COVER RESISTER - MAIREAD FARRELL Mairead Farrell was one of the 3 IRA members murdered by the SAS on 6th March. They were unarmed at the time, although the Foreign Secretary is trying to claim that the men who shot them thought their lives were in danger. (The 2 others killed were Sean Savage & Daniel McCann.) But this is obviously a lie, as the 3 were not challenged before being shot, and as mentioned, they had no guns on them.

IRA sources said they were part of an active service unit, with 140 lb.

of plastic explosive.

Mairead Farrell was 31. She was one of the IRA's principal public figures. Active in the IRA for several years in her teens, she was arrested in 1976, aged 19, following a bombing mission which went wrong. Police arrived at the scene as Farrell and two others planted bombs at a south Belfast hotel. She was carrying a Colt .45 pistol.

One of her colleagues was shot dead. The other died later on hunger strike. Farrell refused to recognise the courtand was given a 14 year sentence, of

which she did 10 years.

Imprisoned in Armagh jail, she was the first woman to be denied the "special category" status previously lallowed to paramilitary prisoners. She. kept up a continual protest against this until her release in October 1986. She was the IRA "commanding officer", over the other women in the jail.

Her protest in prison cost her 37 years in lost remission. On her release, Farrell made no secret of the fact that her support for the IRA

was as strong as ever. Gerry Adams, president of Sinn Fein, singled her out for special commendation at the party's annual [conference in Dublin 2 years ago. Delegates gave her a standing ovation.

She was sent to Gibraltar, despite her high profile, because missions abroad require particularly committed! people, given that the risk of capture-



"In April this year, I started work at Burtons in Princes Street. Five months later, in mid-September I found out that I was pregnant. A few days later I was rushed to hospital with a threatened miscarriage. Burtons were immediately informed of the situation and took a very sympathetic view, and I was told everything would be alright as long as I told them when I would be returning to work. I handed in sick notes from my doctor, and wrote a letter to the general manager explaining to him the full story. I spent the following six weeks fighting to save the life of my first baby. I returned to work on the 9th November to find I'd been given the sack. What made it more hurtful and humiliating was the fact that everyone in Burtons knew two weeks before I was told. I was given no reason for my dismissal. There had been no complaints about my work record. What's more, the date on which I was given the sack, Burtons were advertising for staff."

Following Tricia's dismissal,a Tricia Jenking Defence committee was organised. It is demanding of Burton that:

-Tricia be immediately reinstated in her job -Full reinstatement of her maternity right

& wages which she has lost as a result of being sacked

-An end to sex discrimination

They are also asking that Burtons be boycotted, bearing in mind that they also own Top Shop, Top Man, Priciples, Dorothy Perkins, & Debenhams.

CLAUSE 14/27/28/29...

Leeds saw a huge demonstration against clause 29, on March 5th, when 4-5000 people marched through the city centre carrying banners & chanting slogans.

The march was well thought out, with wheelchairs & pushchairs at the front, followed by a womens section, gay men section mixed, Black, etc. And there were signer walking alongside, signing all of the chants

Needless to say there were a few fasc -ists hanging around & verbally abusing the marchers-it beats me why 5000 people don't just turn round & kick the bastards heads in Ignoring them isn't the answer, we shouldn't sanction them 'siegheil'ing us, they need to know we won't stand for such Nazi shit.

Meanwhile, clause 29 demonstration & entertainments coordinators, were question -ed by the police on Friday night, as a sophisticated bomb had been found outsid the Astoria, the morning after a clause 29 bop. Fascists were thought to have planted it, although this is just speculation.

the police had wanted names & address -es of all those at the Thursday bop, so that they could 'interview' them as witnesses!!Needless to say, the coordinators didn't give them any.

But the march went ahead without any serious hiccups from fascists,& most people ended up at Woodhouse moor for the rally..Mindyou,due to it being freezing cold & snowing,the number of speakers was cut from 10 to 4.& nobody hung around long!

The march was brilliant, probably the best Leeds has seen! The only thing to spoil it was a stupid, gay man, who was obviously very anti-women, & shouting 'fight for gay rights; fuck lesbians' (ie. fuck lesbian rights). He made alot of women angry, & alot of us had a go at him-he then physically threatened us!! So much for human rights!

The clause has now been passed by the House of Lords, so all it needs now is the royal assent. It's due to become law on June 1st. We must now push for non-implementation, the success of this obviously depends on the attitude of your local authority. On Wednesday 16th March, there's to be a mass lobby of Leeds city council, & a deputation by the WAC women-so if you're available at 12.30pm, Please lend your support.



