Victory over Adoption and Children Bill

The House of Lords has voted to pass the Adoption and Children Bill, which will allow same-sex and unmarried heterosexual couples to adopt jointly. People will also be able to adopt a partner's child that was conceived by donor insemination, for example. Landmark case sets new level for same-sex tenancy rights

The Court of Appeal ruled that Mr. Juan Mendoza, a gay man whose partner of 30 years recently died, would have the same rights to take over his partner's tenancy as a spouse or cohabitee of the opposite sex. This historic judgement for lesbian and gay rights is the first major same-sex case heard under the two-year-old Human Rights Act.

The next step is to leave the book somewhere public and place a review of the book on the website also stating where you left the book. Hopefully the book is found and read by the new owner, who sees the label on the inside that explains about the site and what to do. The new owner can visit the website, leave

their review of the book and then 'set the book free', starting the cycle again. A large number of lesbian and gay interest books are registered and there is a section where you can 'hunt' for books 'set free' in your area.
