters opposing discrimination in the rest of society.

But let's look at the reality of the squatting movement today:

ANTISEXISM. Far from being antisexist, the movement is riddled with sexism, e.g.

(i) a male SNOWperson beat up a female one in the street - what was SNOW's response ? - none. What was the response of SNOW members ? - two tried to stop him, the rest mostly thought he'd'gone a bit far' but didn't even bother to mention their disapproval to him;

(ii) a SNOW meeting was asked to ban sexist material from 'The Wire' - it rejected this, on the grounds that it opposed censorship - does this mean that attacks on blacks and gays are going to be printed too ? - I don't think so - what it means is that the people (mainly men?) at that meeting didn't think that sexism should be taken seriously;

(iii) Suleyman Ali thinks we should balance our 'appreciation of antisexism' with one of 'female chauvinism' - this is a grossly sexist expression implying that women can be feminists only as long as they don't attack men for being sexist, or prefer support from other women to sexism from men.

GAYS AND SQUATTING. Far from being 'predominately gay and bisexual', SNOW is dominated by straight men with little more than a notional commitment to gay rights. Example: what was the only publicity material ever to be deliberately defaced/destroyed in the old SNOW office ? - an advertisement for a gay contact/discussion group - what was SNOW's response it agreed to discipline anyone caught doingfeature of the squatting movement is. this in future, but only on the insistence of one person there(me), with support from one other (Joe) - the other 20-30 people there managed about two sentences of opposition, and a substantial embarassed silence - no-one was outraged, no-one was leaping up to root out anti-gay prejudice from the squatters movement.

WHY PEOPLE SQUAT. Suleyman Ali seems to think people squat in order to make a political statement - their rejection of

the principle of private property. In fact, most SNOW squatters squatted because they had to - or at least had very little choice. If they'd been offered a council tenancy with the DHSS paying the rent, quite a lot of them would never have squatted in the first place, and most of us leapt at the chance of a tenancy. Those who don't get tenancies eventually tire of the continual round of evictions and find somewhere more secure. So, inevitably, the squatting movement in this country is a rapidly-changing group of people who are concerned about housing the homeless . (i.e. themselves), and an 'alternative way of life' is a secondary issue.

In other words, the squatting movement consists of more-or-less averagely sexist and anti-gay people, who have been pushed into it by their personal housing problems. Obviously, then, it is ludicrous to think of the squatting movement as it stands setting a complete pattern of what is desirable for the rest of society. It does stand for some important principles - the right to a decent home, and the right to co-operate and organise (legally or not) to claim basic necessities which society attempts to deny us. But it does not stand for racial, sexual, or gay equality any more than the rest of society does. Male squatters must deal with their sexism, white ones with their racism, and straight ones with their anti-gay prejudices. Even if today's squatters were to start trying (which few of them show any sign of doing) the constant turnover of squatters would make the task a very long-term one indeed.

This is not to say that an alternative lifestyle is impossible in the squatting movement - and people in mass squats, ordinary squats, and ex-squats are attempting to build better communities. But to suggest that this is a dominant sadly, nothing more than fantasy.

PS. I might manage to follow this up with my own view of the future of squatting, energy and public reaction permitting.

Collectives go back a long way! Since the beginnings, man has always preferred to live with others of his kind. It is only modern industrial society which has sought to modify this desire. In a sense an extended family is a collective, but strictly speaking, you can define a collective as any group with similar interests working or living together on equal terms. During the Spanish Civil War, groups of anarchist in the North set up collectivised villages which ran well when the local strong weren't intefering. In America communes, nearly all of which were collective, have been a feature of life since the last century. In this country, many businesses are run along collective lines, with all workers treated equally. Similarly, there are collectives for living. both squats and otherwise.

. What makes a collective run smoothly? It is not essential that it is either composed of people sharing exactly the same beliefs, or of the same age. In fact, diversity, within certain limits, is the spark which drives the dynamo. Nor need it be enerchist. What is important is a



In business all should receive the same, the load should be apread evenly, and all decisions should evolve and not be imposed from above. Naming something doesn't bring it into existence. Even a decision by a few, to set up a collective can be counter productive. Striving for more than a certain uniformity, trying to suppress the dialectic [low (sorry?). all these are niet - niets.

How do collectives start, then? By evolving! When people take a personal. decision to work with others, to dehierarchicise and strive for equality then you have the seeds of the tree. Once people are together, the nonleadership structures will evolve. It can't be forced nor can it flourish in the soil of dogma or exclusiveness

Collectives need commitment, dicipline from the individual, and love; if all these are present, they will flourish S.A.