March 5th saw 100,000 health workers & their supporters march through London & rally at Hyde Park.With feelings running high for a general strike on Budget day, : Willis made sure that no rank & filers were given the platform.Willis,in line with Kinnock wants to hold onto his job & his respectability.as well as having an absurd belief in the Parliamentary system. community care grants and budgetting and crisis loans will be paid. These are for cases like people leaving institutional care, e.g. ex-offenders, the elderly, mentally

-ill, disabled people, children - leaving care, etc. - start-up grants for furniture, etc; grants to improve conditions for the elderly, sick or disabled, e.g. bedding, extra warmth, internal decoration, fuel costs, heavy laundry bills; and grants for families under stress, e.g. marriage breakdown, coping with a disabled child. Of course the DHSS should

be paying for all these things, but after April claimants will only recieve loans for these things, repayable immediately out of their benefit. You could end up losing 5-25% of benefit every week to pay back a loan. Because the Social Fund is a fixed amount, obviously it will run out towards the end of each year, so no

money will be available for all these necessary payments. Also, the DHSS will be dividing claimants into those who deserve to recieve money from the social fund, and those who don't, whereas we know that there is no such distinction - all claimants

VIRAJ MENDIS

Viraj Mendis is still in sanctuary and has been since Dec 20 1986, but for how much longer? The Home Office is pushing for Viraj's appeal hearing to come up as soon as possible, knowing that the current vicious press campaign will have whipped up alot of support for smashing into the sanctuary were they to win the appeal hearing.

The appeal court will be under immense pressure to find against Viraj - like at the judicial review in July 87. The Home Office have based their refusal to grant Viraj asylum purely on the basis of a letter from the Sri Lankan High Commissioner saying that Viraj is free to return and is not wanted for any offence. The worth of this letter was actually questioned by Justice Mann himself: "what would happen to him if he went back?...He may be free to go back but is he going to be in jeopardy; is he going to disappear?" But having asked this question he promptly forgot it and didnt refer to his brainstorm again, he just said "it is for the secretary of state to decide the weight to put on the letter". It seems there were dirty tricks and political pressure put on Justice Mann between the hearing on 15/16 July and the verdict on the 27 July.

So will the appeal court be any different? Doug Hurd has already voiced his thoughts about the sanctuary campaign: "I cannot believe that this tactic is welcomed by anyone who believes in upholding the law"...So, when the Home Office believes this, it is unlikely for the British legal system to grant refugee status when politically this would mean victory for sanctuary and defeat for the implementation of British Immigra tion law.

The government have referred to the situation in Sri Lanka as simply "confused", while at the same time the International Communities respons can be gauged by the fact that the Australian cricket team has pulled out of playing Sri Lank due to the "civil war"! I think its the British govt. who are "confused".

There is to be a national march on 21 May more details nearer the time.





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FEMINIST FOLLIES....

Sometimes I think feminism has gone too far, become too segregated, too bound by it's own definitions and it's sharply defined exclusopns.

Too often as a beterosexusal women I feel there's a certain element of derision/pity/intolerance levelled at me and those like me, who happen to like people (selectively) thus including men as well as members of our own sex.

The more strident feminist groups, seem to project the feeling that men are there to be hated and not allowed into our territory on any account. . Now I personally don't think that strength of hostility and insularness' is justified or reasonable; people are people before they are A SEX are I they not? Well if it doesn't work like that then it should and yes ok admit it doesn't always go like that.

Let's temporarily and briefly step back into time though to help clarify what I'm saying and getmy views into a better perspective. Back in the bleak Victorian era it was most definately a mans world, women were suppressed and restricted by laws and ideology, despite the paradoxical system of social hierarchy which meant working class women were expected to work as hard as men even while they were meant to be the angelic providers of virtuous and clean homes in which to raise their familys. They had no rights by law, no financial independance, they were in short the property of men. from fathers to husbands a state that endured because it always had. Men, used to this birthright of superiority, continued their chauvanistic, arrogant ways because it was seen as right and nautural. Those arrogant pre raphaelite artists for example, would use working class girls as models and mistress' and would I cautiously consider marrying them if, and only if, they could improve their manners and gain some education, some gentillity, so as to make passable wives in society. Even this education bestowed on the women was paid for and arranged by the men .

