On Thursday June 10th elections are being held across the UK to elect Members of the European Parliament to represent our wider area at the European Parliament in Brussels.

We are not going to say you should vote for a particular Political Party or Candidate, that is your choice. But we are saying you should excersise yor right vote.

. The fact is, less and less people are voting within our local communities and if we don't vote we throw away our right to express a view within the existing democratic system.

You might respond by saying you disagree wthl all the Parties

and the Candidates, or that you believe that politicians or voting never changes anything. If this is the case you can still go but leave your voting slip blank and put it in the voting box. This way you have still exercised your right to vote but communicated your view that you don't want to support any of the existing parties or candidates. You could also write to the candidates and express your views. Or you could ask to meet with the candidates, or the elected candidate, yourself or perhaps through a group or even through your Forum.

New Deal for Communities - Update

The New Deal for Communities initiative, which will cover parts of Radford & Hyson Green, is still being slowly worked

The initiative is in three phases.

- 1: Local people, groups and bodies are invited to form a partnership which selects a neighbourhood and prepares a proposal demonstrating their ability to take on New Deal.
- 2: Chosen partnerships will receive funding to support them in developing a detailed Action Plan for what should be done in the area.
- 3: Successful Action Plans would now receive between £35 and £50 million pounds over ten years.


The first expression of interest document for Phase 1 was sent back with a request for more details. A new and updated document was sent in to the Government last week.

Such a major initiative has attracted a lot of interest from everyone who works and invests in the area. The Partnership Council has also put together a discussion document as a contribution to the debate about what should happen in Phase 2 to make sure everyone who lives and works in the area can have an input into the Action Plan. Part of the discussion document also raises some of the issues which we feel need to be considered for Phase 3.

The 'Greater Nottingham Partnership' are responsible for

facilitating the development of New Deal for Communities and at the moment the Partnership Council is waiting for a formal response to its discussion document. Until then it is a matter of waiting.


Lottery Success!!

The meeting is open to all local residents and is be aimed at creating a well informed debate which results in a constructive way forward being identified.


The venue for the meeting is the Forest Secondary School on Gregory Boulevard, entrance opposite the Forest Recreation Ground.
