



This year, the awards were presented by the Sheriff of Nottingham to Nottingham Hyking Dykes, Healthy Gay Nottingham and Breakout and there were also 2 memorial awards: one to the Pavilion Club and the other to Lesbian Line. We hope that Lesbian Line's certificate can eventually find a place in the Women's Centre near to where the helpline operated. All the reaction to the event was positive - so we've booked the Council House for 2011. Put a mark by Feb. 15th.
