SAFETY FIRST

Meeting new friends requires caution. Please make sure that you have taken precautions to ensure your safety at all times.

Try to arrange meetings in public places, not your own home. It is often best to meet in a crowded place, e.g. a restaurant or a pub. Don't give your address until you are absolutely sure that you want to continue the relationship.

Trust your instincts and don't meet again if you have any doubts. On your first meeting, it is best to make your own way to and from the venue. It is best not to accept an offer of transport. These points may seem overcautious, but we believe you should be safe, rather than sorry. If the person you are meeting is genuine, they will understand.

There will be an all-women BHLC course (British Hill Walking Leaders Certificate) available to any woman who'd like to get some good, recognised leader training. The BHLC is made up of 3 weekends 20-22 September, March/April 2003 and June/July 2003 and is based at Butterlip How youth hostel in Grasmere. 
