
Dale Diva - Album released 19 m Nov


Parallell Loopiverse

The subject of reviews is pertinent just now in respect of the much anticipated film "The kids are all right". The hype had almost gone unnoticed so at first I began to question whether I'd missed the point but friends got together in little groups to see it and rather surprisingly nobody actually said it was more than OK, most disliked it & two actually walked out after 20 minutes. To say it wasn't what was expected is an understatement it would appear. One friend said to me: Age must be telling on me. When I was a baby-dyke 'fun' consisted of a couple of drinks in some hidden away club and very occasionally getting to "cop off" with someone who then became a girlfriend who lasted for a few months. As I got older two significant others had kids from previous relationships and call me old fashioned but sniffing coke at the age of 15 was NOT on the agenda. Then I had a think about my friends and wondered which of them needed to watch male porn movies as a prelude to one sided sex that left their partner looking bored & atrophied. OK, a lesbian mother having a frantic fling with her offspring's sperm donor might not be outside the far edges of a flimsy queer reality but it's never touched my parochial lifestyle. It left me wondering who the film was aimed at. Not, I suspect, lesbians but an attempt to fete the wider cinema going audience but for what purpose given that the narrative was banal and the acting lacked conviction. And what about the middle aged heterosexual couples in the audience, what did they think of it? Had any of them gone to try and get their heads around the knowledge that their daughter was living with her "special friend". They must have come away more confused than when they went in.

The reviews by the way were all good, seemingly this film is the stuff of award nominations. Taking a review at random: the Mirror (no comment) said "A film with verve, wit & charm" and went on to say it was about human frailties (point taken) & the slog of a long term relationship (o, how inspiring to those just embarking). The most surprising snippet of info for me was that the director is herself a lesbian in a long term relationship and just prior to making the film they were looking for a sperm donor. Not so much history repeating itself as preceding itself. Let's hope

Returning for a moment to the BBC3 programme Lip Service - I read no rave reviews at all and had to have a chuckle at this bit from the Metro: "It was trying so hard to be modern and liberated but it felt tired and lazy, from the funky flats everyone lived in to the two supposedly straight blokes who were, bizarrely, the gayest thing in it. Frankly, I've felt more of a Sapphic stirring watching Ann Widdecombe on Strictly Come Dancing."

Well, it's taught me a lesson - check out the reviews of films made for mainstream viewing on subjects LGBT before going to see them. Less likely to be disappointed that way.




North Nottinghamshire Walking Group