Looking at that attitude from the 20th century we choke with indignation, as did the handful of late victorian women who set the ball of feminism rolling, got women the vote, financial freedom and independance and who began to say that women are their own people too, not to be dictated to, or given limited spheres in which to act out a minu role,

"We deny the right of any portion of the species to decide for another portion, what is...or is not.. their proper sphere" So said Harriet Taylor Mill and with good reason.

Lets skip on a handful of decades and get to the old swinging sixties, the era of my childhood and one we hear so much about, the family and home was still the institution to aspire to... as both my older sisters a folicy, but would like to proved...but there were higher expectations by women and more..much more was possible.

Of course there were still sexist, chauvanist VICTORIAN males around by aquae with parts of this the bucketful, there still are today, BUT there is too a new breed of, male, which we as women and feminists should not cold shoulder as so often I feel women's groups do.

Already it's like a clicke to talk of the unsexist male, visions of right on lefty students with trendy haircuts leap to mind!

But they are here, men who sympathise with the shit women have to contend with purely because they are women and who carry out their relationships with women in a totally 50/50 equal way, and this is where for me, feminism lets itself down by questioning the sincereity of, these men, disbelieving them and just generally keeping up the gender

One London based anarcha feminist group, produced a zine so vitriolically anti men, so scornful of women who weren't lesbians, so abusive. physically and verbally, to men, even if they were of the 'new breed', that it could only alienate women from feminism and womens movements. Extremities are harmful I feel, tolerance and an open ear/mind is always essential. Brutal genderizing is damaging..isn't that what the first feminist movements were fighting against? So it appears contradictory to me, for some feminist groups to promote the same generalizing, the same sphere binding around men, as they have done to

Isn't playing them at their own game only putting yourself on the same

To sum up what I've been saying, there are a lot of individuals with grievances, struggles, in common, and the need to keep fighting in a world designed by and run by men needs to continue...from a purely personal view point as a disabled woman (and might I just say disability is THE one big minority that always gets forgotton, even in your Resister statement last issue, you forgot to include disabled women in you minority, list!) I dream of seeing ARMIRS of women architects out there, designing buildings, roads, shopping precincts, because women have children, push prams. .akin to wheelchairs. .. and all the time our brilliant male arty farty techts fail to accommodate the needs of women, young, old, pregnant disabled!

BUT our fight - any fight- should not exclude those who want to help, who are sympathetic to the cause, whatever it be, even if, by dint of sex, creed, physical ability, they appear to be 'one of the enemy.' I resent those feminists who want to exclude men from 'the world' who hold heterosexuality against you like some sign of mental weakness, and who are so dogmatically blinkered by the principles they live by, that they forget what we should all strive to remember and live/work by, PEOPLE ARE PEOPLE FIRST ... gender, beauty and abillity should

Women members of the l'unt baboteurs Association, pissed off at the way men always took over when sabbing, decided to speak out, and in Dec. 1986, the position of Women's Officer was set up within HJA. women-only meetings were held in Huddersfield and Brighton, but some men on the Association's committee were cross because they didn't like the fact that the HAA was funding something which they were excluded from!!

In July '87, at the Agm, Ralph · Cook and Maria Lester proposed a motion to stop the HJA funding women-only activities. The motion was defeated, but only after hours at the committee meeting, with only trish etc. We've got to change sabbing. about 12 people present, a "Men's Officer" was created, and the post of Women's officer went to a

After this, 4 of the committee members resigned, and a lot of people stopped sabbing. A few months later, the men's officer was scrapped, but it looks like the women's officer soon will be too. There have been a few women-only sabs in Leeds and Manchester, but they've been badly attended. women want to go out sabbing, it's obvious that they'll have to avoid the HSA, and get organised themselves. shit in this society is linked. Equal' Opportunities?

30 — 40 students and several

babies marched in to Director, Chris Price's office as an International Women's Day protest and sat down.

"We want some form of nursery for under 5's here at the poly", Alison Walker, Deputy President of the Students Union told him.

The case was put to him that

from coming to the poly because of lack of proper childcare facilities. As one student, Carole Fathalizadeh told LOP, "I've delayed having a family because it would be impossible while I'm still at poly. I feel very strongly about the fact that our choice has been taken away because there are no creche facilities."

The final agreement was more realistic — that next academic year, ten thousand pounds would be spent on either 5 places in the University creche, or it would be given to a child care working party to do as they see fit.
