National News

Campaign to remove Section 28 continues.

Stonewall is supporting a cross-party amendment for the clear and straightforward repeal of this hateful clause. The amendment will shortly be considered by a committee of the House of Commons and voted on by all MPs. We then take our battle to the House of Lords.

Government's draft employment equality regulations not yet good enough

Stonewall has responded to the Government's consultation on its draft employment equality (sexual orientation) regulations. The final version of these regulations will become law in December 2003, and will offer protection to lesbian, gay and bisexual people against discrimination in the workplace. Stonewall felt that the Government's draft regulations need to be strengthened in several areas and have emphasised these points in their response.
